

# I saw father being shot dead

Earlier, two other prosecution witnesses testified about Qaisar's presence when they were collecting food from the storehouse.

Qaisar dragged out seven employees from the storehouse including his father, said Mostafa. "My brother and I were inside the storehouse at that time."

The other employees were Abdul Aziz, sub-divisional food controller; Abdul Kaleq, circle inspector; Rezaul Karim, office-in-charge of the storehouse; guards Abdur Rahman and Gedullah; and Tara Mia, handling contractor, said Mostafa.

Qaisar threatened the employees for allowing freedom fighters to collect food and ordered the staff not to give them any more food and asked them not to leave the place until their next order, and then they left, said Mostafa.

He said on May 29, as he learnt from his maternal uncle that Qaisar and the Pakistani army again went to the storehouse, he and his brother went near it and from a hideout saw Qaisar, his cohorts, and the Pakistani army taking his father and six others to Shaistaganj Rest House.

"My brother and I followed them

[Qaisar and others] secretly, and reached the back of the rest house," said an emotion-choked Mostafa, adding that he saw his father and others were kept confined to a room while Qaisar was talking to the Pakistani army.

After sometime, the detainees' were taken to Shaistaganj Puran Bazar, and the two brothers followed them.

"From a large sugarcane field near Shaistaganj Puran Bazar, I saw the seven including my father [and the aforementioned six] being lined up on the Khoa river bank under a railway bridge," Mostafa continued.

The Pakistani army shot the seven men including my father following a "signal of Qaisar Shahab", he said. "My brother and I witnessed the brutal killing of our father."

"My father once worked for Qaisar Shahab's father. My father sometime took Qaisar in his arms. Yet Qaisar didn't hesitate to order the killing of my father."

The three-member tribunal led by Justice Obaidul Hassan adjourned the case proceedings until today when Mostafa will face cross-examination.

for an increasing number of young people is a challenge. "The world must consider millions of young, trainable persons as resource."

She called upon the developed countries to come forward to support the countries across Asia and Africa to equip the young people with knowledge and skills that are recognised across borders.

The government of Bangladesh has taken a special programme to train millions of the country's youths, she added.

Referring to the immense contribution of about 25 crore migrants worldwide in their host economies through sending remittance and their contribution in sustaining the economic growth of destination countries, the prime minister underlined a few aspects for the consideration of the experts of the meeting as for possible targets and indicators.

These include identifying ways that migration can contribute to poverty reduction, augment growth, reduce inequality and empower people, especially women; creating an enabling atmosphere for migrants, especially women and girls, across

the migration chain; provision for quality basic education and vocational and technical education for migrants and members of their families, matched with changing demand in markets; supporting the migrants with all forms of preparations to contribute in origin and destination countries; bringing all costs in migration process to a minimum, including the cost of remittances.

The prime minister said these suggestions are also cross-cutting in terms of most linkages with poverty alleviation and sustained, inclusive economic growth.

With the implementation of these suggestions, she said the sustainable development goals can prove to be visionary and transformative for all the countries over the next 15 years.

Sheikh Hasina termed the above suggestions "universal" and called for solutions depending on the unique circumstances and needs of a country.

Foreign Minister Abul Hassan Mahmood Ali, Minister for Expatriates' Welfare and Overseas Employment Khandker Mosharraf Hossain and Planning Minister AHM Mustafa Kamal also spoke on the occasion.



The CEC yesterday declared the schedule for by-election to

Barisal-5 constituency, setting June 12 as polls day.

The last date of filing nominations is May 11, nominations will be scrutinised by returning officer on May 14, and the last date of withdrawal of nominations is May 21.

The EC on April 13 announced the constituency vacant as its lawmaker Shawkat Hossain Hiron died on April 9.

## NID cards

The CEC yesterday admitted that anyone could prepare fake national identity (NID) cards at computer shops as the quality of EC-provided NID cards was very poor.

Therefore, the commission has moved to introduce smart cards to prevent falsification of these cards.

"But it will take some time," he said, without giving details about how much time will be needed.

On April 19, police arrested two youths along with 53,100 fake NID cards and 36,300 photographs from the capital.

open the playground to the public and remove the illegal structures, and suggested that the lawyers could move a contempt petition if the 2011 directives were not complied with.

Another lawyer for the petitioners, Sara Hossain, said Justice Gani felt embarrassed to hear the petition without mentioning any reason. She said they would move the petition before another HC bench later.

Attorney General Mahbubey Alam, however, told The Daily Star that the judges did not feel embarrassed, and that the bench dropped the petition from the hearing list, as Fida Kamal's argument was not as expected by the court.

Six environmentalists including Mobassher Hossain, former president of the Institution of Engineers, Bangladesh, filed the writ petition on April 22.

Rapid Action Battalion pressed charges against 11 people, mostly Jubo League men, in the case.

Six of the accused are in jail and five are on the run.

Prime accused SM Zahid Siddique Tarek, joint secretary of Dhaka city (south) Jubo League, was killed in a "shoot-out" between Rab men and "criminals" within 18 hours of his arrest.

Milky, an organising secretary of Dhaka city (south) Jubo League, was gunned down on the night of July 30 last year in front of a shopping mall in the capital's Gulshan.

Milky's brother Maj Rashedul filed the case the same night against 11 named and four to five unnamed people.
