

# Land grabbers this time attack Dhudu's wife, mother

Wife and mother of Dhudu Soren, who was stabbed to death by a gang of land grabbers in Nawabganj upazila of the district on August 2 this year, came under attack by the same gang yesterday.

The victims are Phulmoni Mardi, 42, and her mother-in-law Surujmoni Mardi, 68. The incident took place at Hili Dangapara Bazar where Dhudu Soren was murdered.

Witnesses said, a gang of land grabbers led by Md. Sabuj Mia, 30, son of Md Gulzar Ali of Kachua village in the upazila swooped on Phulmoni Mardi and Surujmoni Mardi at the bazar where they went to but basic commodities at around 8:30am. The gang beat up the duo and left the scene.

Locals took them to Nawabganj Upazila Health Complex where they received treatment. The incident triggered panic among the indigenous people in the upazila.

Contacted, Officer-in-Charge (OC) Amirul Islam of Nawabganj Police Station said no case

was filed in connection with the incident as of 5:00pm yesterday. Robi Soren, the eldest son of slain Dhudu Soren, said they will lodge a case against the attackers in a day or two

He alleged that members of the same gang, who killed his father on August 2, physically assaulted his mother and grandmother.

The indigenous people of the upazila formed a human chain at Hili Dangapara Bazar yesterday afternoon, demanding arrest of those who attacked Phulmoni Mardi and Surujmoni Mardi on Monday.

Over 1,000 people joined the programme that continued for an hour from 5:00pm. The participants also demanded immediate arrest and exemplary punishment of the killers of Dhudu Soren.

Dhudu Soren of Kachua village was stabbed to death by the gang at Hili Dangapara Bazar. Robi Soren filed a murder case with Nawabganj Police Station the following day, accusing Abdul Gaffar and seven others of the village.

# 2 'robbers' injured in gunfight with police in 2 districts

Two alleged robbers including a ringleader of a gang were injured in gunfights in Cox's Bazar and Jessore districts yesterday and the day before.

Ringleader of a robber gang was arrested after he became injured in a gunfight with the law enforcers in Kalatali area of Cox's Bazar town early yesterday, reports our correspondent.

Bullet injured Md. Shafiqur Rahman alias Shafiq, 30, was taken to Chittagong Medical College Hospital (CMCH).

Officer-in-Charge (OC) AKM Manzur Alam of Cox's Bazar Detective Branch police said, following a secret information, a team raided Uttaran residential area in the town at around 3:00am.

Sensing the presence of the law enforcers, the robbers gang started firing at the police who also retaliated by firing back.

At one stage, police detained bullet hit Shafiq along with an LG and two cartridges while others

managed to flee.

In Jessore, an alleged robber was shot in a 'gunfight' between his cohorts and police at Mahamudpur in Bagherpara upazila on Sunday night.

The injured robber Abdul Karim, was taken to local hospital, reports UNB.

Qaiyum Ali Shikdar, OC of Bagherpara police station, said on a tip-off that a gang gathered at Mahamudpur for committing robbery in a jewellery shop at Charabhatta Bazar of the upazila, a team of police raided the area at about 11:30 pm.

Sensing the presence of the law enforcers, the robbers hurled some crude bombs at police. In retaliation, police opened fire on them, triggering a gunfight that left Karim bullet injured.

Later, police arrested seven robbers, including bullet-hit Karim, from the spot.

Police recovered a shutter gun, two crude bombs, a few home-made sharp weapons and a bullet from the spot.

# Lightning kills two siblings

Two siblings were killed when lightning struck them at Joygoonjoth village in Tentulia upazila of Panchagarh on Sunday.

The deceased, Labu Mia, 18, and his younger brother Hridoy, 08, were sons of Abdur Rahim of the village.

Labu was a Class VII student at a local high school while Hridoy was a student of Class II at a local primary school.

Locals said, lighting struck the duo when they were catching fish in Karatoa River during heavy rain.

Other people who were fishing nearby took them to Panchagarh Sadar Hospital, where the doctors declared them dead.

of up to two years' imprisonment and a fine of Tk 50,000 each on the bride, groom, marriage organisers and parents concerned.

