


Hathurusingha signed for two years

batsman Michael Bevan, who was the other interested candidate but with a more expensive financial package and comparatively lesser interest in a full-time tenure.

"We have finalised a two-year agreement with Hathurusingha. The agreement begins on July 1 this year, but since we are playing against India next month, we are hoping he will arrive by June 10," said Bangladesh Cricket Board (BCB) president Nazmul Hassan Papon while making the official announcement.

"Apart from Chandika Hathurusingha, we had a few alternatives. We thought that he could be our best choice because of two reasons -- his knowledge of sub-continental wickets and his work experience in Australia. He worked in Sri Lanka for long and played for the national side. He has worked in Australia and with the World Cup coming up, this is a good combination for us," said Papon.

"I think we were looking for this type of coach, one who has knowledge on sub continental and Australian conditions. Hathurusingha is among the high-profile coaches from around the world as far as I am concerned," he added.

Hathurusingha's tactical shrewdness was highly praised by none other than Sri Lanka batting maestro Kumar Sangakkara during his role as a shadow coach but a disciplinary issue terminated his association with the national side in 2010.

of the new coach, but if the amount is one to two thousand dollars more than predecessor Shane Jurgensen, as hinted by Papon, then the figure will be around 18,000 dollars.

A five-member special committee was given the task of finding new coaches to replace Jurgensen, trainer David Dwyer, batting and fielding coach Corey Richards and Richard McInnes, the head coach of the National Cricket Academy.

Besides a new head coach, David Dwyer has been replaced by Sri Lankan Mario Villavarayan as the new strength and conditioning coach.

BCB is still in discussion with candidates for the role of the fast bowling coach; former Zimbabwe fast bowler Heath Streak and Champaka Ramanayake have reportedly been approached by the BCB.

"We are trying to get the other coaches but I don't think we will get everyone before the India series. We are communicating with them and because not all of them are full-time coaches, we are trying to work out a time slot. We haven't gone too far in this regard, so we don't want to talk much about it," said Papon, adding that Chaminda Vaas's name is also there in the list of probable fast bowling coaches.

Papon said that the preparation camp for the India series will start by May 25 and local coaches will look after the boys before the new head coach takes over.

Baridhara hold Feni

Uttar Baridhara Club came from behind to hold Feni Soccer Club to a 1-1 draw in their Nitol Tata Bangladesh Premier League encounter at the Bangabandhu National Stadium yesterday.

Akbar Hossain Ridon put Feni Soccer ahead as early as the sixth minute only to be cancelled by Kenyan hitman Collings Tiego in the 76th minute to produce an identical 1-1 stalemate they played in their first meeting of the league.

Baridhara with fourth draw remained in eighth position with 11 points, just one point ahead of ninth-placed Feni Soccer Club.

England-SL lone T20I today

England will hope history repeats itself when they begin their international programme against Sri Lanka with a lone Twenty20 international at The Oval on Tuesday.

One of the few highlights for England during a recent tour programme that saw them surrender the Ashes 5-0 came in March when Alex Hales' stunning 116 not out off just 64 balls saw them beat eventual champions Sri Lanka at the World Twenty20 in Bangladesh.

England eventually bowed out of that tournament with a humiliating 45run loss to the Netherlands while even Hales's astonishing innings -- the first century in a Twenty20 international by an England batsman -- has threatened to become something of a millstone around the 25-year-old's neck.

Tradition still holds sway in England, the longer the game the more respect it is accorded.

That's why many England fans regard Tuesday's match and the five one-day internationals that follow as a 'warm-up' for the more 'serious' business of the two Test series with Sri Lanka.

Today is the third death anniversary of Al Musabbir Sadi, a prominent sports

journalist and former general secretary of Bangladesh Football Federation (BFF).

Sadi, also a senior member of the Bangladesh Sports Journalists Association (BSJA), died of cancer on this day in 2011 at the age of 44. He is survived by his wife and two sons.

After completing his Master's degree in Sociology from the University of Dhaka, Sadi started his journalism career as a sports reporter at The Independent in 1995. He later worked at The Daily Star from 2004 to 2009 as a senior reporter before joining BFF as the first ever paid general secretary in 2009.

A milad mahfil will be held at 5:30pm today at the BFF House to pray for the salvation and peace of his departed soul.

Football's finest hour

For people of a certain age, the 1970 World Cup in Mexico is perhaps the most vividly remem-

It had pretty much everything --Bobby Moore's arrest, Gordon Banks' extraordinary save and subsequent food poisoning that cost England their quarterfinal, perhaps the single most thrilling knock-out game ever between West Germany and Italy, probably the greatest team we've ever seen in the Brazilians and, on top of it all, colour television coverage of all the games for the first time.

Brazil were the absolute favourites in the tournament, even before it began. They had scored 23 goals in their qualifying campaign in six matches. Tosato had got ten of them and had struck up a rich partnership with Pele, who himself bagged six. Carlos Alberto, Gerson and Jairzinho were coming into their prime and Clodoaldo provided the base at midfield while Rivelino was another exciting talent.

Gerd Muller in their books but scraped through 3-2 against Scotland. Italy, the European Champions looked strong in qualifying with Luigi Riva scoring seven goals. Argentina though, were eliminated by Peru.

memories of their defeat to Uruguay at the 1950 World Cup final by putting three goals past their South American rivals after shipping a goal early on and arrived in the final at the summit of their art.

The Italians were simply overwhelmed as Tostao, Gerson, Pele, Jairzinho, Rivelino and the rest gave the sporting world a lesson in football. It was 1-1 at one point as Italy's Boninsegna equalised Pele's early strike, but Jarzinho had been kept at bay by the brilliant Fachetti for most of the game but this time his probing paid off albeit with more than a little slice of luck. Fachetti took the ball off Jairzinho but it rolled to Gerson who stepped away from a challenge and scored with a crisp The first great clash of the tour- West Germany fought back from cross-shot. Within minutes Gerson's deep cross was headed across goal by Pele for Jairzinho to bundle in before Carlos Alberto killed it off with a fourth goal.
