Atletico held again

It was another frustrating night in the capital for Atletico as they were held for the second time in four games this season.

The hosts were shocked 19 minutes in when Pablo Hernandez produced a moment of genius to backheel Carles Planas's cross past Miguel Angel Moya.

Diego Simeone's men had to rely on their efficiency from set-pieces to dig themselves out of trouble as Miranda prodded home Koke's free-kick before Diego Codin powered home a header from Gabi's corner to lead before the break.

However, Celta were level once more eight minutes into the second-half when Miranda was adjudged to have clipped Planas inside the area and Nolito slammed home the resulting spot-kick.

Celta's keeper Sergio Alvarez had to make a fine save to deny much-maligned Atletico striker Raul Jimenez, who also had a goal rightly ruled out for offside.

And Atletico were foiled by the offside flag again in the last action of the game as Alessio Cerci was denied a fairytale ending to his home debut.

Bernabau naming rights for sale

Real Madrid president Florentino Perez admitted on Sunday that the club are in negotiations with 10 companies for the naming rights of their Santiago Bernabeu stadium.

The European champions are looking for a sponsor to cover the cost of a planned 400 million euros redevelopment of the stadium.

"We are looking for a sponsor," Perez said as Real's accounts for last season were approved by the club's members.

"At the moment we are negotiating with 10 companies to see if one is capable of uniting their name with that of the Bernabeu for this great stadium."

Madrid sports daily Marca reported on Sunday that Real are on the verge of sealing a deal with Abu Dhabi government-owned investment company IPIC for a 20-year deal worth between 450 and 500 million euros.

No end to United's misery

Louis van Gaal's difficult start to his time as Manchester United manager continued as Leicester City sensationally came back from 3-1 down to win 5-3 in a remarkable Premier League encounter on Sunday.

The visitors were on course to give the Dutchman his first away victory and second league win as United manager following last week's 4-0 thrashing of QPR, another newly-promoted side, at Old Trafford.

Goals from Robin van Persie, Angel di Maria and Ander Herrera had United winning by two goals after an hour.

But David Nugent's controversial penalty sparked a late revival by the Foxes.

Further Leicester goals from Esteban Cambiasso, Jamie Vardy and another penalty, this time from Leonardo Ulloa, his second goal of the game after a first-half effort, exposed the defensive weakness of a United side who had Tyler Blackett sent off in the incident that led to Ulloa's successful spot-kick.

Both sides matched each other up with a diamond midfield system. Wayne Rooney was in the hole for United with Radamel Falcao making his first start for the club further forward alongside van Persie.

Leicester had Nugent just behind Ulloa and Vardy, who made his first Premier League start.

United took the lead in the 13th minute, Falcao turning Ritchie de Laet

down the left before crossing for van Persie who headed in via a deflection off Liam Moore.

Three minutes later came a moment of magic from Argentina winger di Maria.

United's British record £59.7 million (\$98 million, 75 million euros) signing from Real Madrid collected Rooney's pass before unleashing a delightful chip from 15 yards that left Leicester goalkeeper Kasper Schmeichel -- son of United shot-stopping great Peter -- stranded and revived memories of Karel Poborsky's scooped effort for the Czech Republic against Portugal at Euro 96.

However, Leicester were back in the game just 40 seconds later as Vardy's pace allowed him to just about keep the ball in play before crossing for Ulloa who produced an outstanding header to make it 2-1.

Leicester repeatedly threatened United's defence especially when Jonny Evans was forced off with a foot injury.

But it was United who created the better chances.

Early in the second half, they could have scored again as Falcao shot against the underside of the crossbar from the edge of the area.

They did, though, go 3-1 up in the 57th minute when Herrera cheekily flicked in di Maria's effort from just inside the area to leave Schmeichel wrong-footed.

That should have been game over but Leicester were always likely to trouble United at the back with their all-round

attacking threat and they were back in the match in the 62nd minute.

Vardy appeared to barge Rafael Clattenburg let play continue only to blow for a penalty when, with roles reversed, the United full-back made far less contact with Vardy inside the area.

Nugent made no mistake, blasting down the middle past diving United keeper David de Gea.

Quite incredibly Leicester were level two minutes later.

Rooney conceded the ball to Dean Hammond in a dangerous position and his shot was blocked by Vardy only for Cambiasso to fire home his first goal in England.

United's defence were nearly caught out again as de Laet charged forward from right back and beat di Maria before finding sub Andy King who stabbed his shot just wide.

More poor defending from the visitors then saw Vardy score a deserved first goal of the season.

United substitute Juan Mata lost the ball to de Laet whose long ball picked out the former non-league striker, who made no mistake from the one-on-one position to bring the King Power Stadium its feet.

It was to get even worse for United as Vardy's express pace took him past the United defence again four minutes later with Blackett bringing him down.

The United youngster was red-carded with Ulloa scoring the penalty for his fifth goal in five Leicester games to round off an incredible match.

'Once in a lifetime goal'

Paderborn midfielder Moritz Stoppelkamp scored a "once in a lifetime" 80-metre goal on Saturday which helped his team stay top in Germany.

Stoppelkamp scored his extraordinary long-range special in the third minute of injury time against Hanover with a shot from just outside his own box.

"I didn't know that I could even shoot that far," said the 27-year-old who found the net after Hanover goalkeeper Ron-Robert Zieler had been up in the Paderborn area hoping to score a stoppage-time equaliser.

