# Liverpool leave it late

The evening's big winners were the reigning champions Real Madrid, who crushed Swiss title-holders Basel 5-1 in Group B, while last season's beaten finalists Atletico Madrid suffered a 3-2 defeat against Olympiakos in Greece in Group A.

Liverpool were making their first appearance in the Champions League since 2009 and were widely expected to start with a victory against Bulgarian debutants Ludogorets.

Brendan Rodgers's side laboured for long spells but when Mario Balotelli put them in front in the 82nd minute to open his Anfield account, they appeared to have the job done.

Spanish substitute Dani Abalo stunned the hosts when he equalised in the first minute of stoppage time, but there was to be another twist as Javi Manquillo was fouled inside the box, allowing Gerrard, so often a scorer of crucial late goals in the past, to convert a 93rd-minute spot-kick.

Arsenal were torn apart by a typically high-octane Dortmund performance at the Westfalenstadion. The hosts had 15 attempts on goal in the opening half but had to wait until the 45th minute to get the breakthrough when Immobile ran 60 yards before slotting past

Wojciech Szczesny.

Aubameyang then exchanged passes with Kevin Grosskreutz before rounding the goalkeeper and making it 2-0 in the 48th minute, and the Gabon striker hit the bar soon after as Arsenal lost their opening Champions League game for the first time in 11 years.

Arsenal will look to bounce back in two weeks when they entertain Galatasaray, who came from behind to draw 1-1 at home to Anderlecht in Istanbul, Burak Yilmaz's stoppage-time strike rescuing a point after Dennis Praet put the away side ahead.

In Liverpool's group, Real Madrid bounced back from successive La Liga defeats to outclass Basel in the Spanish capital with Gareth Bale, Cristiano Ronaldo, James Rodriguez and Karim Benzema all on target after Marek Suchy put through his own net.

Derlis Gonzalez got a consolation for the Swiss side, who host Liverpool in a fortnight.

Fresh from winning the Madrid derby at the weekend, Atletico came up against an Olympiakos side coached by former Real star Michel and started their bid to reach a second successive final with a defeat.

Arthur Masuaku, Ibrahim Afellay and Kostas Mitroglou all found the net for the Greek champions, with summer signings Mario Mandzukic and Antoine Griezmann replying in vain.

Elsewhere in Group A, Juventus eased to a 2-0 victory over Malmö in Turin thanks to a brace by Carlos Tevez, who ended a five-year wait for a Champions League goal.

In Group C, Benfica were undone by their old nemesis Andre Villas-Boas, the former Porto coach taking his Zenit St Petersburg side to Lisbon and coming away with a 2-0 win.

Former Porto star Hulk and ex-Benfica midfielder Axel Witsel got their goals either side of a red card for home goalkeeper Artur.

# Reaction pleases Ancelotti

Real Madrid coach Carlo Ancelotti hailed the reaction of his side to their disappointing start in La Liga as they thrashed Basel 5-1 in the opening game of their Champions League defence on Tuesday.

A 2-1 derby defeat to Atletico Madrid at the weekend on the back of a 4-2 loss to Real Sociedad had led to Los Blancos being booed by their own supporters less than four months after lifting the European Cup for a record 10th time.

However, their crisis of confidence was eased as goals from Gareth Bale, Cristiano Ronaldo, James Rodriguez, Karim Benzema and an own goal from Marek Suchy handed them a comprehensive win to start their European campaign.

"The reaction of the team today was good," said Real boss Carlo Ancelotti.

"We pressed very well in the first half and created a lot of chances. Not everything is resolved just yet, but I liked the reaction of the team."

Ancelotti insisted he hadn't been struck by the backlash to Real's recent form from the fans and media in the Spanish capital despite his success during his first season in charge.

And he is hoping for more of the intensity he saw from his side after calling on them to show a consistent performance for 90 minutes before kick-off.

"When you lose a derby it is normal to get nervous. It is not usual to lose two consecutive games at Real Madrid and that is a good thing," he added.

"The game was easy because we started very well the first 30 minutes with pressure, velocity; we scored lots of goals and then we could control the game."

Next up for Real in Europe is the unknown as Bulgarian champions Ludogorets Razgrad host their first ever Champions League match at home to the most successful club in the competition's history.

Ludogorets were only denied a sensational point away at Liverpool by an injury-time Steven Gerrard penalty on Tuesday and Ancelotti insisted Real won't be complacent as they look to solidify their place at the top of Group B.

"We will go there with the same intent as we always do and that is to win the game. It is important to start well, but we will have respect for them."

Basel coach Paulo Sousa meanwhile was left to rue his side's naivety in defence despite showing flashes of their quality on the ball.

"We created chances, we were brave to have the ball and didn't just look to defend," said the Portuguese.

"In certain moments we were too naive, but in other moments we showed good quality and personality."

