

PATUAKHALI SCIENCE & TECHNOLOGY UNIVERSITY 67 students punished for unruly acts

Sixty-seven students of Patuakhali Science and Technology University (PSTU) have been punished for their involvement in clashes on the campus on July 5 and 6 this year. Registrar Md Nawab Ali issued letters to the punished students on Sunday. Of them, seven were expelled for two semesters, 30 from the residential halls and the rest were fined. The university authorities took the decisions on the reports of the disciplinary committee, the registrars said. Kamruzzaman Sohag,

president of the PSTU unit of Bangladesh Chhatra League (BCL) said the PSTU authorities have punished 29 students of M Keramot Ali Hall, 21 students of Sher-e-Bangla Hall-1, and 17 students of Sher-e-Bangla Hall-2. Seven students, expelled for two semesters, are Majedul Haque Khan, Kazi Jahidur Rahman Abir, Amjad Hossain Sajol, Salauddin, Sahiduzzaman Limon, Md Sohag and Rezzakul Hyder Rajib. Campus sources said the students were allegedly involved in clashes between Patuakhali group and Barisal group on the campus on the

rag day on July 5 and on July 6. Protesting the decisions of the university authorities, over 500 students of different departments took out a procession on the campus yesterday noon, demanding withdrawal of the expulsion orders against the students. They paraded the campus and then held a rally in front of the administrative building. Belal Hossain Rajib, president of BCL M Keramot Ali Hall unit and Rayhan Ahmed, publication secretary of the PSTU unit of BCL, addressed the rally. They urged the university authorities to withdraw the expulsion orders against 30 students.

Jamaat man held with bombs

20 others arrested in two districts

Police arrested a local leader of Jamaat-e-Islami along with four crude bombs from Uzirpur area in Shibganj upazila of Chapainawabganj on Sunday afternoon.

The arrestee was identified as Abdul Awal, ameer of Chhatrajitpur union unit of Jamaat and son of Elias Uddin, a resident of Chandipur village of the upazila, reports UNB.

Ashiqur Rahman, officer in-charge of Shibganj Police Station, said on secret information, a team of police raided the area and arrested Abdul Awal at about 12:45 pm and recovered the bombs from his possession. He was wanted in four cases, the OC added. A case was filed against Awal under the Explosive Substances Act. In Meherpur, two courts yesterday sent 19 leaders and activists of Jamaat-e-Islami to jail in two separate cases filed on January this year, reports our Kushtia correspondent.

Judge of Chief Judicial Magistrate Court Mahibul Hasan sent three Jamaat leaders to jail turning down their bail petition. They are assistant secretary general of Meherpur district Jamaat, also chairman of Buripota union parishad in Sadar upazila Abdur Rouf Mukul, district unit office secretary Abdul Jabbar and Sadar upazila unit ameer Ruhul Amin.

Besides, another judge of the same court, Matiur Rahman, sent 16 leaders and activists to jail. The leaders included Gangni upazila ameer Robiul Islam, nayebe ameer Nazmul Huda and Baitul Mal secretary Zillur Rahman.

According to court sources, the Jamaat leaders and activists were involvement in attack on law enforcers, setting polling centres on fire and other criminal activities during and before the January 5 national election.

In Moulvibazar, police yesterday afternoon arrested an upazila ameer of Jamaat-e-Islami from his residence at Bahadurpur village Juri upazila headquarters, reports our correspondent.

The arrestee is Md Abdur Rahman, 52, Juri upazila Jamaat ameer. Md Tofail Ahmed, SP in Moulvibazar, said acting on tip-off, a police team raided the Jamaat leader's houses while he along with other activists of the party were holding a 'secret' meeting at around 12:30pm.

Many Habiganj tea gardens opt for rubber farming

A large number of the total 24 tea gardens in Habiganj have stopped cultivating tea while many others are now cultivating rubber instead of tea.

Lack of interest in investment, weak management and adverse weather condition are leading the forex earning crop to ruination, said tea officials and other sources.

The tea gardens in Habiganj are managed by the government, foreign companies and private owners.

The 24 gardens are at Rema, Nalua, Parkul, Lalchand, Chandpur, Laskarpur, Satchhari, Amu, Chandichhara, Chaklapunji, Deundi and Sribari in Chunarughat upazila, Jagadishpur, Teliapara, Nayapara, Boikunthapur and Surma in Madhabpur upazila, Madhupur, Brindaban, Amtoli and Rashidpur in Bahubal upazila and

Imam and Bawani in Nabiganj upazila in the district.

According to sources in the district administration, about 34,494 hectares were leased for the gardens. However, tea is being cultivated on 18,402 hectares.

According to the government rules and agreement, the leased land must be used only for tea cultivation.

Tea cultivation is supposed to be expanded every year by 2.5 per cent on the total land. But the rule is being ignored by the lessees. On the contrary, rubber, paddy and other crops are being cultivated on the land meant for tea.

For example, Surma Tea Garden leased 4454.39 acres, but tea cultivation takes place only on 2,134 acres.

