Her father Hebol Baiddhya says she has been "acting weird", scolding and sometimes becoming aggressive when approached. On September 15 she had, though for a short period, lost consciousness again.  
The situation is worse for Rojina, one of the two younger ones. Lying in bed most of the time, she has a blank look in her eyes, cries out in sudden fits and attacks people at random, said her mother Amena Begum.  
She stopped talking some days ago. Using a pen and paper, Rojina explained to this correspondent what "Ramayan" wanted.  
Students, in this case all of the school's 303, abstaining from classes is not what the around 60-year-old Haziipur High School ever experienced, said an 80-year-old shopkeeper Md Nur Islam.  
The issue prompted a meeting to be

called at the school on September 17, the day no student turned up, where some 500 villagers and the school authorities were present.  
A three-member committee comprising headmasters of the high school and an adjoining primary school and the high school managing committee's chairman has been formed to bring in Babul Huzur, the "spiritual healer" to use charms and chant incantations to exorcise the ghost.  
"We are trying our best to overcome the situation," said the high school's headmaster Shah Jalal Munshi, apparently not convinced that it is the works of an evil spirit.  
He is worried over the Junior School Certificate and annual exams coming up in less than two months' time. Though puzzled, he has his suspicions and so waits till new evidence comes to light and unravels this mystery.

boy's indomitable spirit.  
"We try to support him as much as we can," he told The Daily Star.  
The teachers are proud of the boy, now studying commerce in the ninth grade. "Prince is a brilliant student of our school," said Istiak Ahmed Mamun, an assistant teacher.  
Prince fell off a betel nut tree at his home in Uttar Mirukhali village on December 16, 2008, and he has been seated on the wheelchair since then. Every day he self-propelled it, often assisted by classmates, on a 1.5km path down to school.  
Though it is an everyday challenge, Prince is determined to move on and do something good in the future. He is also thankful to the classmates.  
"If my classmates find me coming to school by wheelchair, they accompany me," said Prince, adding that they never felt hesitated in giving him a hand in any problem.  
His friend, Tonmoy Halder, said, "We feel proud of Prince seeing his willpower."  
Apart from physical hindrances, Prince is faced with other challenges, too. His father, Ramesh Chandro, is a poor farmer who has sold out almost all of his land property to treat his son.  
"I've lost most of my property for the treatment of Prince," said Ramesh. He is not sure if he could pay for the higher studies of the boy.  
His eldest sister, Boishakhi, works at a small company in Dhaka, and another sister, Shila, is enrolled in an honours programme in Pirojpur Suhrawardhy Government College.

# Proper education for youths stressed

Eminent citizens yesterday urged the youth to uphold the spirit of the Liberation War to build a secular and corruption-free Bangladesh.  
Mentioning that many university-goers refrain from participating in anti-communal programmes, Prof Emeritus Dr Anisuzzaman stressed the need for appropriate education and environment to inspire the youth to nurture the spirit.  
Dr Sarwar Ali, trustee of the Liberation War Museum, said it would be tough to revive the spirit as pro-Pakistani people are present everywhere in Bangladesh.  
They made the observations in the inaugural ceremony of the third National Convention of Sommlito Samajik Andolon at Institution

of Engineers, Bangladesh in the capital.  
Anisuzzaman said they have been campaigning for a secular country and righteous society since 1950. "Questions arise in our mind that what we've done in these years", he added.  
Attacks on religious minorities are being made only to compel them to leave Bangladesh, said Anisuzzaman, calling for national unity to tackle religious militants.  
Sarwar said both religion and politics have become polluted, and the country has become a monolithic religious state, thanks to religious extremism.  
Sammilito Samajik Andolon President Ajoy Roy, veteran politician Pankaj Bhattacharya and women's leader Dr Fouzia Moslem also spoke.
