Expressing "grave concern" over the recovery of seven dead bodies from the Shitalakya river in Narayanganj recently, Ain O Salish Kendra (ASK), a rights body, in a statement yesterday said, "As per ASK statistics based on media reports, 54 people across the country have been abducted by alleged law enforcers in the last four months."

"Of the 54, only 8 persons came back alive, while dead bodies of 15 have been recovered. Still there is no clue of others".

The recurrence of such abduction indicates the deterioration of law and order, triggering a sense of insecurity and panic among the people, the statement added.

"The state's failure in taking any measures against the perpetrators has given

rise to a culture of impunity," it said. Protesting the alarming rise of abductions and killings, Sammilita Sangskritik Jote, an alliance of cultural organisations, in a statement yesterday announced that it would start a blackflag procession from the Teachers and Students Centre of Dhaka University around 5:00pm today.
