Trader found murdered

A 'missing' trader was found murdered at a paddy field in Uttar Majhpara Kutirghat area under Bakshiganj upazila town yesterday morning. Deceased Akkas Ali, 45, son of late Syed Jamal of Simarpar area, ran a grocery shop in the town. He went out of house on Tuesday night and did not return since, said family members. Locals found his body in the field and informed the police sent it to Jamalpur General Hospital morgue for autopsy. Criminals strangled Akkas and dumped his body in the area, said Mostasimur Rahman, officer in-charge of Bakshiganj police station.

Man goes to gallows for murder

A court here yesterday sentenced a man to death for killing his pregnant wife for dowry in 2010. The convict is Fajal Karim, 38, of Pashchim Baraghona in Banskhali upazila. Chittagong Women and Children Repression Prevention Tribunal-1 Judge Md Rezaul Karim also fined him Tk one lakh. According to the prosecution, Fajal killed his wife Bilkis following an altercation over dowry on June 21, 2010. Bilkis's mother Jannat Khatun later filed a murder case with the tribunal accusing Fajal. After examining witnesses and evidence, the judge found Fajal guilty and pronounced the verdict.

UZ vice chairman sent to jail

A Dinajpur court yesterday sent a Jamaat-backed newly elected vice chairman accused in five cases to jail after rejecting his bail prayer. The accused is Md Jahangir Hossain, ameer of Ghoraghat upazila unit of Jamaat and vice chairman of the upazila parishad. On April 9, police filed a case accusing 151 Jamaat-Shibir and BNP men under the Explosive Substances Act. Jahangir is one of accused, said Sukumar Mohanta, inspector of Dinajpur police court.

Two kids drown

UNB, Naogaon

Two children drowned in a pond in Khans Naogaon area of the district town on Tuesday noon. The deceased are Orion, 7, son of Shahidul Islam, and Shukhi, 6, daughter of Shutka, of the area. Witnesses said Orion and Shukhi accidentally fell into the pond while playing near its bank. After a frantic search, locals rescued the duo and sent them to Naogaon Sadar Hospital where on duty doctors declared them dead.

Robbers loot house

Robbers looted valuables worth Tk10 lakh from a house at Mohammadpur village in Balaganj upazila early Tuesday. Locals said a gang of 10/12 stormed into the house of Shahjahan Miah at the village at about 2:00am by breaking open the door and held the family members hostage at gunpoint. They then took away 13 tolas of gold ornament, Tk 2 lakh and other valuables and fled the scene. On information, police visited the spot. A case was filed in this connection.

2 held with Phensidyl

UNB, Sirajganj

Police arrested two young men along with 3,600 bottles of Indian Phensidyl at Hatikumrul intersection under Solonga police station yesterday morning. The arrestees were identified as private car driver Fahim Ahmed, 30, a resident of Mirpur in Dhaka and Shamim Ahmed, 25, a resident of Madaripur district. Police sources said on secret information, a team conducted a search in a Dhaka-bound private car from Rajshahi and recovered the Phensidyl from the vehicle and arrested the duo at about 11:15 am. A case was filed with Hatikumrul highway police in this connection.

Indian clothes seized

Strike at BAU continues

Section of students confine VC to house demanding resumption of classes

A section of students of Bangladesh Agricultural University (BAU) kept Vice Chancellor Prof Dr Md Rafiqul Haque confined to his residence since Tuesday night, demanding resumption of classes and punishment of those who forced the teachers and the students to boycott classes.

On Tuesday night, police charged batons when the students under the banner of 'Students Association' were staging a sit-in in front of the VC's residence. At least three students were injured during the baton charge.

Later, the students barricaded the main road in front of the VC's residence.

BCL unit of BAU at a press conference yesterday blamed the VC for the ongoing crisis and also gave a 72-hour ultimatum to the university authorities demanding resumption of classes and punishment of the 'attackers who forced' the general students and teachers to boycott classes.

They also threatened a tougher agitation, if the congenial atmosphere was not ensured on the campus within the deadline.

Meanwhile, at an emergency meeting around 9:00pm on Tuesday night, BAU authorities appointed Prof Dr Zahirul Haque

Khondaker of animal nutrition department as advisor, Prof Dr Md Alamgir Hossain of crop botany department as officer on special duty and Prof Dr Sukumar Saha of microbiology and hygiene department as provost of Ashraful Haque Hall, following the resignation of the persons concerned from their posts on April 15.

