Bangladesh's home of cricket, the Sher-e-Bangla National Cricket Stadium at

Mirpur, witnessed its first double century by a Bangladeshi batsman yesterday, when left-handed opener Imrul Kayes stroked his way to a resolute 204 in the third innings of the final of the Bangladesh Cricket League.

Middle-order batsman Mithun Ali provided good support by scoring his eighth first-class century and remained unbeaten on 111 to place the Prime Bank South Zone in a position of strength.

The pair shared a 254-run stand for the third wicket and in the process took their side to a nearly unbeatable position. The Southerners finished the third day on 410 for 3 to already take a massive lead of 446 runs.

The one major difference in yesterday's innings was his ability to curtail himself from playing shots in the air. He did hit nine sixes during his six-hour vigil, but most of those well-timed hits came off some below-par deliveries.

It compelled Imrul to abandon his shot and dive back to his crease. Two balls before that delivery, Imrul skied Taijul in the air and almost gifted a catch to the long-off fielder, who was standing on the boundary line and took the catch much later than expected. There were also a couple of drop catches, however, at the end of the day nothing could stop the batsmen from reaching his career-best score.

Goals from Samir Nasri and skipper Vincent Kompany saw Manchester City to a 2-0 win over West Ham as

they claimed their second Premier League title in three seasons.

Sunday's final day of the league season victory at City's Eastlands ground crowned a triumphant first English campaign in charge for Manuel Pellegrini, the Chilean manager celebrating his first domestic championship in Europe.

Winners of the League Cup earlier in the year, City added the championship in fairly routine fashion.

SWITZERLAND 1954 The Miracle of Berne

South Zone opener Imrul Kayes

final at SBNS in Mirpur yesterday.

Switzerland was the obvious choice of venue for the fifth World Cup. FIFA's headquarters were in Zurich and 1954 marked the 50th anniversary of its formation. The competition proved to be a financial success and received limited TV coverage for the first time.

FIFA once more found it necessary to change the format, reverting to a pool and knock-out system. The 16 teams were divided into four groups with two teams in each group seeded. The two seeded teams, strangely enough, did not need to play each other in the group. Also remarkable was that extra time was needed if the scores were level in the group matches!

Hungary were the new force to be reckoned with. They banged in goals with a frequence never seen before in a World Cup. They beat West Germany 8-3 and South Korea 9-0. The world was introduced to players like Puskas, Kocsis, Hidegkuti and Czibor. Another team among the favourites was Uruguay. They still hadn't lost a match in World Cup history at this stage and their run continued also after the group stage after beating Czechoslovakia and Scotland.

The quarterfinal between Austria and Switzerland brought a new World Cup record. Austria won 7-5, that's the highest number of goals ever in a World Cup match. Uruguay beat England 4-2, and Hungary beat Brazil by the same score in one of the most brutal matches ever, later dubbed as 'The Battle of Berne'. West Germany, who had from their early thrashing by Hungary in the first round, beat Yugoslavia.

The semifinal between Hungary and Uruguay is regarded to be one of the best ever in a World Cup. Hungary won 4-2 after extra-time and with that, Uruguay's unbeaten run was broken. The Germans had

hit top form and trashed their neighbours Austria by 6-1 and the stage was set for a great final.

Rain dampened the final, but not the Hungarians'

resolve as they blasted their way to a 2-0 lead with goals from Puskas and Czibor, leading spectators believing a rout might be on.

The Germans had other ideas, however, and battled back brilliantly to level the scores through Maximilian Morlock and Uwe Rahn. It was 2-2 and only 20 minutes had been played.

The action swung back and forth for the rest of the first-half and most of the second, but with extra-time looming Rahn struck the championship winner with five minutes left, brilliantly set-up by Fritz Walter.

In the dying minutes Puskas ran onto Toth's pass to slide the ball under Turek, only for Mervyn Griffiths, the authoritarian, high-profile Welsh linesman to call it offside. Thirty seconds from the end, Czibor put everything into a shot, but Turek, tremendously agile for a man of 35, turned it away.

It was the end of Hungary's virtual invincibility. They had strong claims to that unwanted title: best team never to win the World Cup. For them this was the end of the World.
