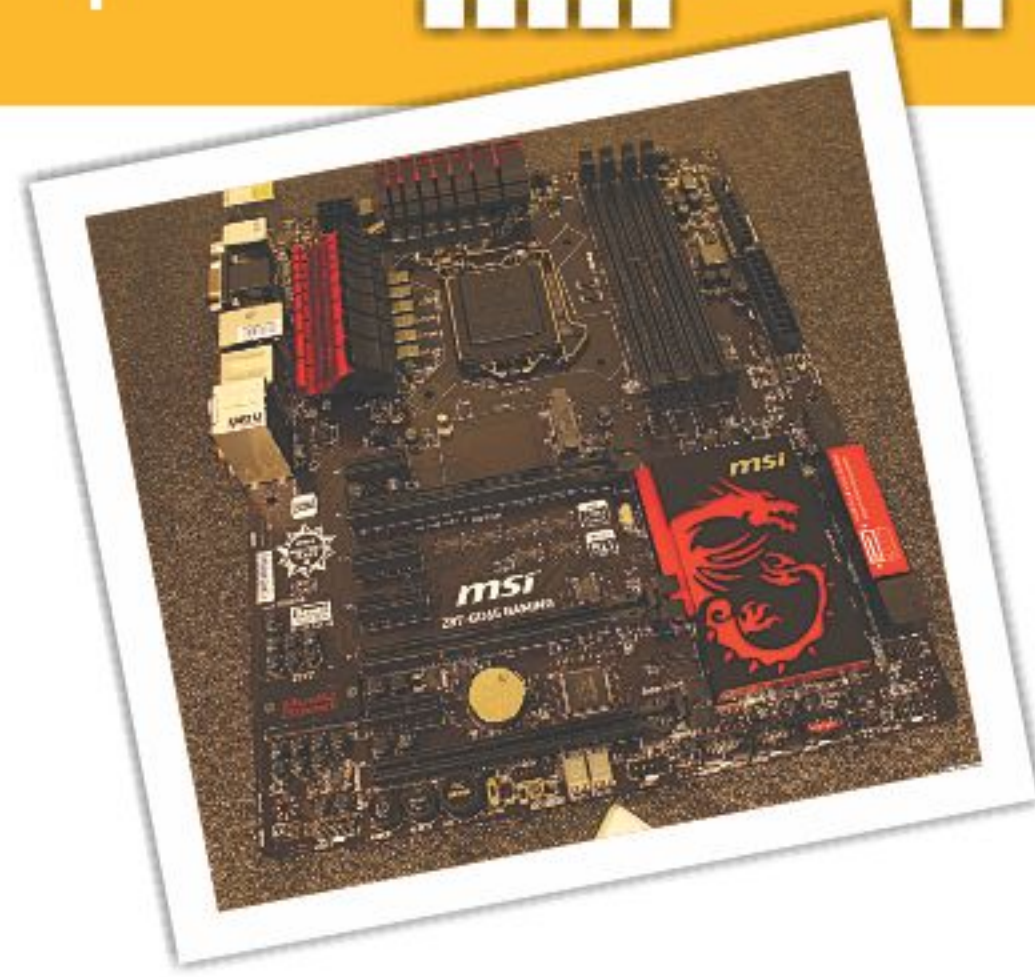

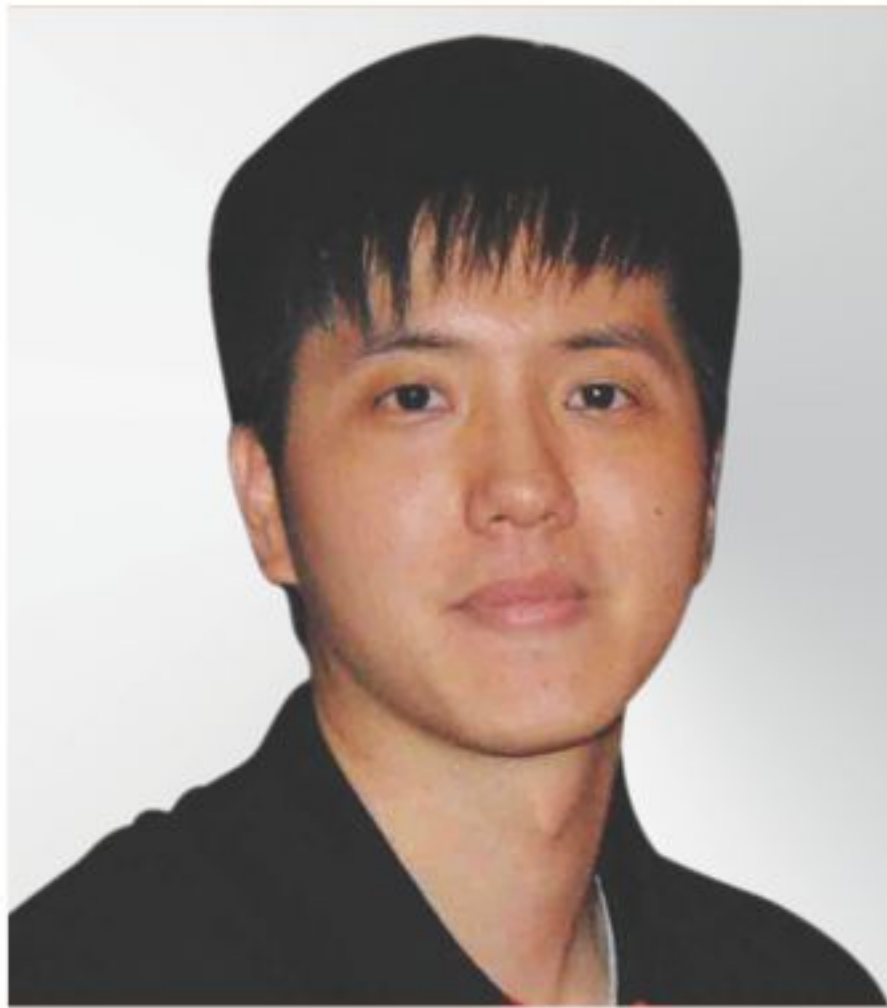
US-Bangladesh Tech Investment Summit 2014 starts this week

