

Surprise package of the season, Feni Soccer Club, came from two goals down to hold league leaders Sheikh Jamal DC to a 2-2 draw in the Nitol Tata Bangladesh Premier League encounter at the Bangabandhu National Stadium yesterday.

Haitian forward Wedson Anselme gave Sheikh Jamal a 2-0 lead first half hour before Chukta Charles and Kabba Jobe scored one goal apiece in

the next five minutes to snatch a valuable point from their mighty opponents, who had handed them a 4-2 defeat in their first meeting in the league.

Despite the fourth draw in 12 matches, Sheikh Jamal are still on top of the 10-team table with 28 points, six ahead of second-placed Abahani, who play their 12th match against Muktijoddha Sangsad today. Feni Soccer, meanwhile, are in eighth position with eight points.

Sheikh Jamal had to toil hard in their two previous wins against Chittagong Abahani and Brothers Union but this time they were undone by a spirited Feni Soccer, who have been growing from strength to strength since their Independence Cup campaign in the where they finished runners-up.

Amid scorching heat at the big bowl, players from both sides had to struggle to put their natural performance. Sheikh Jamal, though, had the upper hand and came close to taking the lead in the fourth minute when Sohel Rana's shot rattled the crossbar.

The Federation Cup champions though took the lead in the 14th minute with a screamer drive from Wedson, who fired home from the edge of the box after his compatriot Sony Norde had fed him with a square-pass.

Wedson doubled the lead in the 30th minute when he raced onto a throughpass from Shahedul Alam and placed the ball home with an angular shot.

However, Feni hit back two minutes later, a bit fortunately, when Sheikh Jamal stopper Didarul Haque, playing in place of suspended Nasir Chowdhury, saw his clearance deflect off Charles and end up at the back of the net. Three minutes later Gambian forward Kabba Jobe headed a

Romjan Ali free-kick home to level the margin. Afterwards, Sheikh Jamal pressed hard to restore the lead and created a lot of chances but Wedson, Emeka Darlington and Sony could not find the target while Feni Soccer got a good chance in the stoppage time but Charles failed to beat failed goalkeeper Ziaur Rahman from a one-on-one situation.

"It's tough to come back in the game when you concede two goals within five minutes after taking a two-goal lead. But I congratulate Feni Soccer for their effort and they deserved one point. We could not play up to our usual standard," said Sheikh Jamal coach Joseph Afusi after the match.

Feni Soccer's Gambian coach Omar Sise said that they were happy to get one point and especially with the way they showed courage to come back despite going two goals down.

Suspended players Mosharraf Hossain Rubel and Mahbubul Alam Robin have been cleared

by the Bangladesh Cricket Board to participate in the BCB's tournaments.

At a press conference in Mirpur

yesterday BCB's acting CEO Nizamuddin Chowdhury informed reporters of the players' clearance. "We were waiting for an opinion

from our legal team and we have got that now. As a result, the players are now free to participate in any form of cricket under the BCB," informed Chowdhury.

The duo, who were accused of spot-fixing in the second season of the Bangladesh Premier League by the ICC's anti-corruption unit were cleared by an independent tribunal of all accusations in February through a short-verdict.

The BCB however, did not allow them to participate in the National Cricket League citing various reasons.

The board's media committee chairman Jalal Yunus had initially stated that the BCB was planning to appeal against the verdict while the BCB CEO had said that they were awaiting a decision from their legal team regarding the matter.

When asked why the BCB had taken so long to make the decision, Chowdhury said, "We were in fact waiting for the complete verdict. There was an indication that it would be released two weeks after the short

verdict. However, at this point of time, what's important is that they are free to play."

However if the BCB will appeal against the decision once they receive the complete verdict remains unsure. "The BCB and ICC are working together. We will see what happens in the coming days," said Chowdhury.

Mosharraf, who practised at the BCB Academy ground yesterday, was overjoyed with the news. He now looks forward to playing in the Bangladesh Cricket League, which begins this month, for Central Zone, a side he captained last year.

"It obviously feels really good. can't express the feeling that I am going through right now. I hope I can make a good come back in the BCL later this month," said Rubel.

Chennai join Punjab

Chennai Super Kings joined leaders Kings XI Punjab when they beat PREMIER LEAGUE Sunrises Hyderabad by five wickets in an Indian Premier League match at Sharjah Cricket

Stadium yesterday. Chennai however made heavy weather of an easy chase of 146 after Dwayne Smith and Brandon McCullum gave them a flying

start, scoring 85 runs in just 10.5 overs. They toiled to score in the last five overs and eventually got over the line with three balls to spare. It was Chennai's fourth win from five

games while Punjab have won all their four games.

Earlier, defending champions Mumbai Indians slumped to their fourth consecutive defeat as Delhi Daredevils dished out a clinical all-round display to record an easy six-wicket win.

Delhi chased down a modest target of 126 with seven balls to spare with opener Murali Vijay top-scoring with a 34-ball 40 and captain Kevin Pietersen striking form after an injury lay-off with an unbeaten 26 to notch up their second win.

Delhi, playing their last match this season at the UAE, wobbled towards the end with JP

Duminy (19) and Dinesh Karthik (2) falling in the 16th over at the Sharjah Cricket Stadium.

Chasing a small target, Delhi made a decent start with the opening stand between Vijay and Quinton de Kock (16) yielding 34

Pietersen, who looked tentative and rusty during his knock of 16 in his first match two days back, steadied Delhi after the quick fall of Duminy and Karthik before steering his side home.

Delhi will now head home to play their next match at Ferozeshah Kotla on May 3.

Sharapova's treble

Maria Sharapova claimed a hattrick of Stuttgart titles on Sunday after coming from behind to win a three-set battle royale with Ana Ivanovic in Sunday's final.

Having won the 2012 and 2013 titles here, the 27-year-old Sharapova was made to work hard for her 13th consecutive win on Stuttgart's clay-courts in the 51st final of her career before over-powering Ivanovic to claim a 3-6, 6-4, 6-1 victory in just over two hours.

It is the Russian's first clay-court tournament in her build-up to the French Open, having lost to Serena Williams in last year's final.

Having been taken to three sets by the Czech Republic's Lucie Safarova in her firstround match, Russia's Sharapova had swept into the final with straight set wins over compatriot Anastasia Pavlyuchenkova, top-

seed Agnieszka Radwanska of Poland, then Italian clay-court specialist Sara Errani in the semi-finals.

But Ivanovic, the ninth seed, made the statuesque Russian dig deep and the 26-yearold wasted no time asserting herself over Sharapova, racing into a a 4-0 lead in the first set before the defending champion responded, but the Serbian held her serve to take the first set.

Having won her previous tournament in Monterrey, Mexico, last month, Ivanovic went 3-1 up in the second but the match's momentum turned against her when Sharapova broke her, then fought her way back to take the set.

Ivanovic had been chasing her first win over the Russian since the 2007 French Open semi-final, when Ivanovic went onto lose to Justine Henin in the final, but the Serbian ran out of steam and sixth seed Sharapova dominated the third set.
