## Sheikh Jamal beat Feni in goal fest

A treble from Sony Norde put Sheikh Jamal DC back on track in the Nitol Tata Bangladesh Premier League as the league leaders handed a thrilling 5-3 defeat to Feni Soccer Club at the Bangabandhu National Stadium yesterday. Smarting from their first defeat of the league

against Brothers Union in the previous match, Sheikh Jamal put on a strong performance that resulted in relegation-threatened Feni conceding the season-highest five goals in a single match though they fought hard to net three of their own - also the highest

number of goals scored by Feni in this season's league. Sony struck one of the fastest goals ever of the league with a low drive within 25 seconds to his compatriot Wedson Anselme doubled the lead in the 8th minute.

In the first half, Sheikh Jamal struck three more goals through Sony, Wedson Anselme and Emeka Darlington and Feni Soccer also responded well to reduce the margin twice through Gambian Kabba Jobe and Nigerian Chuka Charles.

Sony completed his first hat-trick of the season eight minutes into the second half with a spectacular low drive outside of the box before Kabba again reduced the arrears to 5-3 in the 55th minute.

Feni Soccer then put huge pressure on Sheikh Jamal, who were forced to strengthen their backline, which looked vulnerable without suspended stopper Nasir Chowdhury. Feni however failed to snatch a point from the giants as their forwards squandered chances.

Sheikh Jamal now have 48 points from 21 matches, 10 ahead of second-placed Abahani while Feni remain on 13 points from 21 matches in ninth position.

Away at the MA Aziz Stadium, Chittagong Abahani beat Uttar Baridhara 1-0 to leapfrog to eighth position with 16 points from 21 matches, four points ahead of their bottomplaced opponents.

### SL win series after last-over drama

Sri Lanka beat England by 100 runs, with just one ball to spare, to win the second Test at Headingley on Tuesday and so take the twomatch series 1-0.

There were more than 20 overs remaining when last man James Anderson came into bat.

But he survived for 55 balls until, with only one delivery left in the match, he gloved a catch off paceman Shaminda Eranga to Rangana Herath at leg gully. Defeat was tough on England's Moeen Ali who batted for six-and-a-half hours

while making 108 not out -- his maiden Test century. England, set 350 for victory, were bowled out for 249 on the fifth and final day as Sri Lanka won a Test in England for only the third time in their history following victories at The

Oval in 1998 and Trent Bridge in 2006. England had been in charge of this match at 311 for for three after tea on the second day of this Test, thanks to Australia-born opener Sam Robson's maiden Test century, and again when they reduced Sri Lanka to 277 for seven on Monday -- a lead of just 169.

But Sri Lanka captain Angelo Mathews, who earlier in this match took a Test-best four for 44 with the ball, went on to make a superb Test-best 160, having shared an eighthwicket stand of 149 with Herath (48) that gave the tourists the advantage. England then suffered a spectacular collapse late Monday as they slumped to 57 for five in the face of paceman Dhammika Prasad's four-wicket burst.

Millions of viewers thought the assistant referee had made the wrong call because during the replay FIFA TV showed the offside line from the position of a Cameroon player and not the Brazil striker. Fred was behind the ball when the ball was crossed by David Luiz and the goal rightly stood.

Niclas Ericson, the Director of FIFA TV, acknowledged the error and promised that FIFA would do everything to ensure its production team did not make the same mistake again.

### Rafa, Roger on course

World number one Rafael Nadal buried the first round misery of his 2013 Wimbledon on Tuesday to set up a rematch with Lukas Rosol, the Czech who condemned him to a humiliating second round exit in 2012.

Second seed Nadal, fresh from his ninth French Open triumph and bidding for a 15th Grand Slam title, became only the 11th man to record 700 tour wins as he came back from a set down to beat Slovakia's world number 51 Martin Klizan, 4-6, 6-3, 6-3, 6-3.

Also going through on Tuesday were fellow past champions, seven-time winner Roger Federer, Serena Williams and Maria Sharapova whose breakthrough title in London came as a 17-year-old back in 2004. Federer began his campaign for an eighth title with a 6-1, 6-1, 6-3 victory over Paolo Lorenzi, the hapless Italian who has now lost all of his 13 Grand Slam matches.

Federer's compatriot, Australian Open winner Stan Wawrinka also reached the second round with a first win at the tournament since 2011. Wawrinka fired 18 aces and 39 winners in a 6-3, 6-4, 6-3 win over Portugal's Joao Sousa and next meets Taiwan's Lu Yen-Hsun.

French Open champion Sharapova raced to a 6-1, 6-0 rout of British wild card Samantha Murray, the world number 247. Top seed Williams needed only 61 minutes on Centre Court to ease past fellow American Anna Tatishvili 6-1, 6-2, firing 31 winners and 16 aces.

Germany's Sabine Lisicki defeated Israel's Julia Glushko 6-2, 6-1 in just 57 minutes while Polish fourth seed Agnieszka Radwanska beat Romania's Andreea Mitu 6-2, 6-1 but seventhseeded Jelena Jankovic was knocked out, losing 6-3, 6-2 to two-time quarter-finalist
