Woman gang-raped in Sunamganj

Miscreants gang-raped a woman after beating up her husband at Kalarokh in Chhatak upazila of Sunamganj district early yesterday.

Chhatak police said some five criminals intercepted a passenger vehicle (tempo) carrying the couple.

They beat the man until he lost his consciousness and then took his wife to a school building and raped her. Later, locals admitted her to the one-stop crisis centre at Sylhet MAC Osmani Medical College Hospital.

Man drowns in Buriganga

A man drowned in the Buriganga river after he slipped and fell from a boarding plank of a launch at the capital's Sadarghat Launch Terminal on Tuesday.

Niaz Ahmed, 65, felt dizzy and fell down, said his son Ridwan Ahmed who was going to Chandpur with him to celebrate Eid.

Divers fished out the body after half an hour's effort, said fire service officials.

Medical student goes missing on Eid day in Gazipur

A second year student of Sylhet MAC Osmani Medical College went missing from Gazipur city on the day of Eid-ul-Fitr, Tuesday.

Missing Rahim Hossain Abir, 21, son of Mobarak Hossain, used to live on BIDC road in the city.

His family said Abir went out after having a call from his friend Sadid and since then his phone had been switched off.

Joydevpur police quizzed his local friends Sadid, Shawon, Siam, Abir and Rakibul. A general diary was filed.

Mob beats youth to death in Tongi

A youth, aged about 35, was beaten to death at Maddha in Arichpur of Gazipur's Tongi by a mob which suspected him of theft on Thursday.

Tongi police said local people caught the unidentified youth, aged about 35, on Joybangla Road at Maddha Arichpur in Tongi.

He was declared dead at Tongi Hospital.

Police sent the body to Gazipur Sadar Hospital morgue for an autopsy.

SI Jahid tortured Sujan

Police informer tells magistrate that he was a witness; Jahid placed on fresh remand

An informer of Mirpur police yesterday confessed to a magistrate that he was with Sub-Inspector Jahidur Rahman Khan the night police picked up garment-waste trader Mahbubur Rahman Sujan who later died of torture.

"I also witnessed Sub-Inspector Jahid torturing Sujan at his (Sujan's) residence, then in the police van and later at the police station, but I did not torture the victim," Nasim Sheikh told Metropolitan Magistrate Ashoke Kumar Bishwas at his chamber.

Meanwhile, a Dhaka court yesterday placed Jahid on a two-day fresh remand in

connection with the death of Sujan.

In his statement, Nasim said on July 13 a team of about seven to eight people, including five cops and Nasim, went to Sujan's residence and picked him up.

They also picked up Jahid's wife Momtaz Sultana Lucy and their five-year-old son Rabbi when Sujan refused to pay extortion money. Sujan was tortured at his house, in the police van and at the police station, said Nasim.

Nasim said the next day one of the cops informed him that Sujan died.

After recording his statement, the magistrate ordered Nasim to be sent to jail.

Five killed in capital in last four days

At least five people were killed in the capital during Eid vacation in last four days.

Yesterday, unidentified criminals strangled an Ansar member to death at Kamalapur Inland Container Depot (ICD).

Imdadul Haque, 20, of Mymensingh, was found dead in a nearby sewerage line while an almirah was also found broken,

said his colleagues.

Police sent the body to Dhaka Medical College morgue for an autopsy.

In Kamrangir Char area, a man allegedly killed his wife by slitting her throat in their Tekerhati residence, said police.

The deceased was Munni Begum, 28, wife of Sujon, a mason.

Post-Eid presence at offices thin in capital

Although government and semi-government offices, banks and other financial institutions opened yesterday after a three-day Eid-ul-Fitr vacation, the presence of employees was thin as many of them took an extra day leave ahead of Friday and Saturday, which are public holidays.

Dhaka city seemed deserted as many people who had left for villages before Eid were yet to return. The city is expected to return to its usual full Sunday, the next working day.

Turnout of staff at the Bangladesh Secretariat, the administrative hub of the country, was also very low. There was also little to no presence of visitors at the secretariat.

"This is a normal picture after an Eid holiday," said an official of the disaster management ministry. He said the full staff will join on Sunday.

Members of law enforcement agencies were seen guarding the gates and offices of the secretariat in a

Many Bangladeshis on Eid day joined protests condemning Israel's ongoing military offensive in Gaza which has so far killed more than 1,400 people, mostly children and women.

Residents of the capital's Rampura formed a human chain in front of Jatiya Press Club to denounce the Zionist state.

In Narayanganj, rights and green activists under the banner of Nirvik formed a rally at the Shaheed Minar in Charsa.

Protests were also held in Jhenidah and Barisal.

They described the atrocities, going on

Govt advises citizens not to travel to troubled Libya

The government has advised all Bangladeshi nationals not to travel to Libya until the situation in the North African country becomes stable.

In a press statement yesterday, the Ministry of Foreign Affairs said the government of Bangladesh is closely monitoring the evolving situation in Libya.

Libya has been in chaos since the death of Muammar Gaddafi in October 2011 following a war between his loyalists and rebels backed by the Americans, British and French and several Arab countries. At the latest, 35 five soldiers were killed in fighting before Islamist groups announced the capture of an army base in Benghazi Wednesday.

According to the latest reports, all Bangladeshi expatriates in Libya are safe and they have been advised to remain alert and avoid conflict zones. Many Bangladeshis have moved to safer areas, the foreign ministry said.

Bangladeshi youth falls to death in Paris

A Bangladeshi expatriate in France died at a hospital in Paris early Monday, hours after he was found lying beside his building.

Deceased Suman Das, 35, son of late Gauranga Das of Madaripur Sadar upazila, was a graduate of sociology from Dhaka University.

Quoting Suman's neighbours, his family said they got out of the five-storey building after hearing a noise and found Suman

Bangladesh, Bulgaria sign co-op deal

Bangladesh and Bulgaria have signed a deal on Foreign Office Consultations (FOC) to establish institutional cooperation between the two countries.

Bangladesh Ambassador to Turkey Zulfiqur Rahman, also envoy to Bulgaria, and Deputy Foreign Minister of Bulgaria Angel Velitchkov signed the Memorandum of Understanding on behalf of their respective governments in Sofia on July 30.

This is the first step taken between these two countries to initiate institutional cooperation, said a foreign ministry press release yesterday.

It would now allow regular consultations between Bangladesh and Bulgarian governments in all areas of cooperation, it added.

Speaking at the signing ceremony, Velitchkov said the two countries should work on in areas of trade, economic cooperation, cultural and technological cooperation