Registrar Md Abdul Khaleque, registrar of confirmed the matter yesterday.

On the other hand, the indefinite strike called by the general students of BAU demanding arrest and capital punishment for all the killers of Saad continued for the second day yesterday. No classes or examinations were held yesterday.

The agitating students around 9:00am brought out a protest procession on the campus and staged a sit-in in front of the university

administration building. Later, the agitating student leaders sat in a meeting with the newly appointed officials but failed to reach any decision regarding the ongoing crisis.

The crisis began on April 2 this year, after Saad Ibney Momtaj, a final-year student of fisheries faculty of the university, succumbed to his injuries at a private clinic on April 1, a day after some unruly BCL men beat him up mercilessly at Ashraful

POWER OUTAGE

Khagrachhari PDB office besieged

Local people including the traders besieged the district Power Development Board (PDB) office yesterday, demanding smooth power supply in the area.

Under the banner of Khagrachhari Bazar Businessmen Samity, they also brought out a broom procession in the town in this regard.

Later, they withdraw the demonstration programmes following an assurance by the authorities of taking steps to meet the demand.

The processionists then submitted a memorandum to the prime minister through the additional deputy commissioner in favour of their demand.

Frequent power outage caused immense sufferings to the townspeople for the last seven days as the PDB officials blamed the lacking of power grid sub-station in the district.

Away in Pabna, people of Kashinathpur in Bera upazila on Tuesday brought out a broom pro-

cession, protesting power outage, reports our correspondent.

They also formed a human chain in front of Pabna-2 (Kashinathpur) Palli Biddyut office demanding necessary step to resolve the crisis with immediate effect.

The participants said the irrigation pumps in the area became inoperative due to frequent power outage.

Acute load-shedding caused immense sufferings to people from all walks of life including irri-boro farmers, businessmen and students for the last several days, they said.

They also threatened to go for a tougher movement if the authorities are not taken immediate steps for smooth power supply to the area.

Frequent power outage has virtually paralysed life in the area as Rural Electrification Board is getting only 45-48MW against the demand of 88-90MW after supplying in the district town and Ishwardi upazila town, an official of the board said.

BERA MUKTIJODDHA SANGSAD POLLS Mayor-backed FFs snatch nomination papers of MP-blessed group

A group of freedom fighters backed by Bera Municipality Mayor Md Abdul Baten yesterday snatched nomination papers of another group.

Bera upazila Muktijoddha Sangshad election is scheduled for June 4. According to the election schedule, yesterday was the last date for submission of nomination papers.

When the freedom fighters blessed by lawmaker Khondakar Azizul Haque Arzu (Pabna-2 constituency) went to the Bera UNO office for submitting nomination papers, the supporters of Mayor Baten, also the brother of lawmaker Shamsul Haque Tuku, swooped on them and snatched their nomination papers.

"Mayor Baten's men led by freedom fighter Md Ishaq snatched nomination papers of four freedom fighters and beat up them," Lawmaker Azizul Haque

Arzu claimed.

Failing to submit nomination paper to Bera UNO office, seven freedom fighters submitted their nomination papers to Pabna deputy commissioner office, he added.

Refuting the allegation, freedom fighter Ishaq said they have submitted nomination papers peacefully. "There is no obstacle to submitting nomination papers," Ishaq said.

Freedom fighter SM Fazlul Haque, who belongs to the lawmaker-blessed group, claimed

Baten group beat up freedom fighter Shahidul Haque, chairman of Mashumdia Union Parishad, his son Rajibul Haque Janu, and freedom fighter Jane Alam Janu. They took primary treatment at Kashinathpur health centre.

Bera Upazila Nirbahi officer Md. Saiful Islam said they ensured security for those who came to his office for submitting nomination papers.

UP member held on rape charge

The woman was sent to Bandarban Sadar Hospital for medical test yesterday, said OC Sha Jahan Khan.

In Sylhet, a minor girl was violated allegedly by a youth at Khadinagar Barojan Tea Garden in Sadar upazila on Tuesday, reports UNB.