# Real first to score 1000 goals

Real Madrid have become the first side to score 1,000 European goals, reaching the landmark during Tuesday's 5-1 thrashing of Basel.

Madrid were in complete command by half-time, establishing a 4-1 lead thanks to an own goal from Marek Suchy and efforts from Gareth Bale, Cristiano Ronaldo and James Rodriguez. Derlis Gonzalez's goal was of little consolation to the Swiss.

The game drifted in the second half but Madrid's night was capped by a fifth goal -- the club's 1,000th in continental competition -- from Karim Benzema 11 minutes from the end.


# Robben sets his sights on final

# Hitzfeld fears implosion at Bayern

Former Bayern Munich coach Ottmar Hitzfeld thinks there could be a player backlash when the Bundesliga champions return to full strength, he explained in an interview with Bild on Wednesday.

"Each player currently accepts spending some time on the bench," said Hitzfeld, who led the club to Champions League glory over Valencia in 2001 at the San Siro.

"But it could get more dangerous later in the season when some of the returning players are not injured and might start complaining about being a substitute," added the 65-year-old, who recently retired after guiding Switzerland at the World Cup in Brazil.

"There is the risk of an implosion," he warned about coach Pep Guardiola's talent-laden squad.

The German champions, who repeated their Champions League victory in 2013 by defeating domestic rivals Borussia Dortmund, bolstered their squad in the off-season with several big name signings.

The 24-time Bundesliga winners added Spanish midfielder Xabi Alonso from Real Madrid as well as the talented Moroccan international defender Medhi Benatia from Roma.

# Allegri demands composure

Juventus coach Massimiliano Allegri said the Italian champions will need more composure in the Champions League if they are to qualify from Group A following a 2-0 win over Malmö on Tuesday.

Carlos Tevez ended his five-year goal drought in the competition with a second-half brace to give Juve a precious 2-0 win over the Swedish champions in Turin on Tuesday.

But despite praising the Argentinian striker, Allegri admitted his frustration with Juve's failure to convert a string of chances.

The 47-year-old Italian, who took

over from Antonio Conte last month, said he expects a tough campaign in a group which also features Olympiakos and last season's beaten finalists Atletico Madrid.

Olympiakos caused an upset already when they claimed a 3-2 home win over the Spaniards.

"There are never easy games in Europe and before this game we knew Malmö would try to close us down as much as possible," said Allegri.

"We got the points, but it was a moderate win. We missed a lot of chances to score goals -- Fernando Llorente missed several chances himself -- and at times we were disorganised, especially in the first half.

"There are a lot of things we have to

improve on. It's a balanced group and anything can happen. I don't think it will be easy for any team to come away from Malmö with the win, for example."

Malmö, who battled through three knockout rounds to reach the group stages, played with plenty of heart but Age Hareide's men were outclassed at a near-packed-out Juventus Stadium.

"We were very disciplined in the first half, we forced them into the corners as we'd set out to do," said Hareide.

"But I think the difference was absolutely Carlos Tevez -- although Juventus are full of quality players."

The hosts took command from kick-off but went in for the half-time break frustrated with what was a poor return from a one-sided encounter.

# Tevez back in frame for Argentina

Recently-appointed Argentina coach Gerardo Martino said Wednesday he is set to hand Juventus striker Carlos Tevez an international lifeline after the former Manchester United and City star was left out of their World Cup squad.

Martino said the 30-year-old, who began his career with Boca Juniors and then Corinthians before a one-season spell with West Ham, will be in competition for the number nine shirt with Napoli's Higuain and Manchester City marksman Sergio Aguero.

"If I have to say where I imagine Tevez in my game plan, it is only at number nine," said the 51-year-old Martino, who left Barcelona at the end of last season after just

one year in charge.

"There is no other position and he will be in competition with Higuain and Aguero, and then it is the coach's choice," Martino told La Nacion newspaper.

Tevez, who scored 13 goals in 64 matches for Argentina between 2004 and 2011 before being frozen out, will be 34 by the time the 2018 World Cup in Russia rolls around.

He won Premier League titles with United in 2008 and 2009 as well as the Champions League in 2008 before adding a third English title with City in 2012.

His current club Juventus won the Serie A crown last season while in 2003 he lifted the Copa Libertadores with Boca Juniors.

The Buenos Aires native is also a three-time South American player of the year (2003, 2004, 2005).

# FA chief backs video replays

Video replays to help football referees in key decision-making moments such as awarding penalties received the backing of England's Football Association chairman Greg Dyke on Wednesday.

Dyke told Sky Sports News: "I for instance would allow a referee to go straight to the cameras (replay) for a penalty but you can't do that for every decision or the match would never finish."

"In 10 years' time I think we will look back and think 'wasn't it quaint we didn't use technology to help make certain decisions'."