"The ball came just right and the shot was the only opportunity for me. I struck it perfectly. It's great that I was able to do my part in the success of the team."

Paderborn coach Andre Breitenreiter hailed Stoppelkamp's memorable goal.

"That kind of goal is once in a lifetime. But he also had the quality to recognise the situation," said Breitenreiter.

Lampard stuns Chelsea

Frank Lampard, Chelsea's all-time record scorer, came on as a late substitute for Manchester City and scored their equaliser in a 1-1 draw at the Etihad as the champions ended their former club's perfect start to the Premier League season on Sunday.

Lampard, who scored 211 goals for Chelsea and is on loan at City from MLS side New York City, scored in the 85th minute after only six minutes on the pitch.

Andre Schurrle had put league leaders Chelsea ahead in the 71st minute, five minutes after City defender Pablo Zabaleta had been sent off for fouling Diego Costa.

Lampard, third on Chelsea's all-time appearance list as well as scoring more goals for the club than anyone else, did not celebrate the goal which ended Chelsea's perfect start to the season although they stayed three points clear at the top with 13 points from their first five matches.

"It's a really difficult one. I'd be unprofessional if I came on and didn't do my job so I'm mixed with it," he told Sky Sports.

"I'm obviously pleased that the side I came on for got a draw. It's come up, I'm a professional and I didn't expect to come on and score. I'm stuck in the middle."

"The Chelsea fans were singing my name and it was an emotional day. It's not how I expected to say goodbye to the Chelsea fans. I woke up this morning and didn't know what I wanted from today so I'm glad it's out of the way. I guess this is a happy medium."

The result left Manchester City in sixth place on eight points, and their draw meant they had a better day than their arch-rivals Manchester United, involved in one of the most astonishing Premier League matches for years.

Leicester were one of three surprise winners with West Bromwich Albion climbing off the bottom of the table with a 1-0 win at Tottenham Hotspur, their first league win of the season.

Crystal Palace came from behind to win 3-2 at Everton in their first victory of the league campaign.

Roma go top

Mattia Destro and Alessandro Florenzi hit one apiece for Roma in a 2-0 win over Cagliari that sent the Giallorossi to the top of Serie A thanks to superior goals difference on Sunday.

Champions Juventus had gone clear of the pack thanks to a 1-0 win over AC Milan on Saturday when Carlos Tevez's 71st minute strike made the difference between the sides at a packed San Siro.

However Roma, 5-1 winners over CSKA Moscow in midweek, continued their fine start to the season with a dominant performance in front of a sparse crowd at the Olympic Stadium.

With Roma now back in the Champions League, coach Rudi Garcia rested Francesco Totti and Miralem Pjanic while Davide Astori, Juan Iturbe and Leandro Castan were all missing through injury.

Garcia handed Mapou Yanga-Mbiwa his full debut, the France defender partnering Kostas Manolas at the heart of Roma's defence with Ashley Cole and Maicon.

Destro forced 20-year-old Serie A debutant Alessio Cragno into evasive action with a turn and shot in the opening minutes, but the 'keeper could do little to stop Destro breaking the deadlock minutes later.

Florenzi drew the Cagliari defence before rolling a low cross towards the back post, where Destro, unmarked, fired past Cragno from close range.

Two minutes later Roma were celebrating again, Seydou Keita sighting Gervinho in space as Cagliari tried to spring the offside trap.

The Ivorian took possession and beat his marker before laying off for Florenzi to beat Cragno with a precise angled strike from the right of goal.

Tevez sinks Milan

Carlos Tevez scored his fourth goal in a week to hand champions Juventus a precious 1-0 win over Milan at a packed San Siro on Saturday.

Milan had taken full points from their opening two matches under new coach Filippo Inzaghi following two horrendous campaigns under Allegri and Clarence Seedorf.

But after a promising first half performance, the Rossoneri were punished by an alert Tevez 19 minutes from the end.

It was the Argentinian's fourth goal in seven days.

"It was a great game... they rarely put us in trouble," Tevez said.

Juve's third successive win left them three points clear of Milan and Roma ahead of the latter's game at home against Cagliari on Sunday.

By the end of the first half, Juve were on the ascendancy.

Milan had shown promise in the tense opening exchanges, Keisuke Honda notably forcing Gianluigi Buffon to block his header from Sulley Muntari's long cross at the back post on 27 minutes.

But minutes later, a Tevez chip for Roberto Pereyra saw the Argentinian volley the ball back into the path of Fernando Llorente, who skipped a chal-



possession in midfield and Paul Pogba's dipping drive deflected off Adil Rami.

Milan were finally made to pay in the 71st minute thanks to a fine piece of Tevez magic.

The Argentinian stumbled to the ground as he took possession on the edge of the area, but somehow got the ball to Pogba.

Tevez then ran on to the Frenchman's dink to beat Abbiati with a chip at the keeper's far post.

Fernando Torres was one of several substitutes to make a late appearance but the former Chelsea striker was given scant time to settle before earning a yellow card for an accidental strike on Kwadwo Asamoah, who was also cautioned after their duel.

Muntari continued as they left off after the restart, while Milan struggled to get out of an apparent slumber.

Marchisio was allowed to dribble his way along the edge of the area before Ignazio Abate came to the rescue with a brusque clearance.

Minutes later Muntari gave away
