# ASUS Transformer Book V

ASUS have always been the "ultra-light, thin and powerful" freaks. That might put the ideas they come up with in a rather small box but every now and then they do take a peek outside. At this year's Computex they surprised all tech enthusiasts by going beyond that. Transformer Book V is ASUS's way of saying, "Two heads are better than one". What makes it stand out among all others? Well, for starters, it's a device that can run both Android and Windows though it's not ASUS's first time marrying these two major operating systems. And despite what they unveiled months ago, this recent one became an instant hit. Why? Well I can find FIVE specific reasons: a Windows tablet, a Windows laptop, an Android phone, an Android tablet and oddly enough, an Android laptop.

What we have is, a 5 inch smartphone running Android KitKat 4.4, a Tablet running Windows 8.1 and

a keyboard dock that contains 1TB of storage and USB 2.0 and 3.0 ports. The smartphone has 64GB internal storage that you can extend to another 64GB with a micro SD. It has a 2GB RAM, 8 mega-pixel camera in the back and 2MP in the front and boasts an Intel quad-core Atom processor; with Intel HD Graphics and a 2500mAh battery. It also has a 720p display and Zen UI. On the other hand, the 12.5 inch tablet is powered by the next generation Intel core processor. Packed inside is a 4GB RAM, Intel HD Graphics, HD camera, 128GB storage and a 28Wh battery.

Spec wise both the devices look great but the spotlight falls on other features. First of all comes the keyboard dock, unlike its weak competitions this one doesn't connect to your tablet just as an external keyboard; rather it adds a storage of 1TB to it and two USB ports for further connectivity. Second of all, the smartphone can be docked at the

back of the tablet integrating seamlessly with it. Thus flawlessly converting the Windows 8.1 device into an Android device. With ASUS's PC link technology, the tablet can now switch between two OS with the press of a button. And when the keyboard is connected, the users get an Android laptop. Isn't that amazing? And to top it up, the keyboard has Bluetooth options which means you don't always have to attach it to the tablet to use it. Be it at home or office, one can sit back and work with the keyboard on his/her lap and the screen at a distance. This is truly an awesome device. Targeted towards everyday-computing, the ASUS Transformer Book V will make your bags and pockets lighter. The price may range between Tk. 40,000-45,000/-

# Huawei nearly doubling its shipment of Smartphones from last year

The worldwide smartphone market grew 23.1% year over year in the second quarter of 2014 (2Q14), establishing a new single quarter record of 295.3 million shipments, according to preliminary data from the International Data Corporation (IDC) Worldwide Quarterly Mobile Phone Tracker. Following a very strong first quarter, the market grew 2.6% sequentially, fueled by ongoing demand for mobile computing and an abundance of low-cost smartphones. Second quarter shipments were in line with IDC's forecast and all expectations are that the

market will continue apace in the second half of the year and surpassing 300 million units for the first time ever in a single quarter in 3Q14. Huawei's

