Bombs hurled, gunshot fired; 5 Shibir activists among 20 held

At least 15 Chittagong University teachers were injured when activists of Islami Chhatra Shibir attacked two university buses with guns and crude bombs at Chharahpul of Hathazari upazila yesterday.

Eight of them were admitted to Chittagong Medical College Hospital while the others received first aid from the university's medical centre, said university Proctor Siraj-ud-Daula.

that it was under temporary suspension by the World Bank for alleged wrongdoing.


