Justice so far away

98 of 491 witnesses testify till now

**21 AUGUST ATTACK**

Late president Zillur Rahman had sought justice, not mere sympathy, for the gruesome murder of his wife Ivy Rahman.

In an emotion-choked voice, he made this appeal at the quirkwani held three days after her death.

Ivy, a veteran politician and women affairs secretary of the Awami League, was critically injured in the August 21 grisly grenade attack on an AL rally in the capital. She succumbed to her injuries three days after the explosions.

Around four and a half years after Ivy's death, the AL rode to power in January 2009. The following month, the veteran AL leader, Zillur Rahman, was elected to the nation's presidency.

The changeover of power could not,

however, end his agonising wait for justice. President Zillur Rahman breathed his last in March last year, his appeal for justice yet to be fulfilled.

Thus it is that justice for the families of the victims of the grisly grenade attack remains a distant cry even a decade after the gruesome killings.

This is because of the dirty politics pursued by the then BNP-led government and, later, the snail's pace in the conduct of the trial of such a high profile case.

Since the beginning of the trial in 2008 and till yesterday, the court had recorded the statements of only 98 of 491 witnesses.

If statements of the remaining witnesses need to be recorded, one may easily foresee how much more time will be required for the job to be done.

Minutes after massacre

Mind still numb, heart bleeds at the way state-sponsored terror struck

Walking through the busy, rain-soaked Bangabandhu Avenue yesterday, it was almost impossible to picture what had happened here 10 years ago.

Behind this scene of the hawkers selling sugarcane juice, the shuttered up shops and those ochre painted buildings lies a terrible moment of tragedy when scores of grenades were showered on Awami League President

All AL wanted was to rally against militants

They had gathered there to raise their voices against blasts only to fall victim to the most gruesome terrorist attack in the history of Bangladesh.

Around 25,000 leaders and activists of the then main opposition Awami League had turned up at the party central office on Bangabandhu Avenue on that black Saturday to protest against a series of blasts in Sylhet that had killed several people.

AL chief Sheikh Hasina joined the rally on August 21, 2004, injecting vigour among party activists aggrieved by the killing of their comrades across the country, including lawmaker Ahsanullah Master earlier in May.

But it was beyond their worst nightmare that they themselves would come under an appalling attack on a political programme, which was organised to protest such acts of violence, and lose two dozen colleagues.

It was 5:22pm, that fateful moment, when a wave of grenades were hurled at the rally of Hasina, then leader of
