## SSC results likely on May 17 or 18

The results of this year's Secondary School Certificate (SSC) and equivalent examinations are likely to be published on May 17 or 18.

The education ministry yesterday sent a letter to the prime minister to publish the results any of the dates, said an official of the ministry seeking anonymity.

Taslima Begum, chairman of Inter-Education Board Coordination Sub-committee, told The Daily Star, "We are prepared to publish the results before the stipulated 60 days." The examinations were held between February 9 and March 22.

DHANMONDI PLAYGROUND  
CJ assigns HC bench to hear greens' writ petition

Chief Justice Md Muzammel Hossain yesterday assigned a High Court bench to hear a writ petition filed for the removal of illegal structures from Dhammondi-8 public playground in the capital.

The HC bench of Justice Quazi Reza-Ul Hoque and Justice ABM Altaf Hossain will now fix a date for hearing arguments on the petition.

The hearing may be held any day of the next week, HC sources said.

On May 4, an HC bench of Justice Farah Mahbub and Kazi Md Ejazul Haque Akondo refused to deal with the petition after one of its judges expressed unwillingness to hear arguments on it.

The bench then sent the petition to the chief justice.

The petition was filed seeking directives on the government to remove illegal structures from the

## No raid without informing police

Decides CMP; takes series of measures to prevent abductions in Ctg

In order to resist abduction, which has struck fear into the public mind for an alarming rise in cases recently, Chittagong police have taken a series of security measures, including the one that if any law enforcement agency wants to conduct raids in an area, they must inform the police station concerned beforehand.

From now on, law enforcers would also not conduct drives in plainclothes, said SM Tanvir Arafat, additional deputy commissioner (west zone) of Chittagong Metropolitan Police, citing decisions taken at an emergency meeting of the CMP on Tuesday.

If law enforcers other than police conduct drives in any area, they must inform the local police station, and if police conduct drives, they must inform the superintendent of police (SP) and officer-in-charge of the police station concerned, he told The Daily Star.

The CMP also decided to set up surveillance cameras at the seven entry and exit points of Chittagong city--Kaptai Rastar

Matha, Karnaphuli Shah Amanat Bridge, Patenga Beribadh, Toll Road, City Gate, Oxygen More and Karnaphuli Kalurghat Bridge.

Police will strengthen vigilance at these points.

"We discussed how to maintain law and order more effectively in our last monthly meeting," said Banaj Kumar Majumder, additional commissioner (crimes and operation), CMP. He said they got directives from the police headquarters to resist kidnaping.

"Initially, we will install cameras only at the city's entry and exit points due to fund constraints. Later, we aim to put cameras at all other vital points here," said Banaj.

ADC Tanvir said video footage of the passengers of all public and private vehicles would be taken at the seven points.

Besides, no vehicle will be allowed to use black glasses from May 11, and owners have been instructed to remove tinted glasses from their vehicles by May 10, said Banaj.

SP of Chittagong AKM Hafiz Akter said the district police administration had also

N'GANJ 7-MURDER  
JP demands special tribunal  
WP wants punishment for perpetrators

Jatiya Party and Workers Party of Bangladesh, two key components of the Awami League (AL)-led government, yesterday demanded exemplary punishment for perpetrators behind the abduction and subsequent murder of seven people including Nazrul Islam, panel mayor of Narayanganj City Corporation.

"We strongly denounce extrajudicial killings, and want rule of law. No matter how influential the criminals are, they should be brought to justice," said Workers Party lawmaker Fazle Hossain Badsha at a rally at Bahadur Shah Park in the capital.

Society, politics, and the state itself have become insecure due to frequent abductions, extortions,

DEFIANCE OF LAW BY LAW ENFORCERS  
Deterring democracy, criminality in politics are causes

Observes SHUJAN roundtable

Speakers at a discussion on forced disappearances and abductions yesterday linked the tendency of a section of law enforcement agencies to defy law to the recent one-sided general election, excessive politicisation of the agencies, a lack of accountability, and politics of criminality.

"It seems that the government is not in control of the law enforcement agencies," said former election commissioner Brig Gen (retd) Shakhwat Hossain.

Alluding to the one-sided, voterless national election on January 5, in which the ruling Awami League won a sweeping majority, he said, "If the election is not largely accepted by the society, law enforcement agencies become callous."

He also observed, "The chain of command has broken down in law enforcement agencies because of excessive politicisation."

His observations came against the backdrop of the allegations of abduction by Rapid Action Battalion (Rab), an elite force whose three officials have been fired this week for their alleged involvement in the recent abduction and killing of seven people in Narayanganj city.

The speakers also blamed a lack of accountability of the government and law enforcement bodies for the existing law and order situation.

Nagorik Oikya Convener Mahmudur Rahman Manna said that coming to power by using force, the government had become dependent on the law enforcement agencies

## SUB-PAR CRESTS FOR FOREIGN FRIENDS

## Judicial probe demanded

Senior assistant secy of Liberation War ministry made OSD

Protesters yesterday demanded that a judicial probe body be formed to find out the people involved in making and purchasing sub-par shields awarded to foreign friends and organisations for their outstanding contributions to the country's Liberation War.

They also demanded immediate arrest and exemplary punishment for the culprits behind the fraud or else they would go for tougher programmes like fast unto death, grand rally, and mass signature campaign.

They made the demands at a human chain followed by a token hunger strike organised by the Muktijuddho Academy in front of the Jatiya Press Club.

Later they submitted a memorandum to the Ministry of Liberation War Affairs.

Awami League-led government during its previous tenure awarded a total 338 foreign friends and organisations for their roles in 1971. They were awarded with a crest and a certificate each. Recently, allegations have surfaced that crests awarded to them were substandard.

Abul Azad, president of Muktijuddho Academy, said the crest fraud was a part of a deep-rooted conspiracy and those who were behind it should be brought to book immediately.

Muktijuddha Command Council former chairman Kabir Ahmed Khan, Swadhin Bangla Betar Kendra artiste Monorjon Ghosal, among others, spoke.

Meanwhile, Babul Miah, senior assistant secretary of liberation war affairs ministry, has been made an Officer on Special Duty (OSD).

The public administration ministry issued a circular in this regard yesterday. The order came a day after Additional Secretary of the ministry Golam Mostafa was made OSD.

Golam Mostafa was chief of the crest purchasing committee and Babul was a member of the committee.

Earlier, Abul Kashem Talukdar, joint secretary of the ministry, was made OSD for allegedly obtaining fake freedom fighters' certificates.
