SC against HC orders

Says HC cannot direct govt 'not to arrest or harass anyone'

The Appellate Division has discouraged the High Court from directing the government not to arrest or harass any

Additional Attorney General Murad Reza told The Daily Star that the Appellate Division made the observation as the HC was giving incorrect blanket directives "not to harass or arrest a suspect without due process of law".

A three-member bench of the Appellate Division,

headed by Justice Surendra Kumar Sinha, said, "We want to

make it clear that the High Court cannot issue any such directive." The apex court passed the order on April 20 after hearing a government petition filed against an HC directive of

January 23 that asked the government not to arrest or harass

Khandker Mahbub Hossain without due process of law. Khandker Mahbub is the president of the Supreme Court Bar Association and an adviser to the BNP chairperson.

The HC had passed the order following a writ petition filed by Farhat Hossain, wife of Khandker Mahbub, seeking a directive on the government not to arrest or harass her

Goldman Sachs sees dream final

Rivals Brazil and Argentina

are set to meet in the World Cup final in July, with the host country winning the title for a record sixth time, US investment bank Goldman Sachs have predicted in a report.

Goldman sees a 48.5 percent probability that Brazil will win the July 13 final, with Argentina and Germany the next most likely teams to succeed with a 14.1 percent and 11.4 percent chance respectively.

2 key suspects still at large

Feni police have so far arrested 21 people in connection with the gruesome murder of Phulgazi upazila chairman Ekramul Haque, but a number of key suspects are still at large.

Among those arrested are local BNP leader Mahtab Uddin Chowdhury Minar, the lone named accused in the case, and two other top suspects --Awami League leader Jihad Chowdhury and Abidul Islam Abid. Latest, cops yesterday detained Jubo League activist Ziaul Haque Bappi at

Daganbhuiyan upazila for his alleged link in the killing.

However, law enforcers have yet to arrest "Ruti" Sohel and Bakkar, who, according to Abid, were present at the meeting where Jihad, also known as Jahid, masterminded the killing.


