## Govt moves to rein in Jamaat

Targets 16 districts to 'stave off violence' over war crimes trial verdicts

The government decides to go tough on Jamaat-Shibir to ward off possible pre- and post-verdict violence as judgements in three cases against Jamaat-e-Islami leaders are pending with the Supreme Court and the international crimes tribunals.

To keep the situation under control, the government has already taken several measures including arrest of troublemaking leaders of the Islamist party, which always resorts to violence following every verdict, and surveillance of the activities of Jamaat and its associate student body Islami Chhatra Shibir.

Based on information from the intelligence agencies, the government has selected 15/16 districts with Jamaat strongholds where bloody violence erupted last year and decided to arrest the party's top leaders there, sources said. As part of the plan, the law enforcers on Monday arrested

21 Jamaat leaders and activists in Chittagong including city unit ameer and former lawmaker ANM Shamsul Islam, sources informed. Intelligence agencies were keeping an eye on Jamaat-

Shibir activities in the selected districts and would beef up their surveillance in the coming days, said an official of the Prime Minster's Office.

Of the districts, Chittagong, Satkhira, Joypurhat, Rajshahi, Cox's Bazar, Comilla, Chapainawabganj, Bogra, SEE PAGE 10 COL 1

### Running train catches fire

None hurt

Three compartments of Kalni Express were gutted in a fire that broke out in the kitchen of the running train near Cantonment Railway Station in the capital yesterday afternoon.

No causalities were reported in the fire, Major Mohammad Mahboob, director (operations) of Fire Service and Civil Defence, told The Daily Star.

Abdul Mazid, officer-incharge of Dhaka Railway Police Station, said the fire originated from an oven at a compartment that housed the kitchen.

It soon spread to two adjacent compartments.

After tracing the source of the fire to the kitchen around 1:30 pm, the staff pulled the emergency brake. The train stopped around 400 yards ahead at the station.

In a state of panic, passengers hurriedly jumped out of the train, said Major Mahboob.

Chairperson Khaleda Zia that Manned US aircraft were in the skies the Rapid Action Battalion above Nigeria yesterday in the hunt for (Rab) should be disbanded as more than 200 missing schoolgirls, the elite force has now become involved in killings, abductions almost a month after they were kidand forced disappearances? napped by Islamist militants.

The United States said manned ISR (intelligence, surveillance and reconnaissance) aircraft were being flown and it had also shared commercial satellite imagery as part of the rescue effort.

Boko Haram militants abducted 276 girls from the remote northeastern town of Chibok in Borno state on April 14. Some 223 are still missing and on Monday the militants released a new video purporting to show some of them.

With electricity supply intermittent in Chibok, efforts were underway for the missing girls' parents to identify their daughters in the video, in which Boko Haram leader Abubakar Shekau claimed they had converted to Islam.

The co-ordinator of the Bring Back Our Girls campaign, which has helped drive international pressure for action through social media and global street protests, said three parents had seen their daughters on screen. "Three parents have identified their

daughters in the video," Hadiza Bala Usman told AFP from the Nigerian capital Abuja.

"(Borno) Governor (Kashim) Shettima has now organised a screening in (the state capital) Maiduguri with audio and is bringing parents from Chibok to try to identify more girls."

The latest video, obtained by AFP, showed about 130 teenagers, all in Muslim dress and reciting the first chapter of the Koran and praying in an undisclosed rural location.

It was not clear where or when the footage was shot, although Shekau does refer to suggestions made in the last week by the United Nations that Boko Haram may have committed a crime against humanity by abducting the girls. Nigeria's government said on

Monday evening that it was studying the video in which the militant leader SEE PAGE 2 COL 4
