Main accused in N'ganj panel mayor Nazrul abduction, killing case flees safely; microbus seized; one more body found floating in Shitalakkhya

STAR REPORT

Three days after the bodies 🏻 🎆 of seven abductees, including Naryanganj panel mayor Nazrul Islam, were found floating in the Shitalakkhya, police yesterday raided the house of prime accused Nur Hossain.

The three-hour raid from 11:00am at his Shimrail residence in Naryanganj yielded predictable result -- neither Nur Hossain nor his family members were found.

Police, however, seized a microbus and detained 11 persons whose names and identities were not disclosed. All of the TRADER RESCUED 2 DAYS AFTER KIDNAP - PAGE 3

detainees are male and aged between 30 and 35, according to an official.

Nur Hossain, ward-4 councillor and vice president of Siddhirganj Awami League, got enough time to flee because of the laidback attitude of police, allege locals.

On April 27, Nazrul, his four associates and lawyer Chandan Sarker and his driver were kidnapped separately, all around the same time. Police suspect one single group was behind their abduction and killing.

Nazrul's wife Selina Islam has all along

So easy to be rich

Thanks to crimes, truck helper turned tycoon

Once a truck helper, local Awami League leader Nur Hossain, prime suspect for the abduction and killing of Narayanganj City panel mayor Nazrul Islam, has amassed huge wealth at home and abroad with the blessings of major political parties since late 80s.

Hossain, vice president of Siddhirganj thana AL, has businesses and assets in India and Malaysia, according to locals and some of his followers.

He did everything he could to earn wealth illegally.

He resorted to extortion in the transport sector, drug peddling, tender manipulation, river encroachment and illegal sand trade in

8 dead as 209 primary launch capsizes schools shut

35 missing OUR CORRESPONDENT, Patuakhali

A launch capsized in the Golachipa river in Patuakhali during a nor'wester yesterday afternoon, leaving at least eight people, including a child and four women, dead.

Five of the dead were identified as Rifat, 5, Lutfa Begum, 55, Monwara Begum, 30, Runiya Begum, 20, and Nipa, 25.

Of some 60 passengers aboard the launch, as many as 35 were missing till filing The others are said to have swum ashore.

The launch, ML Shathil, sank around 2:30pm at Kalagasia while it was going to Patuakhali from Golachipa upazila, said Badrul Alam, assistant director of Bangladesh Inland Water Transport Authorities in Patuakhali.

Most of the passengers were female, said Ashraf Hossain, a passenger of the launch.