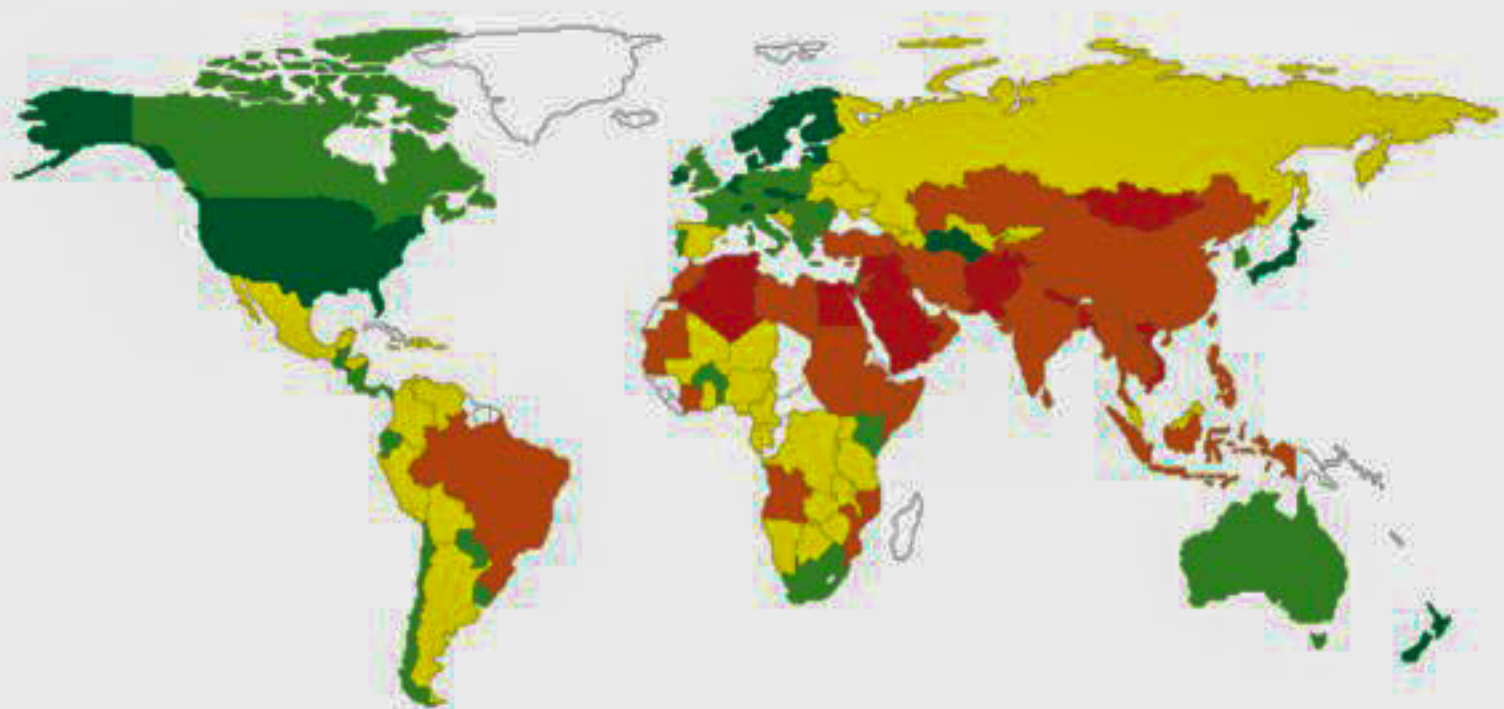
story centered on 4G LTE pick up, particularly in China, as all three national carriers subsidized 4G handsets like the P7 to encourage consumers to upgrade from 3G. Outside of China, large volumes of its lower-cost Y series

fueled growth across most regions. The company continues to focus on broadening its global reach and the 2Q14 results show that the momentum is undoubtedly there.

The Top 20 in this category continues to be dominated by countries in Africa, the Middle East, and South East Asia. Vietnam ranks first, as was the case in Q1 2014, while Mongolia remains in second. Nepal fell to seventh place. Saudi Arabia, Ethiopia, and Turkey are new entries in this ranking. Morocco, Myanmar and Sudan dropped out of the top 20.

An average of 32.8% of computers was subjected to at least one local threat during the past year.

