PINAK-6 DISASTER

Shipping dept surveyor suspended

Shipping Department on September 21 suspended the ship surveyor who illegally issued operating permit to the unfit passenger vessel Pinak-6 that capsized in the Padma river on August 4, killing over a hundred passengers on board.

The action was taken following a government enquiry findings on the tragedy and the authorities are going to sue others responsible for the tragedy with the marine court.

We have suspended the surveyor, as he, among other officials, was directly liable for the tragedy, Commodore M Zakiur Rahman Bhuiyan, director general of Department of Shipping (DoS) told The Daily Star yesterday.

Mirza Saifur Rahman, the DoS surveyor, allowed Pinak-6 to travel with temporary fitness certificate (token) thrice though the Inland Shipping Ordinance has the provision of such permission once for 45 days. "The vessel sank as it was allowed to ply on temporary

permits issued in violation of the law despite the fact that you [Saifur] identified several faults with the vessel," read the suspension order.

Obama for global action on climate threat

US President Barack Obama yesterday urged all nations including emerging economies to act against climate change, warning that time was running out to prevent further damage.

Addressing a UN climate summit hours, Obama said the "urgent and growing threat of climate change" would ultimately "define the contours of this century more dramatically than any other issue."

"We know what we have to do to avoid irreparable harm. We've to cut carbon pollution in our own countries to prevent the worst effects of climate change," he mentioned.

impacts that unfortunately we can no longer

avoid," said the president.

Obama added: A future climate agreement -- which a 2015 conference in Paris aims to seal - needed to be both "ambitious" and "flexible."

The US leader said he met in New York with Vice Premier Zhang Gaoli of China, which has surpassed the US as the world's top emitter of greenhouse gases blamed for climate change.

Obama said he "reiterated my belief that as the two largest economies and emitters in the world, we have a special responsibility to lead. It's what big nations have to do."

"Today I call on all countries to join us -not next year or the year after that but right now -- because no nation can meet this The world also has to "adapt to the global threat alone," he said.

SHOWING 2 ARRESTEES AS WAR CRIMES SUSPECTS

Tribunal rejects prosecution plea

For the first time since its inception in March 2010, an international crimes tribunal yesterday did not allow the prosecution plea to show two suspected war criminals arrested in connection with committing crimes against humanity.

The International Crimes Tribunal-2, however, asked the prosecution to submit on November 2 a progress report on the investigation into Mahidur Rahman and Afsar Hossain's alleged war-time crimes committed in Chapainawabganj.

Mahidur and Afsar had been arrested at

Chapainawabganj on September 16 in a criminal case, not a war crimes case.

The three-member tribunal, led by Justice Obaidul Hassan with members Justice Md Mozibur Rahman Miah and Justice Md Shahinur Islam, directed the jail authorities to send the duo back to Chapainawabganj jail.

After the prosecution submitted a petition asking the court to show them arrested in a war crimes case, the tribunal on Thursday asked jail authorities to produce them before it yesterday.

ACC approves graft charges against Khoka

The Anti-Corruption Commission yesterday approved a charge sheet against former Dhaka City Corporation mayor Sadeque Hossain Khoka and three others in a 2012 case filed over corruption in a multi-storey car park project.

Other charge-sheeted accused are Mansur Ahmed, the then executive engineer of DCC; Mafizur Rahman, the then acting

executive engineer, and Aminur Rahman Chowdhury, DCC deputy assistant engineer of the time. ACC Deputy Director Harun-ur-Rashid filed the case

with Shahbagh Police Station in March 2012, accusing seven people, including Khoka. Three other accused were exempted from the charge as they

had not been found involved in the graft, said a top ACC official The corruption took place between 2007 and 2009 and caused a Tk-827 crore loss to the national exchequer,

according to the case statement.

Railway knocks down 715 illegal structures

The railway authorities yesterday demolished around 715 illegal shops and establishments on railway land at Khilkhet in the capital but spared a thana level Awami League office.

Around 2,500 illegal structures, mostly commercial shops, have so far been demolished from Khilgaon to Khilkhet area in last seven days.

The authorities launched the drive on September 12 following a train accident that claimed four lives at Karwan Bazar. Railway officials had earlier announced

to conduct the drive till September 29 and resume it after the Eid break.

But they were compelled to postpone the drive during the hartal called by the Jamaate-Islam and BNP-led 20-party alliance due to lack of manpower from the police force, said a railway official.
