Environment Olympiad Participants say no to Rampal power plant

College and university students, who participated in this year's environment Olympiad, observed that the proposed Rampal Power Plant Project in Bangladesh will do the country more harm than good.

The Sundarbans will be affected permanently due to the proposed coal-fired power plant as the power plant will burn around 4.75 million tonnes of coal annually when more or less 0.3 million tonnes ashes and around 0.5 million tonnes sludge and liquid waste may be produced.

18 YEARS INTO KALPANA CHAKMA'S ABDUCTION

Written with pencil, ink and some with crayon, a plethora of colourful cards and letters from all across the world lay on the table before Kalindi Kumar Chakma, expressing solidarity with his 18 years of struggle for justice.

These words of support for the brother of Kalpana

Chakma, organising secretary of Hill Women's Federation, who was allegedly abducted by military and Village Defence Party (VDP) men on June 12, 1996, came as part of human rights organisation Amnesty International's campaign "Write for Rights". Kalpana's name was included last year in the list of vic-

tims of forcible disappearance in the campaign which attempted to inform the world about people, subjected to forcible disappearance or murder by state machineries.

The letters were handed over to Kalindi yesterday at a function organised by the federation at the Upajatiya Thikdar Kalyan Samity Bhaban in Khagrachhari, only a day before the submission of the re-investigation report of the