Contacted, manager of the tea garden MA Kashem said, they employed 2,200 workers in place of 1,200, for the purpose. But due to lack of proper investment and increased production

cost, tea cultivation was not increasing to their expectation.

At present, eight to nine lakh kilograms of tea are being produced which could easily be increased to more than 10 lakh kgs, he observed.

Deputy manager of Chandpur Tea Garden, Mr Azad, said they were cultivating rubber with approval from the authorities concerned and producing the item on its 47 hectares of land.

Similarly, many others were getting interested in rubber farming, sources said.

Rubber cultivation is going on in large scale in the district's Chakla, Lalchan, Teliapara and Surma areas, they said.

Contacted, Dr Moin Uddin Ahmed, deputy director of Bangladesh Tea Resource Institute, said they advised all the tea garden owners to stop rubber cultivation as it was against the policy and agreement.

Diarrhoea, skin diseases spreading in Sirajganj

Diarrhoea and skin diseases have started spreading in flood hit areas of Sirajganj district. At least 3,481 were infected with waterborne diseases in seven upazilas out of nine in Sirajganj district during the last three weeks from August 19.

Flood-hit people have been suffering from diarrhoea due to lack of pure drinking water, locals calleged.

At least 60 medical teams are working in the flood affected areas for giving treatment to the victims. They are also generating awareness to prevent flood related waterborne diseases, said Dr. Md. Shamsudin, Sirajganj Civil Surgeon.

The affected upazilas are Sirajganj Sadar, Kazipur, Shahzadpur, Belkuchi, Chowhali, Ullahpara and Tarash.

CS office sources said, with the recession of flood water, diarrhoea, skin diseases, eye infection and RTI diseases were spreading in the affected areas.

A total of 1332 people are now suffering from diarrhoea, 669 from skin diseases, 348 from eye infection, 688 with RTI, said Humayun Kabir, an official at CS office.

Kazipur is the worst hit upazila where at least 1300 people were infected with waterborne diseases during the period, he said. "As 12 unions of the upazila went under floodwater, the waterborne diseases spread here" Dr. Sushanta Kumar, Kazipur upazila health and family planning officer, told this correspondent.

Around 15 to 20 patients are being admitted to the upazila health complex the while others are given treatment by the medical teams in the affected areas, he said.

While visiting Kazipur upazila health complex yesterday, this correspondent found more than 38 patients taking treatment for flood related diseases. Most were admitted with diarrhoea, skin diseases and eye infection, hospital sources said.

Cattle trader found dead on border

A Bangladesh cattle trader was found dead on Madhya Singimari border of Singimari union in Hatibandha upazila yesterday.

Local people, with the help of Border Guard Bangladesh BGB men, recovered the body from a paddy field.

BGB and locals could not confirm the reason behind the killing.

The cattle trader was identified as Aminur Rahman, 43, son of Zakhir Uddin of Madhya Singimari border village. Family members said, Aminur went out of home for bringing Indian cattle on Sunday night. He had been doing the trade of Indian cattle long, they said.

He might have been murdered by other cattle traders over their previous feud in cattle trading, they added. However, locals suspected that the cattle trader was tortured to death by the Indian Border Security Force (BSF) and dumped on the zero line of the border. We have already sent a letter to Indian BSF at Fulbari camp of Shitalkuchi camp in Coochbihar district for a flag meeting in this regard, said Singimari BGB sources.

Injured Azad dies, no arrest yet

A local leader of Jatiyatadabi Chhatra Dal (JCD), who was injured in an attack allegedly by a gang of BCL men at Gafargaon Station Road on Sunday, died at Mymensingh Medical College Hospital yesterday.

The deceased was identified as Ibne Azad alias Kamol, 24, general secretary of JCD's Gafargaon Municipal unit.

Police and local sources said, Ibne Azad was returning to his home in Jamtola area of Gafargaon upazila headquarters from a shop at Station Road around

2.30pm on Sunday.

All of a sudden, a group of 15/20 Bangladesh Chhatra League (BCL) men, allegedly led by Shahabul and Biplob, swooped on Azad with hockey sticks and iron rods and beat him up indis-

criminatedly in the leg, hand, chest and head, leaving him critically injured.

Hearing the screams of Azad, local people rushed to the spot and took him to Gafargaon Upazila Health Complex. As his condition deteriorated, he was shifted to MMCH Sunday afternoon where he died around 12.30pm yesterday.

Contacted, Md. Khalilur Rahman, officer in-charge (investigation) at Gafargaon Police Station, said police were aware about the incident but no complaint was lodged.

Without any written

complaint we cannot take any action, said the police official, adding "receiving complaint, we would definitely go for legal action against the culprits".

President of JCD Gafargaon upazila unit Mahibur Rahman Nasim alleged that they informed police soon after the incident but the law enforcers did not take any step against the killers they are still moving 'scot-free' in the area, said.

However, Mehdi Hasan Shamim, president of BCL Gafargaon upazila unit, denied any involvement of BCL in the incident.
