CHEMICAL-TAINTED MANGO

Supply falls as govt set to start drive

The supply of mango to the capital has sharply come down ahead of the government drive to check consignments of the summer fruit for formalin.

Many traders at Karwan Bazar and Mohammadpur yesterday said the supply has almost halved over the last two days. It would drop further from today as government teams start inspecting trucks of mango at eight entry points of the capital.

"Usually, we get four to five truckloads of mango every night. But tonight not a single truck is coming to my store," said Md Parvez, manager of a wholesale centre at Karwan Bazar, yesterday.

According to some wholesalers, orchard owners fear police might destroy their fruits as they use four to five types of chemicals in different phases of fruit growth.

ASM Mahbubul Alam alias Haji Babul, president of Karwan Bazar wholesale fruit market, said fruit growers use chemicals, which include insecticides and ripening hormones, though they had been asked not to.

Asked about the supply, he said around 500 tonnes of mango arrive at

Armed criminals impersonating detectives took Tk 28 lakh from two agents of bKash, a mobile money transfer service provider, in Jhalakathi yesterday.

Police said Kabir Ahmed and Rubel Mridha were going to Rajapur and Kathalia upazilas from Jhalakathi on a motorbike to the give money to bKash distributors there.

When they reached Satarkanda area on Barisal-Khulna highway, a group of seven people identifying themselves as policemen from the Detective Branch stopped their bike.

Militants seize Iraqi city Mosul

Free 1,000 people in prison break

Hundreds of gunmen took control of key sections of the northern Iraqi city of Mosul yesterday, forcing local police and army forces to abandon their posts and dealing a serious blow to Baghdad's efforts to control a widening insurgency in the country.

Prime Minister Nouri al-Maliki asked parliament to declare a state of emergency.

According to police, fighters from the Islamic State of Iraq and Syria (Isis), an al-Qaeda splinter group, freed up to 1,000 inmates from the central prison and took control of Mosul airport, local TV stations and the governor's offices.

The insurgents seized the government complex — a key symbol of state authority — late yesterday, following days of fighting in the country's

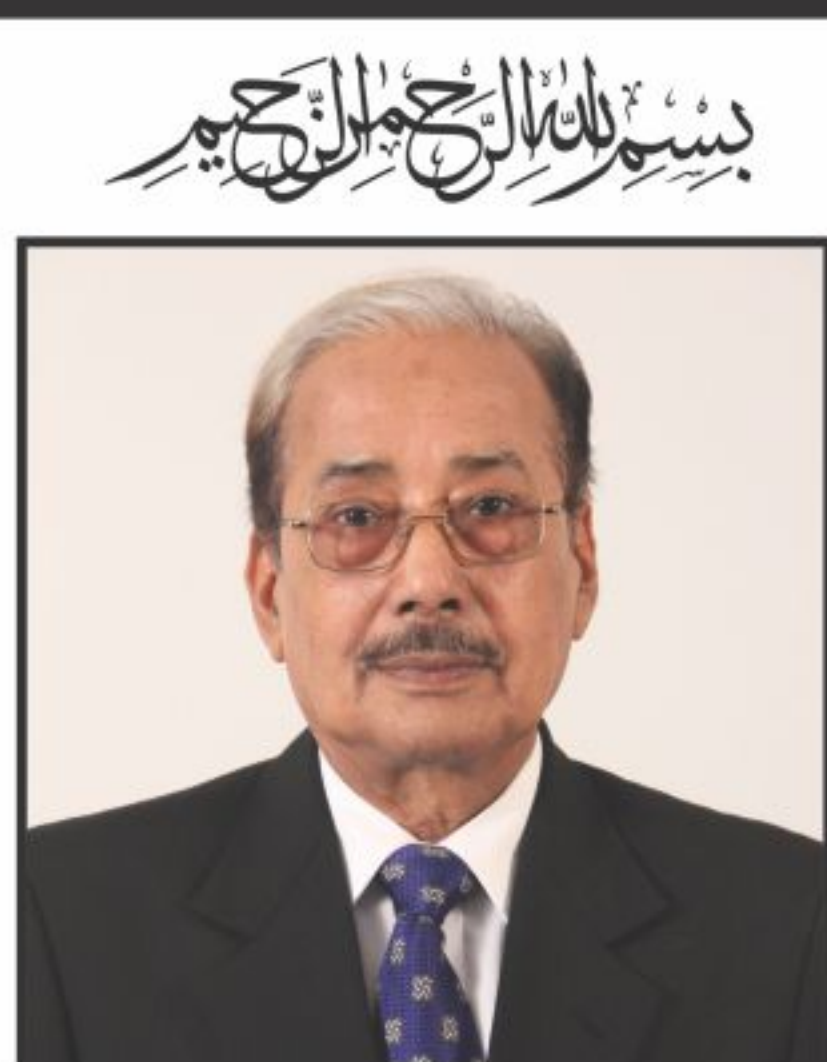
