# BNP blasé about missing Sunamganj leader

Cops also sluggish

After Sunamganj BNP leader Mujibur Rahman disappeared along with his chauffeur three months ago, the party clamoured for a few days demanding of the government to find him immediately. But, all its local units are silent for more than a month now.

Sunamganj BNP last enforced a strike in four districts of the division on July 8.

Meanwhile, police have hardly made any headway in the search for Mujibur, a member of BNP's Sunamganj district convening committee, also the founder of the UK chapter of the party's youth wing Jatiyatabadi Jubo Dal.

Robiul Islam, husband of one of Mujibur's nieces, who filed a GD after he went missing on May 4, said, "We don't know the fate of the man. His family members still believe he'll come back anytime." Mujibur and his chauffeur Rezaul Haque

Sohel were headed towards Sylhet from Sunamganj on that day.

Police had arrested three local Jubo Dal activists in Sunamganj and three others as suspects in May but there was no clue to how and why they went missing.

## 6 RMG waste-laden trucks hijacked

Hijackers injure 5 people including journalist in Ashulia

Criminals on Thursday evening hijacked six trucks laden with waste fabrics of garment industry in Ashulia, and injured at least five people including a journalist who was taking photos of the hijacking.

However, they later abandoned three of the goods-laden trucks in Baipail area of Ashulia.

The injured journalist was Omar Faruque, staff correspondent of Banglanews24.com.

Police said the trucks were carrying jhut worth about Tk 8 lakh from Grameen Knit Wear Ltd in DEPZ area to a buyer, Siddikur Rahman, in Kabirpur. The criminals hijacked the vehicles in DEPZ area, and beat up some of the helpers and the journalist, who happened to be at the spot taking photos, said Faruque and witnesses.

# Activities disrupted for lack of two top judges

The trial proceedings in the Chittagong courts, which are already burdened with a huge backlog of cases, are being seriously hampered because of the two top posts of judges lying vacant there for more than one month.

AFM Mostafa retired as Chittagong district and sessions judge on June 11, and SM Mojibur Rahman as Chittagong metropolitan sessions judge on July 10, said prosecutors.

The two posts are among a total of 12 posts of judges lying vacant in 72 courts across Chittagong district. Of them, four vacancies are in the 21 metropolitan courts and eight in the remaining 51 courts of the district.

Court sources said that in absence of the judges, court activities came to a near halt, except for the renewal of the hearing dates. Moreover, the number of pending cases is mounting every day with the arrival of new cases, they said.

"The Chittagong courts now lack a guardian," said District Public Prosecutor (PP) Abul Hasem, referring to the absence

of the district judge. He told The Daily Star that the court activities slowed down and lacked coordination, since an additional judge was carrying out the additional duties of the district judge.

A total of 1.3 lakh cases are now pending at the district courts, while 20,096 cases are
