

Robert Downey Jr has been named as Hollywood's highest-paid actor for the second year in a row. The Forbes annual list put the Iron Man star on top with earnings totalling around \$75 million. The majority of the 49-year-old actor's pay -- between June 2013 and June 2014 -- came from his role in the latest film in the franchise, "Iron Man 3". The movie, which was released in May last year, made \$1.2 billion at the box office.

Former pro-wrestler Dwayne 'The Rock' Johnson has jumped from fifth to second place. The 42-year-old is estimated to have made \$52 million after starring in "GI Joe: Retaliation" and the "Fast and Furious" films. "Hangover" star Bradley Cooper placed third. Leonardo DiCaprio was ranked fourth after starring in two major films, "The Wolf of Wall Street" and "The Great Gatsby". Thor actor Chris Hemsworth completed the top five.

Promising Chittagong- based band Chhuti began its journey in 2004. The band was founded by front-man and rhythm guitarist Sukanta Chanda who began his music career in 2000. In his teens, Sukanta attended a number of major concerts by noted bands of Bangladesh, held at the Chittagong and CHT regions. From then, he dreamt of forming a band of his own.

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Born in Chittagong in 1984 to Doli Chanda and Swapan Chanda, Sukanta's childhood was spent in the heart of nature. His creative vision flourished through writing rhymes, poems and lyrics. He started learning

music when he was a student of class six.

"Music is the reflection of my pain and pathos. My father died in 1998; I was a class eight student back then. I would feel very lonely at that time. To avert that loneliness, inspired by my mother, I got involved with music seriously," said Sukanta

Sukanta was baptized in sargam lessons by Milon Majumdar. Later, he learnt classical music under the tutelage of Nirmalendu Chowdhury. He also took basic guitar lessons from Dipankar and further embellished his expertise in guitar by taking lessons from Pappu and late Sachchu.

Chhuti's forte focuses on

several genres -- mellow rock, patriotic and rock-classical fusion. An audio album featuring nine original tracks is in the pipeline. The unreleased tracks of the album include -- "Chhuti", "Nei Kichhu", "Mridu Chhondey Poth Chola", "Bhumi", "Bohudur" and "Achin Groher Achin Manush".

"I have written, composed and recorded the most songs while our band member late Sayeed lent his voice to a song besides playing the lead guitar for all the tracks. My friend Prabir also wrote a song 'Bohudur' for our album."

"The album will be released in the audio bazaar soon under the label of G-Series. Alongside performing songs on stage, we are

now busy with making music videos as well," said Sukanta.

The present line-up of the band is: Jiko Acharya (drums), Joytu Sharma (lead guitar), Bashudeb Rakshmit (bass guitar); Shiblu (keyboard), Rony (vocal) and Sukanta Chanda (vocal and rhythm guitar). Apart from performing their

songs, the band regularly performs English tracks by world famous bands and artistes including Queen, Eagles, Scorpions, Dream Theatre, Bryan Adams, Bon Jovi and Michael Jackson. Members of Chhuti also love to perform both English and Bangla tracks of noted Bangladeshi bands Miles, Warfaze and Shironamhin.

"Most Welcome-2" trailer released Social media abuzz in anticipation of Ananta's latest

For better or for worse, the Dhaka film audience cannot get enough of MA Jalil Ananta's films. Crowds have thronged the cinemas every time his films have been released, and come out entertained. So it's no surprise that the theatrical trailer of his latest film slated for releases this Eid, would create quite the stir. This film also being his first sequel (to the 2012 Film "Most Welcome") had been long-anticipated, and the trailer, that has seen nearly 20,000 views on YouTube in the first day since release, promises to be everything that an Ananta film is expected to deliver.

The trailer opens with Ananta -dressed in a police uniform -- bursting through a glass door, and proceeds to give a peek into the latest big-screen extravaganza of directorproducer-protagonist Ananta. Almost inevitably, there are overthe-top action sequences with lots of CGI-generated explosions, admirable cinematography and exquisite foreign locations where he romances his heroine (and real-life wife) Barsha. Unmistakably, Ananta is an honest, courageous, patriotic police officer who fights off the bad

guys after they target a Bangladeshi scientist who has invented the cure for cancer. The songs also spread across the spectrum from the mostcommercial item numbers to typical love songs and a soulful, emotional message-laden song sung by no less than Kailash Kher. The other central roles in the film have been played by Shoel Rana, PrabirMitra, Diti, Chompa, Kabila, Misha Showdagor and Elias Cobra.

Produced by Ananta's production house Monsoon Films, "Most Welcome-2" -- powered by Grameenphone -- promises to be the typical AJ (a nickname Ananta goes by) film, and judging by the response on the social media (Facebook and YouTube), it will perhaps generate just as much interest, if not more, than his last few films, when it comes out.