The latest surcharge, applicable to voice calls, text and multimedia messages and data services, will be an add-on for the subscribers who currently pay 15 per cent value added tax on their total bills.

For instance, when a subscriber now loads Tk 100 in his phone account, he gets credit for Tk 85 and the rest of the amount is deducted as VAT. With the introduction of the new surcharge, another Tk 1 will be adjusted from the subscriber's recharge amount and he will get credit for Tk 84.

Earlier, the government at the beginning of the current fiscal year had slapped one percent surcharge on import of mobile handsets.

Briefing reporters after the meeting, Cabinet Secretary M Musharraf Hossain Bhuiyan said a mobile phone user spends Tk 200 per month on an

average.

All SIM and RIM card users will have to pay the surcharge and the government will earn about Tk 140 crore a year from the proposed surcharge. Mobile phone operators will be responsible for paying the surcharge, he added.

About the proposed child marriage prevention act, the cabinet secretary said the bride, bridegroom, their guardians and marriage organisers will be held responsible for any underage marriage.

If the offender happens to be a woman, she will only have to pay the fine, he pointed out.

Under the existing law enacted in 1929, offenders of child marriage get a maximum of three months' jail and are fined Tk 1,000.

The proposed law has a provision of forming early marriage prevention committees composed of civil society members, NGO representatives and government officials at district, upazila and union levels.

Executive magistrates will enforce the law and Family Courts will deal with cancellation of child marriages, mentioned the secretary.

The proposed law stipulates that girls under 18 and boys under 21 will not be eligible for marriage. The cabinet, however, suggested reducing the age limits considering the socio-economic condition of the country, said Musharraf.

The meeting approved in principle the draft of the Customs Act, 2014, which will be a revised and up-to-date version of the existing law of 1969.

The draft of the new law, said the secretary, has been prepared incorporating all previous amendments to the law and related international rules.

The law, however, will be in force on July 1, 2016 as it would require huge preparatory measures including modification of other related laws and rules and formulation of a number of new laws in some cases, he added.

