

Egypt envoy assures

will restore political stability and spur economic development of Egypt. "It's the victory of the people...you may call it the victory of secular force," the envoy said adding, "It's a landslide victory as 96.91 percent of the valid voters cast votes for Sissi."

Ambassador Ezzat said initially the president was reluctant for the presidential election but the people, who love his leadership, pressurised him to run for the election.

Sissi will try his best to stop terrorism in Egypt, he added.

About repression on "Islamic Brotherhood" in Egypt, the ambassador used "Brotherhood" instead of "Islamic Brotherhood" as he believes that a Muslim cannot kill another Muslim.

He said Sissi will now arrange election very soon to elect a new parliament and make way for restoring political stability and economic development of Egypt.

Replying to a question, the envoy said Khaleda Zia boycotted the January 5 poll in Bangladesh and it was completely her decision. The ambassador also termed the poll as "free and transparent".

In reply to another question, he said Hasina already sent a letter of congratulation to Sissi on his victory before he was sworn in.

11 doctors sacked

Rather, the minister said some doctors were transferred to different places as punishment.

Nasim said some 650 doctors were now working in various upazila hospitals across the country. "The doctors must stay in districts and upazilas for three years after getting appointment. Those who stay there will be transferred to good places later."

Besides, he said, doctors who will stay in village hospitals will get incentives and other benefits including vehicles. "Those doctors will also get promotion quickly," he added.

The health minister said appointment of 6,521 more doctors was now under process, as they had already qualified in the Bangladesh Civil Service examinations. "When new doctors will be appointed after completion of police verification, the crisis of doctors will go within a month or two."

Nasim demanded that the finance minister increase budgetary allocation for the health sector. Doctors in government hospitals work under huge pressure as each has to visit 100/200 patients daily.

However, on May 27, Mohiuddin at a press briefing on the land claimed that they gave compensation to the affected persons before conducting the eviction drive.

