DISEASES CAUSED BY ARSENIC

# 43,000 die annually in Bangladesh: Study

About 43,000 to 56,000 people die annually in Bangladesh from diseases caused by arsenic, a poisonous chemical that contaminates groundwater mostly in the southern parts of the country, says a study.

Also, some 0.5 percent of the GDP is lost due to this, according to the study on arsenic contamination in Bangladesh jointly conducted by the Department of Geology, Dhaka University, and Columbia University, USA.

Tests of 50,000 tubewells in Araihazar upazila of Narayanganj revealed that water of 48 percent of the tubewells are contaminated with arsenic. This rate is 25 percent all over Bangladesh, said Dr Kazi Matin Ahmed, geology professor of Dhaka University.

He presented the paper at a seminar titled "Arsenic Activities, Research and Outcomes" organised by the Bangladesh Medical Research Council (BMRC) in its auditorium in the capital yesterday.

Matin said the World Health Organization's acceptable level of arsenic in water was 10 ppb (parts per billion), but in Bangladesh the contamination level was 50 ppb.

He said estimated 35 million people in Bangladesh were exposed to more than 10 ppb arsenic, 22 million to 50 ppb arsenic and 5.6 billion were exposed to over 200 ppb arsenic, which caused 18 types of diseases, including lung, skin and bladder cancer, ischemic heart diseases and skin lesions.

# Jan 5 JS polls held to thwart illegal takeover

Says attorney general

Attorney General Mahbubey Alam yesterday told the High Court that the 10th parliamentary election was held to prevent any unconstitutional power from entering the country's political scenario.

He was placing arguments before the HC during hearing on two writ petitions filed challenging the legality of Article 19 of Representation of the People Order (RPO) that allows the Election Commission to declare a contender elected uncontested, and seeking a "no vote" provision in the elec-

In the election held on January 5, 153 candidates out of 300 were elected uncontested.

The attorney general said candidates have been elected uncontested in many countries of the world in accordance with the law.

Citing examples, he mentioned former US presidents George Washington and James Monroe, both of who were elected unopposed.

Mahbubey Alam furthermore said the HC cannot dictate the parliament to make any law incorporating a "no vote" provision. He prayed to the court to reject the writ petitions, saying

that the petitions were not acceptable.

#### Barisal by-poll saw huge rigging: EWG STAFF CORRESPONDENT

Sunday's by-poll to Barisal-5 constituency, which was won by the ruling Awami League candidate by vast margin, witnessed huge ballot box stuffing, an election monitoring group said yesterday.

Although the Election Working Group did not name the offenders, local journalists reported that the supporters of only Jebunnesa Afroz, the AL candidate, were on the field on the voting day.

Her lone rival, Bangladesh Nationalist Front's Saiful Islam Liton, was out of contact three or four days before the voting day and none of his polling agents or supporters was seen on Sunday.

"The average voter turnout in the polling stations observed was 53.7 percent. However, the EWG holds that this figure does not reflect the actual turnout due to incidence of ballot box stuffing," said a report of the EWG, a network of 29 civil society bodies.