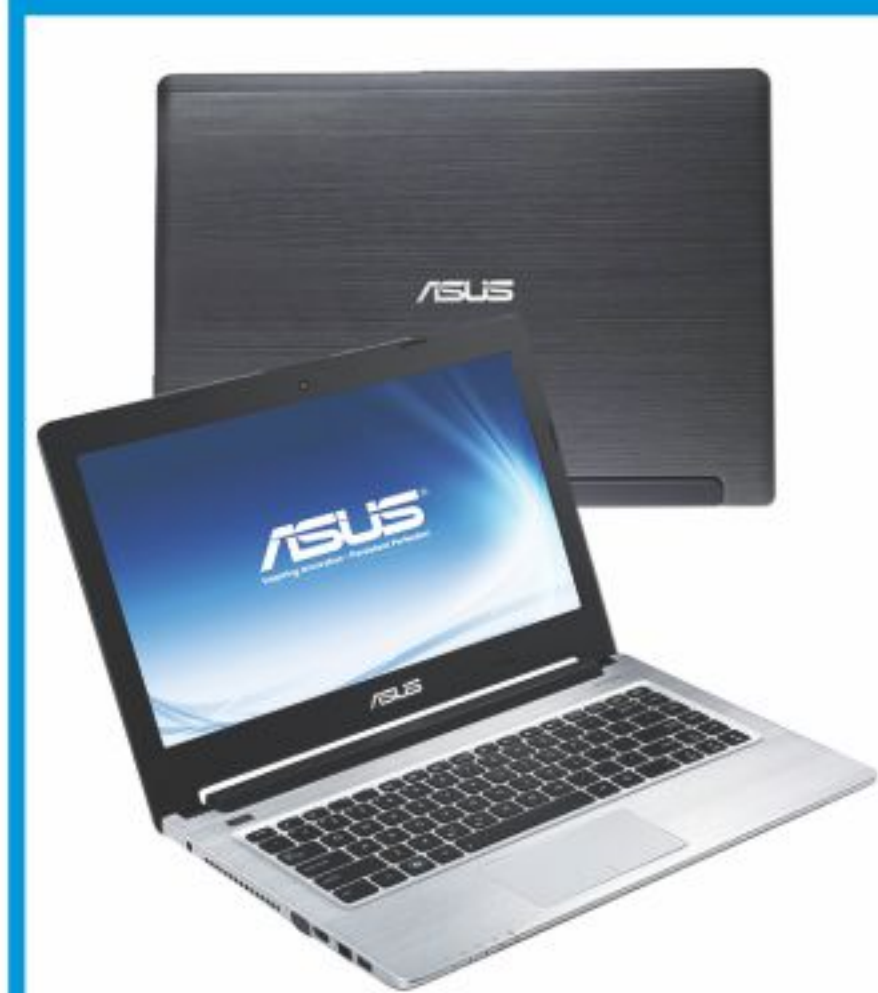
Shahriar: After-sales service is a big issue in Bangladesh. How is MSI dealing that?
