Turag close to death

'Grabbers' claim to have lands in the river

Strangled by land grabbers, the once mighty Turag river, fondly called Kahar Daria in yester years, now virtually lies on its death bed.

People, from nursery owners and sand traders to industrialists and businessmen, are extensively filling up the river and erecting structures as if it was there for them to grab. "We used to fish and bathe in the clear water of this river


in our childhood, when it was wide and mighty," an elderly Ansar Hossain of Tongi told this correspondent during one of his recent visits.

But today, the river is nothing more than an ailing lean flow with powerful land grabbers choking it ruthlessly from both the sides, he said.

The 38km river stretching from Kholamora to Teramukh across Tongi has been shrunk to virtually a stream under the very nose of the district administration, Bangladesh Inland Water Transport Authority (BIWTA), Rajdhani Unnayan Kartripakkha, Department of Environment and police.

During a number of visits in recent weeks, this correspondent found the river being massively filled up near Birulia Bridge, Dhour Bridge, Protyasha Bridge, Kamarpara Bridge

and at scores of other sites along Tongi-Ashulia Link Road. Land grabbers have been driving death nails into the Turag's existence over the past three years as the district

'Criminal' killed

A suspected criminal was killed in a "gunfight" with the Detective Branch of police in the capital's Khilgaon early yesterday.

in city 'gunfight' US firm for revised deal

5-7tcf prospect with only 17pc chance of success; \$3-5b investment required

American company ConocoPhillips has found a prospect of 5-7 trillion cubic feet gas reserve deep in the Bay of Bengal, but its existing production sharing contract (PSC) with the government does not give it enough incentive to confirm discovery and supply of the gas.

It would take \$3-5 billion investment to confirm and develop the gas prospect at site 350 kilometres off the Chittagong coast.

The PSC signed in 2008 does not justify taking so much financial and technological risk for ConocoPhillips to drill a well 1.5 km underwater, develop the field and deliver the gas in Chittagong by installing a long and tough pipeline, says a competent Petrobangla source.

There is only 17 percent chance of actually finding oil or gas in this prospective site that was identified through seismic surveys in deep sea blocks 10 and 11.

Gaza death toll 105

Obama phones offering to broker ceasefire but Netanyahu vows more air strikes

Israel's aerial bombardment of Gaza claimed its 105th Palestinian life yesterday as Hamas pounded central Israel with rockets and Washington offered to help broker a truce.

Diplomatic efforts to end the hostilities between Israel and Hamas militants gathered pace, with US President Barack Obama phoning Israeli Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu.

"The United States remains prepared to facilitate a cessation of hostilities," the White House said.

But Netanyahu remained resolute, saying he would not end his campaign until he achieved his goal of stopping the Hamas fire, reports AFP. "No international pressure will prevent us from striking the terrorists

who are attacking us," he told a news conference in Tel Aviv.

Germany captain Philipp Lahm and forward Thomas Mueller sounded supremely confident on Friday that their team will be able to neutralize Argentina's Lionel Messi and win the World Cup on Sunday.

Sounding at times as if they had already won the match, the two players told reporters at their team base that Germany have more talent, more experience, an extra day's rest and more than enough confidence to beat Argentina the way they did in the 1990 final and the quarter-finals in 2006 and 2010.

"We're here to win the World Cup," said Lahm. "We all enjoyed watching the [Argentina-Netherlands] semifinal on TV and it didn't matter to us at all who we'd play in the final."
