AL rebel candidate wins one; rigging, violence in 5 upazilas

The ruling Awami League-backed chairman aspirants won in seven upazilas, while the BNP favourites came out victorious in five in yesterday's upazila polls.

However, the chairman post in the other upazila went to an AL rebel, according to unofficial results declared by the returning officers.


Stray incidents of violence, vote rigging, stuffing of ballots and capturing of polling centres by the AL men were reported in at least five upazilas out of 13 that went to the polls. At least 25 people were injured in the violence and 11

were arrested over creating violence and casting fake votes in different upazilas. The Election Commission has postponed voting in two polling centres and cancelled it in one due to violence and

vote rigging, said Chief Election Commissioner Kazi Rakibuddin Ahmad. "According to reports by our officials, polling in the remaining areas was fair and peaceful," the CEC told a press

conference at the EC's media centre last evening. After lagging behind in the first phase of the upazila polls, AL men resorted to violence and vote rigging in the next phases. Yet chairman candidates backed by the AL were trailing in the polls till the end of the third phase. With the fourth phase over, the party's favourites took the lead from rival BNP-backed candidates.

Osman family critics rally behind AL rebel Akram

The dominance of the Osman family in Narayanganj is set to be challenged in the by-polls to the Narayanganj-5 constituency on June 26.

The one-sided January 5 parliamentary polls was a blessing for the controversial Osman brothers -- Shamim and Nasim -- as both of them were elected unopposed in the district.

After Jatiya Party MP Nasim Osman passed away on April 30, thus leaving the Jatiya Sangsad seat for Narayanganj-5 constituency vacant, the Jatiya Party, which got the seat through a deal with the ruling Awami League, is thinking about nominating Nasim's widow Parvin Osman.

Rival camps, however, are now gearing up to take the Osman family down.

Talking to The Daily Star, a cross section of people, including local politicians and cultural activists, said they were taking the bypolls as a chance to be rid of the Osmans, who are involved in "un-

5 'abductors' arrested

Detective Branch of police have arrested a gang of five alleged abductors, including a minor girl, in separate drives in Dhaka and Sirajganj.

The gang leader, Mohammad Rezaul, had 16-year-old Sheuli Akhter Shilpi trick their targets, mainly youths, into building a relationship with her. She then called them to a desolate place from where Rezaul, 36, along with Anwar Hossain, 45, Abdus Samad, 49, and Mortuza, 28, abducted them for ransom, Senior Assistant Commissioner Nazmul Alam told The Daily Star by phone.

The girl is the second wife of Rezaul, police said. Four of them, excluding Mortuza, were arrested in a drive

in Raiganj of Sirajganj on Sunday. Mortuza was picked up from the capital's Mirpur on that day.

Identifying the abductors during an investigation into a kidnapping case lodged with Turag Police Station on May 2, detectives conducted Sunday's drive, said Monirul Islam, joint commissioner of Dhaka Metropolitan Police (DMP) at a press conference at its media centre yesterday.

Congress keeps trust in Gandhis

Rejects 'resignation offer' made by Sonia, Rahul taking responsibility for polls debacle

Having suffered the worst electoral defeat in the Lok Sabha polls, Congress chief Sonia Gandhi and her son Rahul yesterday "offered to resign" from the party taking moral responsibility but it was rejected by the party's highest decision-making forum.

A meeting of the Congress Working Committee (CWC), where Sonia and Rahul

were understood to have made the offer, however, passed a resolution expressing full faith in their leadership.

"We will fight under the leadership of Rahul Gandhi", party spokesperson Raj Babbar said.

The CWC, which met here yesterday to discuss the party's drubbing in the elections, authorised Sonia to draw up a roadmap for the party's political recovery, party sources said.

Korea to disband coast guards

President takes responsibility for ferry disaster

South Korean President Park Geun-Hye took tearful responsibility yesterday for the mishandling of last month's Sewol ferry disaster, admitting many lives were unnecessarily lost and vowing to dismantle the national coastguard.

"The ultimate responsibility for the poor response to this accident lies with me," Park said in a televised address to the nation, during which she openly wept and twice bowed deeply in a display of contrition.

Park's popularity ratings have been hammered by the April 16