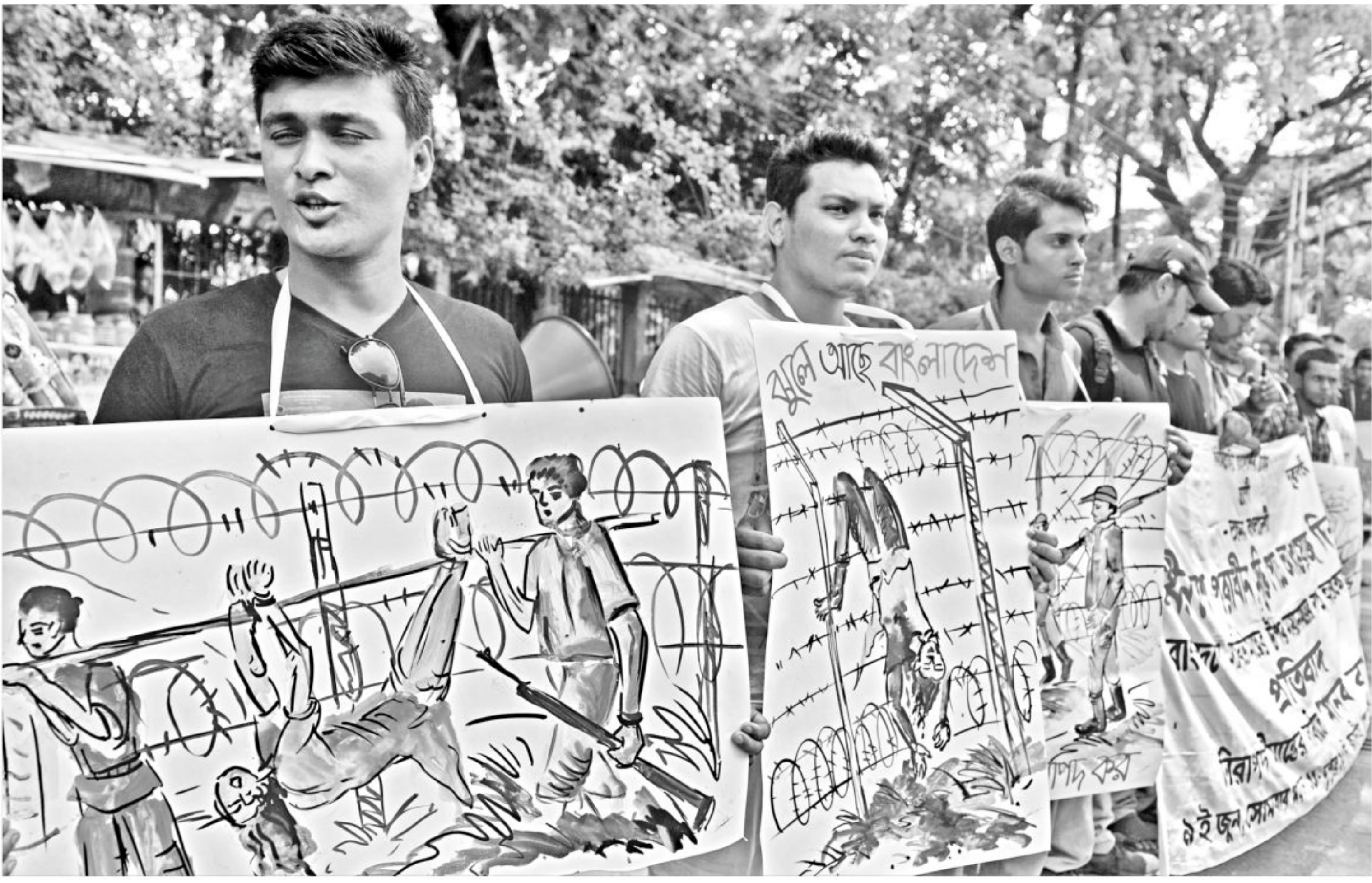

Birsa Munda's anniversary

Godagari Upazila Parishad auditorium in Rajshahi yesterday.

Around 400 indigenous people from 26 villages of Godagari attended the programme.

The speakers discussed the life of Birsa Munda and the present situation of indigenous people in Bangladesh.

The then British ruler tortured him for leading Indigenous people's movement against religious aggression that later played a role in the Indian independence movement, they said.

Birsa Munda, a tribal freedom fighter, was arrested by the then British ruler on March 3 in 1900 in Jamkopai forest of Chakradharpur, India. He died in Ranchi

Jail on June 9 the same year.

The speakers called upon the indigenous people to obtain education for building their own capacities to safeguard their religious and cultural heritage as some vested quarters were out to ruin those.

They alleged that a section of influential people were involved in grabbing the land and properties of indigenous people.

They said the sacrifice of Birsa Munda would inspire the indigenous people to stand against such misdeeds.

Sontosh Ekka, chief of a Rokkhaola Gram Samaj Sangathan, presided over the discussion that was moderated by Centre for Capacity Building of Voluntary Organisation's programme coordinator Abu Ahsan Shelly.

choosing violent politics and instigating militancy and have to shun politics of confrontation. "Talks must be held in accordance with the constitution and keeping faith in the spirit of the liberation war."

At a separate programme at AL President Sheikh Hasina's Dhanmondi office, Hanif said no situation had been created in the country that required dialogue. He, however, said AL always believed in talks.

"The people are not thinking about any midterm election at this moment, and it is not the right time to talk about the next parliamentary polls," he added. Hanif also requested foreign friends not to meddle in the country's internal issues.

At another programme at Jatiya Press

Club, Hasan Mahmud said his party had wanted dialogue before the January 5 national election, but Khaleda Zia then ridiculed that invitation and gave a 48-hour ultimatum to the government to step down.

"The next national election will be held in time in accordance with the constitutional provisions. There is no possibility of holding the national polls before 2019." So, there is no scope for talks on polls before 2019, Hasan continued.

Calling upon the BNP chief to apologise for her confrontational politics and celebrating birthday on August 15, the day Sheikh Mujibur Rahman was assassinated in 1975, Hasan said if Khaleda apologised, talks were possible on various important national issues.
