Bangladeshi murdered in Dubai

UNB, Beanibazar
A Bangladeshi migrant worker in Dubai was allegedly stabbed to death by Indian citizens there on Friday evening.
The deceased was identified as Kamrul Hossain, 24, son of Faruq Mia of Mohammadpur village in Beanibazar upazila of Sylhet.
Faruq Mia, father of the deceased, said six Indian citizens stabbed Kamrul indiscriminately with a knife following an altercation over a financial feud in Dubai around 7:00pm on the day.
Later, Dubai police arrested the six Indian nationals, said Faruq.

Body of Bangladeshi died in UK detention centre arrives

The body of Rubel Ahmed, who died at a detention centre in the UK on September 6, arrived at Osmani International Airport in Sylhet yesterday.
He was buried at his family graveyard in Sangirai.
The UK authorities had handed over the body to Rubel's relatives on Friday.
Rubel, son of Abdul Jalil, died at Morton Hall Immigration Detention Centre in Lincolnshire. He had been there since July 22 when the law enforcement agency detained him at a restaurant in Kent city.
The Bangladesh community in London are scheduled to demonstrate there tomorrow demanding a fair probe.

Rab member impersonator held

One held with 7kg of gold in airport

On suspicion, the officials at customs lounge searched the body of Md Abdullah Al Amin, 30, of Raozan upazila, who came from Dubai by a Bangladesh Biman flight, BG 046, and found the gold bars hidden in his waist belt.

BCL men confine DU hall provost

Accuse him of being negligent in duties, anonymity-seeking students term it harassment for not meeting leaders' demands

Some 60 to 70 Bangladesh Chhatra League (BCL) activists of Dhaka University's Shahidullah Hall unit kept the hall provost confined to his office for three and a half hours, accusing him of failing to, among others, ensure security at the hall.
Prof Azizur Rahman was freed around 1:00am yesterday after Proctor Prof Amzad Ali arrived at the scene. The former could not be contacted for his cellphone was found switched off since 1:00pm yesterday.
The unit's General Secretary Khandaker Shahiduzzaman Miraj claimed that a sports utility vehicle parked before the room of Aminul Islam, the unit's president, had sped off on Saturday around 3:00am when the latter got to see it.
Although unable to say who was in the vehicle or how it posed a threat to Aminul, Khandaker used the context to state that access of unidentified vehicles to the hall premises was "a major security threat" and the provost was to blame.

GUN-TOTING EX-leader of RU BCL Now he 'threatens' dorm gatekeeper

A former Bangladesh Chhatra League (BCL) leader who was expelled from Rajshahi University unit after making headlines in the past for brandishing firearms and allegedly carrying out vandalism and hurling abuses at teachers has again come to the limelight for reportedly threatening to kill a gatekeeper.
Hatem Ali, posted at Bangabandhu Sheikh Mujibur Rahman Hall, was made a steward yesterday as per his request in a written complaint he submitted to the hall provost, Prof SM Zahid Hossain.
Visibly shaken and breaking down in tears, Hatem narrated to The Daily Star how Mustakim Billah, the former environment affairs secretary, had issued the threat.
On the night of September 14, Mustakim had told him to come up to his room to, as Hatem believes, run an errand.

DOCUMENTS 'VANISHED' FROM OFFICE ICT prosecution rejects press report

The prosecution of the International Crimes Tribunal yesterday rejected a report published in a Bangla daily that said documents of four war crimes "vanished" from the computer of the prosecution office.
The Bangla daily Jugantor yesterday published a report that said documents of the cases against Delwar Hossain Sayedee, Motiur Rahman Nizami, Chowdhury Mueen Uddin and Ashrafuzzaman Khan had been deleted from the "central storage system" in the prosecution office at old High Court building.
Sayedee, Mueen Uddin and Ashrafuzzaman have been convicted in separate war crimes cases, while case proceedings against Nizami were completed in March, but the verdict has not yet been delivered.
In a press briefing at the chief prosecutor's office yesterday, prosecutor Rana Dasgupta, on behalf of the chief prosecutor, said, "The report is false, fabricated, and ill-motivated as we have examined our computers and found the documents intact."
"Furthermore, there is no central storage system at the

MOGHBAZAR TRIPLE MURDER Six held remanded

A Dhaka court yesterday granted six days remand for each of the six people arrested in two cases filed over the triple murder in the capital's Moghbazar.
Rapid Action Battalion also recovered two pistols and three sharp weapons from them in separate drives in Dhaka and Munshiganj on Friday and Saturday.
The arrested are Al Amin, Saifullah Siam, Ramzan Ali, Rubel Mia alias Sunny, Maruf Hossain, and Shafin Laskar. After the arrest, an arms case was also filed against them.
On August 28, some 21 criminals allegedly led by Shah Alam alias Kailla Babu gunned down Ranu Akhter Brishti, 28, Munna, 20, and Billal Hossain, 25, and injuring Hridoy, brother of Ranu, at a house in Sonalibagh.
Later, Ranu's brother filed a case with Ramna Police Station against 15 people, including Kailla Babu, and some other anonymous people. The investigation of the case was later shifted to the detective branch of police.
Eighteen days into the murder, Kailla Babu, the main accused in the triple murder case, was killed in a "gunfight" with detectives in the capital.
