"I was forcefully married off with the president of the school managing committee, who convinced my day labourer father in this regard", said the victim.

## 'Torture, killing' of Duranta protested

On Sunday last, Timir Baran Chakma alias Duranta, 52, son of Aungeo Chakma of Rangamati district Parbatya Chattagram Jana Sanghati Samity (M N Larma faction) was found dead after a drive by security personnel in Matiranga upazila of Khagrachhari district.

informed, security personnel raided Indumoni Karbari Para in Matiranga upazila early Sunday and arrested Duranta Babu Chakma along with his aides Nishi Moni Chakma, 40, Amar Kanti Chakma, 18 and Riyal Tripura, 34 from a hut in the area and seized a few military dresses and tol collecting receipts from their possession.

They said, Duranta 'Babu' was taken to Rubber Bagan area to recover arms but at one stage he tried to escape and jumped from the hill. Seriously injured, he was rushed to Matiranga Upazila Health Complex around 10:00am on Sunday where he succumbed to injures at noon. All the arrestees were activists of PCJSS MN Larma faction.

Contacted, officer incharge of Matiranga police station Mainuddin Khan said, as the body of the deceased had started to decompose, it was cremated at Muslimpara Crematorium in Khagrachhari district town in presence of Khagrachhari Municipality Mayor Rafiqul Islam on Sunday night on completion of autopsy.
