Bangalees, Pakistanis could never remain parts of one country

PM's adviser Mashiur Rahman tells publication ceremony of 'Dusk, Dawn and Liberation', a novel on 1971

The difference in how Pakistanis and Bangalees looked at society showed that these two nations were never meant to be together, prime minister's economic affairs adviser Mashiur Rahman said yesterday, recalling the attitude of Pakistani politicians from his days as a bureaucrat in West Pakistan.

He was speaking at the launch of "Dusk, Dawn and Liberation", an English novel written by Masud Ahmed, the comptroller and auditor general of Bangladesh, at Dhaka Club.

Finance Minister AMA Muhith, the chief guest, reminisced about his struggle as a Bangalee officer facing up to the Pakistani rulers, many of whom appeared as historical characters in Ahmed's book.

Though literary critics including Prof Manzoorul Islam and Prof Fakrul Alam of Dhaka University praised the book published by England-based AuthorHouse UK Ltd for its fine blend of history and fiction, they recommended thorough proof-reading, better editing, and correction of some factual mistakes in the next editions.

Syed Badrul Ahsan, executive editor of The Daily Star, said, "1971 was and is a large canvas. Whenever you read a book on 1971, it reminds you of that time."

He, however, pointed out that the Liberation War of Bangladesh had hardly come up in Pakistani literature and

was not correctly depicted in Pakistani history books. Gowher Rizvi, international affairs adviser to the PM, was also present.


The group also assaulted two employees.
