

DHAKA AIRPORT EXPANSION Govt approves proposal to appoint int'l conglomerate

The government yesterday approved a proposal to appoint an international conglomerate for implementation of the expansion work of Hazrat Shahjalal International Airport, aiming to double its capacity.

The cabinet committee on purchase approved the proposal for appointing the conglomerate consisting -- Yooshin Engineering Corporation (Korea)-CPG Consultants Pte. Ltd (Singapore)- Development Design Consultants Ltd (Bangladesh) JV -- at Tk 39.89 crore.

The expansion work includes construction of a second runway, third terminal, and other infrastructural development, as the Civil Aviation Authority of Bangladesh (Caab) plans to cope with ever-growing passenger flow through the airport.

The premier airport started its operations in 1980 and saw a very little expansion work since then. Presently, the annual growth rate of passengers and freight at the airport is 13 percent.

If the growth rate remains unchanged, expansion of the airport will be required after 2018, Caab sources said.

Now the airport is capable of serving eight million passengers annually, though it now serves 5.3 million.

With its lone 10,500-foot long tarmac, the airport can handle 25 planes per hour, though the number now usually varies from 10 to 11.

Once the airport is expanded, its flight operation capacity will be more than 50 aircraft per hour, the sources added.

BCL men besiege Sust VC for 3hrs

Claim to protest selection of 'unqualified Shibir men' as teachers; authorities deny

A group of Awami League-backed Bangladesh Chhatra League activists yesterday besieged the vice-chancellor of Shahjalal University of Science and Technology (Sust) for three hours at his office, protesting, what they claimed, authorities' bid to appoint six "Shibir" men as lecturers dropping "qualified candidates".

Around 50 activists joined the agitation to stop a pre-scheduled syndicate meeting on the day, which was to okay the appointment of the lecturers selected earlier.

The agitators suspended their programme after assurance from VC Prof Md Aminul Haque Bhuiyan that he would look into the matter, said Niloy Chandra Sarker, assistant proctor.

The syndicate meeting, however, began at 2:00pm, three hours after its scheduled time.

Earlier, around 10:00am, the BCL men locked up the main gate of the Registrar Building, as the Sust syndicate was to confirm the appointment of the six, three each in civil and environment engineering and chemistry departments.

Anjan Roy, BCL vice president of Sust unit, said they had withdrawn their programme after assurance from the VC.

He added that the authorities had selected "unqualified Shibir men" as teachers dropping meritorious candidates.

Contacted, on condition of anonymity, a syndicate member said the issue of appointments was dropped

Lack of political support curbs women's inclusion

National seminar told

A lack of political support is one of the main barriers to women's participation in local government elections, speakers said at a national seminar yesterday, as data show a huge fall in the number of female candidates over past several years.

Parties' reluctance to nominate and empower their female members is seen as a reason for the decreasing participation of women in upazila and union parishad elections, they said.

A paper, presented by Ranjan Karmaker, executive director of Steps Towards Development (STD), said women's participation in the 2014 upazila elections went down by 48 percent compared to that of the 2009 upazila elections.

"In 2014 upazila elections, 1,507 women took part from 458 upazilas, while the figure was 2,900 in 2009," he said, citing from the statistics of Democracy Watch.

STD and Democracy Watch are two of the four alliance partners of a project that

Cambodian PM due on Friday

to Dhaka from Friday to further expanding and strengthening trade relations and cooperation in agriculture sector between the two countries.

Official sources said Dhaka and Phnom Penh are expected to ink several deals in the areas of trade and economy.

They said the bilateral relations and cooperation between the two countries have strengthened greatly in recent years following signing of a trade agreement on August 4, 2006.

During the visit, sources said Dhaka is expected to seek long-term land lease for contract farming in Cambodia by Bangladeshi nationals. Bangladesh has also shown deep interest in signing a long-term agreement with Cambodia to

The Chittagong Metropolitan Sessions Judge Court yesterday framed charges against Hefajat-e-Islam nayebe-ameer Mufti Izharul Islam Chowdhury in a case filed for not submitting his wealth statement to the Anti-Corruption Commission.


Mufti Izharul is absconding, said the court sources.

According to the prosecution, the ACC issued notices to Mufti Izharul last year on July 4, 11 and 28 for submitting his wealth statement. But Mufti Izharul neither responded nor submitted his wealth statement.

Later, on September 17, the ACC filed the case with Khulshi Police Station under the Anti-Corruption Commission Act-2004.
