A dream series win over the West Indies, who had just finished dancing to the tune of the Gangnam Style celebrating their World T20 championship in 2012; an unexpectedly appropriate follow-up with the first 'Banglawash' of the Kiwis; and then taking the fight to the Lankans in the Lions' den, Shane Jurgensen has undoubtedly been a part of Bangladesh's best period of cricket.

And yet through his departure he had probably witnessed the worst of Bangladesh's cricket. On April 28, Jurgensen, embarrassed and irked by comments made by a BCB director to the media regarding the need for a new coach, submitted his resignation and brought an end to his two-and-a-halfyear career with the Tigers.

While the director's comments put in the final punch, Jurgensen, during his various interactions with the media, stated that there were a number of off-field issues that he had to evade during his tenure and in the end, it was on his birthday last month that he decided to take the final call.

Speaking to The Daily Star regarding some of the off-field issues that irked him, the Australian spoke of an instance right before the World T20 when he wanted the board to punish a player, for not following the team's schedule appropriately. He however, did not get the support he needed. Oddly enough, he was then criticised by many in the cricketing fraternity for being too 'soft' on the players.

"I suppose there were probably a couple of times when I wanted some action to be taken against a player and as a coach you need the support just to make a player understand that this is not acceptable. It just would have been nicer to have had some support at that point of time," rued Jurgensen.

"And then some people go on to question me and say that I had been soft on the players," added the Australian with a grin.


home soil.

Having already led the most successful nation in the tournament's history to their fifth title in Japan in 2002, Scolari is now out to lay the ghosts of 1950, when the Selecao lost the trophy match to Uruguay in Rio. His list contained no major surprises,

although Milan forward Robinho (92 caps) missed the cut along with former world players of the year Ronaldinho (97 caps) and Kaka (87 caps), an echo of his decision to dump Romario more than a decade ago.

Robinho missed the cut despite facing Chile in a recent friendly. Youngster Philippe Coutinho also missed the cut despite having a wonderful season with Liverpool.

With Scolari having said for months he knew in his own mind who he wanted

Henrique of Napoli, fresh from lifting the Coppa Italia, also claimed a berth while in the middle, Scolari completed his contingent with Manchester City's Fernandinho and also Inter Milan's Hernanes.

Scolari had already named as his four captains defensive linchpins Tiago Silva and David Luiz, veteran striker Fred of Fluminense and goalkeeper Julio Cesar, despite Cesar now playing in Major League Soccer with Toronto FC.

In 2002, Scolari preferred a 3-4-3 line up with Ronaldo at its apex.

But now he will likely base their hopes on a 4-2-3-1 permutation with the idea that star man Neymar of Barcelona can enjoy a free role.

UAE to host Pak-Kiwi series

Pakistan cricket officials on Wednesday announced details of their series against New Zealand in the United Arab Emirates in November and December.

The two sides will play three Tests, five one-day internationals and a Twenty20 in the UAE between November 11 and December 19, the Pakistan Cricket Board (PCB) said.

Pakistan has been forced to play all of its home series in neutral countries, usually the UAE, since militants attacked the Sri Lankan team bus in Lahore in 2009.

Since then all foreign teams have refused to tour Pakistan over security fears. This will be the first time

Pakistan and New Zealand have met in Tests in the UAE, having previously played one-day internationals and Twenty20s in the Gulf state in 2009. The first Test will start in

Abu Dhabi on November 11, followed by Tests in Dubai and Sharjah and a one-off T20 on December 5, before the ODIs from December 8.

New Zealand will play the Pakistan A team in a three-day warm up game ahead of the Test series.

Australia's Glenn Maxwell slammed a 38-ball 90 and George Bailey plundered unbeaten 40 off just 13 balls as King's XI Punjab thrashed Chennai Super Kings by 44 runs in a top-ofthe-table clash of the Indian Premier League Twenty20 at the Barabati Stadium in Cuttack vesterday. The two Australian's effort, together with South African David Miller's 47, helped Punjab post a mammoth 231 for four, before they restricted the opposition to 187 for

six in their twenty overs. Elsewhere, Kolkata Knight Riders got back to winning ways after beating Delhi Daredevils by eight wickets at the Firoz Shah Kotla Stadium. Skipper Gautam Gambhir (69) snared a 106run partnership with other opener Robin Uthappa (44) as Kolkata chased down 161 in 18.2 overs with eight wickets in hand, after Shakib Al Hasan's miserly spell of one for 13 had helped restrict Delhi to a modest total of 160.

FRANCE 1938

Azzurri do the double

France were chosen as the hosts of the 1938 World Cup, largely as a thanks to Jules Rimet, the Parisian who had set up the tournament in the first place. In protest of the decision, Argentina, who had expected to host the tournament, refused to enter. Uruguay, ever close allies of the Argentine cause, followed suit.

The 1938 World Cup is notable for the first sighting of the first Brazilian legend: Leonidas da Silva. Although his team would fall at the semifinal stage, he scored eight goals to etch his name in the history books. There were again a couple of surprise entries: The Dutch East Indies made their first and only appearance, as did Cuba.

In the group stages, holders Italy continued their apparent tradition of making a mountain out of a molehill, by labouring to beat Norway 2-1. Elsewhere, the Dutch East Indies were thrashed 6-0 by Hungary, and Cuba nearly provided a surprise before being held 3-3 by Romania. Romantics didn't have to wait too long, though. The Cubans won the replay 2-1. Elsewhere, Germany were surprised by four goals to two by the Swiss after a replay and, in possibly the most extraordinary match the World Cup has ever seen, Brazil beat Poland 6-5, with Leonidas and the Polish striker Willimowski scoring four each.

Sweden, who were given a bye to the quarterfinals, ran through with eight goals past Cuba. The French became the first host nation to not win the competition, after their loss against Italy, Leonidas scored another two, as Brazil beat the Czechs 2-1 after a replay.

Italy were the favourites in the semifinal against the tournament's form team Brazil. So what do Brazil do? They drop Leonidas in preparation for the final. In an act of supreme poetic justice, Italy edged through 2-1. In the other semifinal, Sweden were battered 5-1 by the rapidly improving Hungarians.

ideologies. The Hungarians, a prototype of the famous team of the 1950s, were known for their all-out attacking style. Italy, on the other hand, preferred to play it cautiously. The match got off to an extraordinary start, with two goals in the first eight minutes. Silvio Piola edged the Italians back in front and, twenty minutes into the second half, Colaussi extended the lead to 3-1. Just when it seemed as if it was all over for the Hungarians, they seized a lifeline when Sarosi pulled one back with twenty minutes to play. It wasn't enough, though -- a late shot from Piola tied it up to take the Jules Rimet trophy back to Italy again.

Sadly, it was to be the last World Cup for 12 years, as the World War II intervened. When football resumed, the map of world football had changed considerably.
