Nur, 3 ex-Rab officials under BB scanner

Banks asked to provide transaction details

Bangladesh Bank yesterday asked all commercial banks for transaction details of Nur Hossain and three former Rab officials who have been accused of the seven murder in Narayanganj.

In addition, the central bank wanted the details of 12 other

individuals, including relatives and associates of the four, and several others accused in the case. It also asked for information about 13 organisations the accused were linked to.

Bangladesh Bank, acting on request from police, gave the banks seven days to comply with its directive.

Meanwhile, the investigators of the case may send former Rab official Lt Col Tareque Sayeed to a Narayanganj court today as his five-day remand is to end, reports our correspondent from Narayanganj.

Two officials of the police investigation team told The Daily Star that Tareque provided them with information about the incident. He also may make a confessional statement before the court today.

Former Rab officials Maj (retd) Arif Hossain and Lt Commander Masud Rana had already made confessional An investigation team of Rab called in the family mem-

bers and relatives of the murdered Narayanganj city panel mayor Nazrul Islam at the rest house of Siddirganj power house today to interview them.

DEATH OF PATIENT

Doctor beaten up, clinic vandalised

A mob vandalised a private clinic and beat up a doctor after the death of a patient at the clinic in Pabna yesterday morning.

A housewife died after a caesarean operation at Medicit Clinic and Diagnostic Centre in Bera. Relatives of the patient alleged that she had died due to wrong treatment -- an allegation denied by the clinic authorities.

Brishti Khatun, 20, of village Shannalpara in Bera upazila, was admitted to the clinic on Saturday night. Due to her critical state she was immediately taken to the operating theatre where Dr Mamun of the clinic performed the operation to deliver a boy, the victim's cousin Md Mohsin Mollik said.

Brishti died around 5:00am, Mohsin said claiming that it was due to the 'wrong treatment' given to her. The baby, her first-born, is still alive and stable.

Md Imam Hossain, managing director (MD) of the clinic, however, denied any negligence on the doctor's part.

"The patient was suffering from internal problems. She died due to the complexity of her condition," he said.

Subhan, his aides killed 3 in Pabna

Freedom fighter testifies, says Jamaat men operated torture cell at Ishwardi in 1971

A prosecution witness yesterday testified that he had seen Jamaat-e-Islami leader Abdus Subhan and his cohorts stab three people to death in Ishwardi during the Liberation War.

Fazlur Rahman Fantu, a freedom fighter from Ishwardi in Pabna, said Jamaat men operated a torture cell in Ishwardi and Subhan used to visit the cell.

The lists of pro-liberation people were prepared at the cell and decisions were also taken there before killing them, he added. Earlier, ATM Shahiduzzaman Nasim and



92 indigenous people return from border

At least 92 indigenous people, who took shelter in noman's-land of Naraichhari border in the last week of May, returned home to Naraichhari Bazar in the district's Dighinala upazila on Saturday.

Lt Col Jahangir Hossain, commanding officer of 20 Border Guard Bangladesh (BGB) Battalion, said they had gone there as political tension was running high between the United People's Democratic Front (UPDF) and Parbatya Chattagram Jana Sanghati Samity (PCJSS).

Masud Karim, deputy commissioner of Khagrachhari, said the indigenous people were brought back after verification was done by the Indian Border Security Force (BSF).

On Friday, a battalion-level flag meeting between the BGB and BSF was held along Naraichhari border where the list of the 92 people was handed over to the BGB.

Jahangir Hossain of the BGB and Baghwan Singh, commanding officer of 88 BSF Battalion, were present at the meeting.


