BRTC bus catches fire in capital

The fire might have originated from the over heated engine of the Uttara-bound bus, said fire service officials. Fire fighters doused the fire. No casualty was reported.

Man held with smuggled gold at Shahjalal airport

Customs officials detained a man and recovered 36 gold bars, worth Tk 2.2 crore and weighing 4.2kg, hidden in a water pump at Hazrat Shahjalal International Airport in the capital yesterday.

Following Alam's suspicious movement, the officials challenged him while he was crossing the green channel with the pump and recovered the bars.

On duty traffic cop dies in road crash in capital

An on duty traffic police constable was killed after being hit by a bus near Mohakhali Bus Terminal in the capital yesterday afternoon.

Mozaffar Hossain, 40, of Tongi in Gazipur, was attached to Uttara Traffic Zone in the capital, said Banani police Sub-inspector Abu Bakar Siddique.

A bus of Nirala Paribahan from Tangail knocked him down around 4:45pm, he said, adding that they seized the bus while the driver fled away.

GIRL HURT BY BOMB BLAST 13 Ctg Jamaat, Shibir men charged

After 16 months of investigation, police yesterday submitted charge sheets in three separate cases filed against 13 Jamaat-Shibir men over exploding a crude bomb in Chittagong city that injured schoolgirl Antu Barua during hartal hours last year.

ANM Mashrur Hossain, president of the city unit of Shibir; and Ferdous Koreshi, acting secretary general of Jamaat Chittagong district (south) unit, are among the accused.

On March 28, 2013, over 40 Jamaat-Shibir men equipped with sharp weapons and sticks gathered in the city's Momin Road area and blasted crude bombs, said the charge sheets.

It was the second day of a 36-hour nationwide hartal enforced by the erstwhile BNP-led 18-party alliance.

The alliance called for the shutdown demanding release of its activists arrested countrywide over

Twin baby stolen from DMCH

A newborn boy of a set of twins was stolen from Dhaka Medical College Hospital yesterday morning, just a day after his birth.

The mother, Runa Begum, of Mohammadpur, said a woman, aged around 45, who had been being friendly with her in the hospital, took the infant in her arms to soothe him when he was crying, and fled from the ward no-213, while she was feeding the other twin. Runa identified the thief from a CCTV footage of Wednesday, but the hospital did not have any footage of yesterday.

The father, Kawser Hossain, a security guard of an apartment building, blamed the hospital's mismanagement for the incident, saying the authorities did not take any immediate measure to rescue the baby. The authorities, however, filed a case.

FIELD EXPERIENCE OF JAN 5 NAT'L POLLS EC cancels hearing

The Election Commission has backpedalled on its decision to hear learning experiences of the field level officials who were engaged in the one-sided January 5 parliamentary election.

Although the EC did not give any official explanation for cancelling its experience sharing programmes, many officials of the EC Secretariat believe that the commission changed its decision to hold the programmes in fear of further criticisms of the January 5 poll.

"The commission does not want to bring the issue of the January 5 election in the limelight again. This is probably the main reason for cancelling the programmes," said a senior assistant secretary of the EC Secretariat seeking anonymity.

Music director Emon held for 'blackmailing wife'

Police arrested music director Shawkat Ali Emon in his house in the capital's Eskaton early yesterday following allegations against him of blackmailing his wife with uploading naked pictures of her on the internet.

A team of Ramna police raided his house shortly after midnight and detained him. Emon was produced before a Dhaka court, which sent him to jail.

Emon's wife had lodged a case on Monday accusing the 45-year-old director of taking nude pictures, and blackmailing her with them.

She claimed that he threatened to upload the photos on Facebook and other internet sites if she did not pay him Tk 5 crore.

Sub-inspector of Ramna Police Station Abul Kalam Azad said Emon refuted the allegations, but police found inconsistency in his statements during questioning.

MATERNITY, NEONATAL CARE Services reach less than half of seekers Study says

The country's existing health service providers can give only 41 percent of the care needed by infants and mothers.

As a result, majority of women's needs in reproductive, maternal and newborn health remain unmet which results in maternal and child deaths.

At present, only 32 percent of pregnant women are attended during birth by skilled birth attendants.

Illegal university campus shut down

A mobile court yesterday shut down an unauthorised campus of the Premier University of Technology in Rajshahi city.

Executive Magistrate Hafizur Rahman, who led the drive, said the University Grants Commission directed the district administration to shut down one of the two campuses of the university as it did not have approval from the commission.

The campus was housed on the third floor of a four-storey building in Bhadra area.

The court also seized two computers, furniture, some official documents and a huge number of pirated DVDs.

Hafizur Rahman said the campus began operation a year ago with 49 students and four part-time teachers.

Contacted, Vice Chancellor Prof MN Haque claimed the campus was running lawfully.
