The three controversial Rab men are Lt Col Tareque Sayeed Mohammad, Maj Arif Hossain and Lt Commander SM Masud Rana. They were forced to retire on May 6 for their reported links to the abductions and killings.

None of them is accused in the case filed by Selina Islam, widow of one of the victims Nazrul Islam, but the HC on May 11 ordered the inspector general of police to nab them as suspects. The court order came after Nazrul's

family alleged that Rab men had committed the crime in exchange for Tk 6 crore from Nur Hossain, the prime accused, and other suspects. Following the court order, State

Minister for Home Asaduzzaman Khan Kamal has, almost every day, told the media that the trio would be arrested in line with the HC directive.

Yesterday, he told journalists at the secretariat that the Rab men would be detained in a day or two.

At the ALCWC meeting, the PM said the trio were inside Dhaka cantonment and police would have to follow army rules to arrest them, sources said.
