## Israel widens Gaza assault

Death toll hits 135; UN Security Council calls for ceasefire

Israel widened its air assault against the Gaza Strip's Hamas rulers yesterday, hitting a mosque, Hamas-affiliated charities and an Islamic home for the disabled, as Palestinians said the death toll from the five-day offensive rose to 135. While Israel vowed to press forward with its 5-day-old

campaign, it found itself facing growing international calls to stop. In New York, the UN Security Council unanimously

called for a cease-fire, while Britain's foreign minister said he would be discussing cease-fire efforts with his American, French and German counterparts yesterday.

# Continents collide

A Germany side chasing a place in history will attempt to wreck Lionel Messi's dream of a World Cup coronation with Argentina on Sunday as the month-long football carnival hits a climax at the Maracana Stadium.

The 64th game of one of the best World Cups of all time pits Europe against South America -- a duel between two football superpowers in one of the sport's most evocative arenas.

Germany are attempting to become the first side from Europe to win a World Cup in the Americas,

determined that a golden generation will finally gets it reward after a string of near-misses.

triumph which will silence forever the remaining critics who argue that the absence of a World Cup title precludes him from a place alongside Diego Maradona in football's pantheon.

The momentum is firmly with Klose. Germany after their astonishing 7-1 semifinal demolition job of Brazil, through a combination of superb attacking play and defensive incompetence.

Ominously for Argentina, Germany say they quickly put the win

firmly in the rear-view mirror.

All German eyes are now on the historic Maracana and a chance to Messi, meanwhile, is seeking the claim the ultimate prize after losing in either the final or the semifinals in their last four major tournaments.

"We enjoyed the game against Brazil, but we ticked it off after 24 hours," said Germany striker Miroslav

That same steely determination has characterised Germany's road to Rio, notably in coming from behind to snatch a 2-2 draw with Ghana in Group G and outlasting an awkward Algerian challenge in the last 16.

## No solace for Brazil

Hosts finish fourth after losing 0-3 against Netherlands

Brazil's traumatic World Cup ended with more pain on Saturday as they lost 3-0 to a superior Netherlands side in the third-place play-off at the Mane Garrincha National Stadium in Brasilia.

Still struggling to digest their record-breaking 7-1 loss to Germany in the semi-finals, Brazil had a similarly disastrous start against the Dutch, with Robin van Persie opening the scoring from the penalty spot inside three minutes.

With injured star Neymar watching on from the bench, Daley Blind then capitalised on more calamitous defending to make it 2-0 with 17 minutes played, and Georginio SEE PAGE 9 COL 1

### Two killed in Drive must focus on roots

Concerned at food adulteration, experts at BSRM-The Baily Star roundtable call for coordinated approach to ensure safe food for consumers

The government needs to clamp down on real culprits instead of chasing down petty traders in its drive against adulterated and contaminated food, experts and civil society members said yesterday.

Scattered initiatives against food contaminators will not help the government achieve its long term objec-

tive of safe food, they told a roundtable on "Harmful Chemicals in Food: Health Hazards."

Use of chemicals in food has become a serious concern in recent times. They suggested a coordinated approach involving the relevant government departments to ensure safe

BSRM, a top steel maker of the country, and The Daily Star jointly

organised the event at the Daily Star Centre in the capital.

"There is talk about food adulteration, but we see little action," said Dr Tahmeed Ahmed, director at the Centre for Nutrition and Food Safety of ICDDR,B.

Presenting the keynote paper, he said the authorities concerned had to go to the source of the problem.