# Lokkhi.io- A local service to keep you connected!

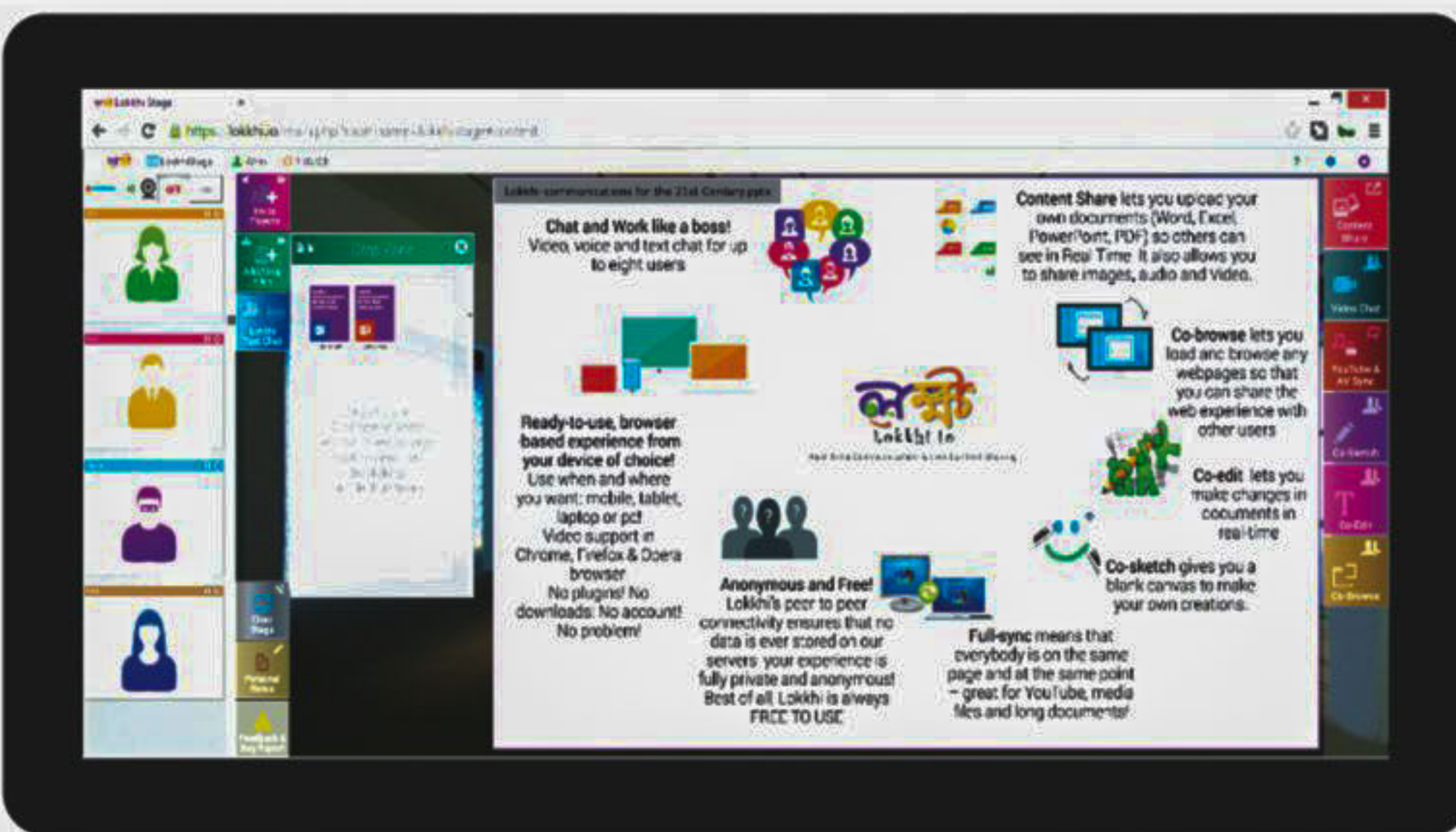

When asked about their future plans with Lokkhi, he stated "We are more interested in the social and educational applications of Lokkhi. We are already conducting online teaching sessions in several schools in Sylhet using Lokkhi." Lokkhi already has almost 16,000 users, with the majority of them in Bangladesh.

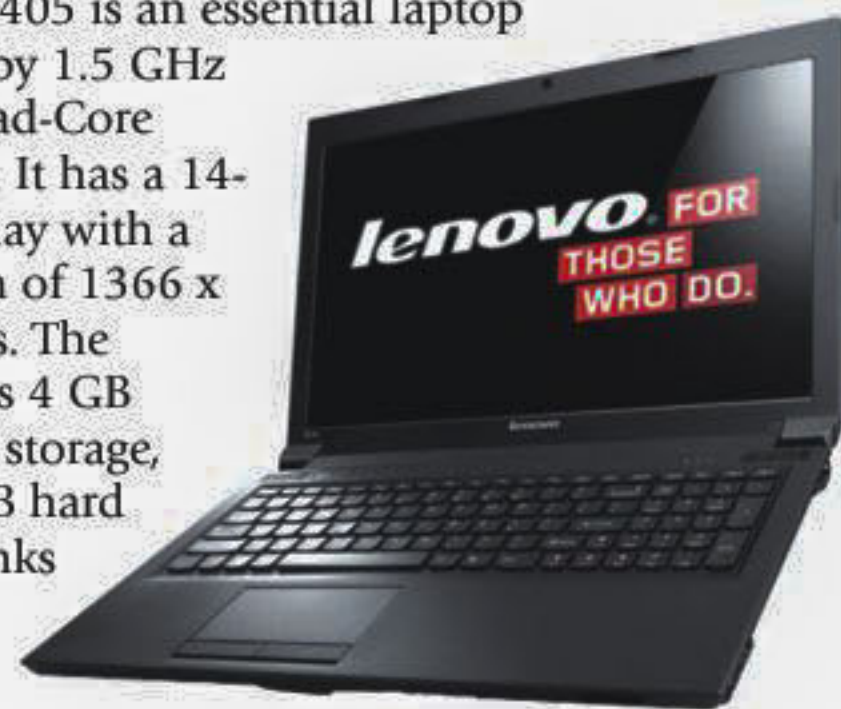