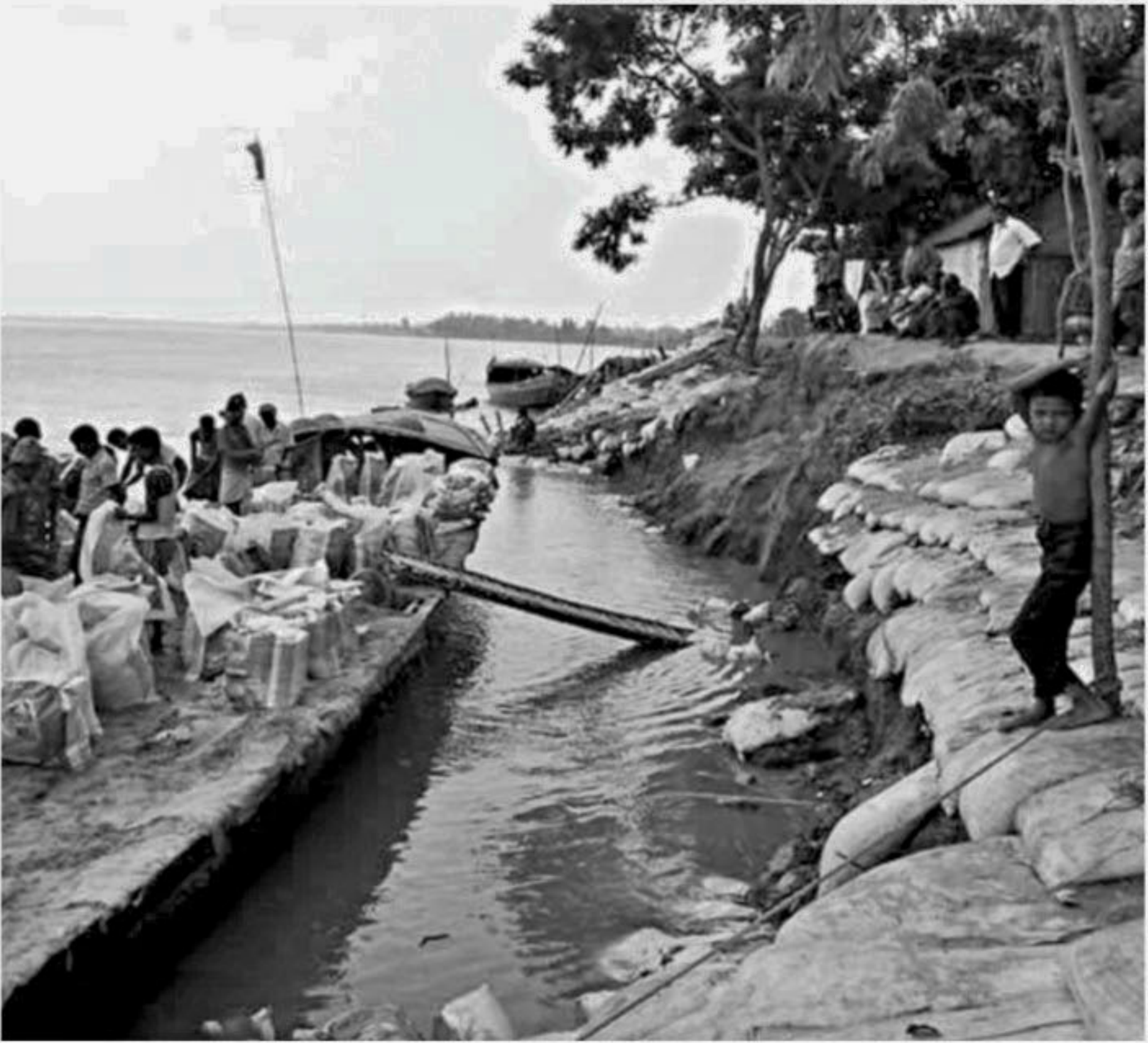

# Jamuna devours 60 homesteads overnight in Gaibandha

The River Jamuna suddenly turned violent early yesterday, devouring at least 60 homesteads overnight at Kamarpara village in Phulchhari upazila.

Many erosion victims hurriedly shifted their movable properties to safer places while others took shelter on nearby high lands.

Nitai Mohanta, a day labourer of the village, said he woke up from bed following a deafening sound around 3:00am.

The sudden erosion then washed away seven homesteads within half an hour, he said.

"As the river swelled within a second, I could not remove anything from the

house," said another victim, farmer Nurunnabi Munshi of the area.

Over 300 villagers are now worried at the situation as Phulchhari Degree College, a madrasa, an eidgah and two temples are facing erosion threat.

About 50-meter stretch of river bank was eroded within an hour, engulfing houses, structures and trees, said Monotosh Roy Mintu, chairman of Gajaria union parishad.

Local lawmaker Fazley Rabbi Mia asked the Water Development Board authorities for taking immediate steps to stop the erosion.

Gaibandha WDB executive engineer Abdul Awal Mia said they have already started dumping sand bags to thwart the onslaught.

# Youth killed as people of two villages clash

A youth was killed and 10 others were injured when locals of two villages clashed at Bhangabari intersection in Sadar upazila of Sirajganj yesterday.

The deceased is Imran Hossain, 27, son of Isharat Ali of Bhangabari village of the upazila.

Police and locals said, there had been a long standing rivalry between the villagers of Bhangabari and Diardhangora village, over establishing supremacy in the area.


As a sequel of their previous enmity, locals of the two villages, equipped with sharp weapons attacked each other around 1:30pm, leaving Imran dead on the spot and injuring 10 others

from both the groups, said Habibur Islam, officer in-charge of Sadar Police Station.

Away in Netrakona, at least 25 people were injured when two rival groups of fishermen clashed at Bejgao village in Kendua upazila on Sunday, reports our correspondent.

Ovi Ranjan, Officer in charge of Kendua Police Station, quoted locals as saying that there had been a long standing rivalry between the men of Haider Ali and Maju Mia over catching fish in Pathashowary River.

As a sequel of previous enmity both the groups attacked each other around 4:00pm leaving 25 people for both sides injured.
