Ronaldo goes NUMBERS ory of football, shootouts Ronaldo goes goal crazy

Cristiano Ronaldo scored four times as Real Madrid came from behind to move within three points of La Liga leaders Barcelona with a 5-1 win over Elche on Wednesday.

The Portuguese also scored a hat-trick in Real's 8-2 thrashing of Deportivo la Coruna on Saturday and now has 12 goals to his name in just eight appearances this season.

The Santiago Bernabeu had been briefly stunned as Ronaldo was penalised for a foul on Pedro Mosquera as he tried to clear inside his own area after 15 minutes and Edu Albacar slammed the spot-kick past debutant Keylor Navas in the Madrid goal.

However, the European champions responded in style as Gareth Bale headed home an equaliser before a Ronaldo penalty put them in front.

Ronaldo then produced a towering header to send the hosts in 3-1 up at the break before completing his hat-trick with another penalty and rounding off the scoring with a cool finish from Bale's pass in stoppage time.

The build up to the game had been dominated by Real coach Carlo Ancelotti's decision to hand Navas his debut ahead of the under fire Iker Casillas in response to his side's defensive troubles so far this season.

However, the Costa Rican was left with no chance when Albacar slammed his penalty into the top corner to give the visitors' the lead.

Things very nearly got worse for Real moments later as Marcelo was lucky to

escape with just a yellow card after bringing down Garry Rodrigues on the edge of the box and Albacar curled the resultant freekick inches wide.

Ancelotti's men were gifted a route back into the game on 20 minutes when Bale made a good contact with James Rodriguez's cross from the right, but Elche 'keeper Manu Herrera should have kept the Welshman's effort out at his near post.

Referee Clos Gomez then balanced up his decision to award Elche a soft penalty by pointing to the spot despite there appearing to be no contact between Mosquera and Marcelo as the Brazilian full-back tumbled in the box.

Ronaldo smashed the ball high into the net to make it 2-1 and was celebrating again four minutes later when he leapt highest to power Marcelo's cross into the far corner.

Herrera atoned for his earlier error by beating away a fierce Ronaldo free-kick as he went in search of a second hat-trick in as many games and made an even better stop to deny Toni Kroos his first Madrid goal at the end of a lovely move involving Ronaldo and Rodriguez.

However, Ronaldo's 25th hat-trick for the club finally arrived nine minutes from time when he slammed home another penalty after he had been clipped inside the area by Mario Pasalic.

And there was more to come from the 29year-old as he raced onto Bale's brilliant assist to slot home his fourth of the evening.

Victory takes Madrid up to fourth with Barcelona in action on Wednesday away to Malaga, whilst champions Atletico Madrid travel to Almeria.

Torres opens Milan account

Spaniard Fernando Torres scored his maiden goal for AC Milan on his full Serie A debut to help spark the fightback in a 2-2 draw away to Empoli on Tuesday.

Empoli had won only two of their 18 previous league meetings with Milan and never beaten the Rossoneri at their Carlo Castellani stadium.

However the Serie B runners-up made the most of a sluggish start by Filippo Inzaghi's men to race to a 2-0 lead inside 20 minutes thanks to goals from Lorenzo Tonelli and Manuel Pucciarelli.

Milan could have conceded more in a busy opening period for the visitors' defence, with 'keeper Christian Abbiati coming to their rescue on several occasions before finally awaking from their slumber minutes before the halftime break.

Having waited 34 minutes for their first shot on goal thanks to Keisuke Honda, Milan finally reduced arrears when Torres sent a looping header from Ignazio Abate's cross into Luigi Sepe's top corner on 43 minutes.

Honda, one of Milan's top performers on the night, levelled just before the hour with a daisy-cutter from the edge of the box which beat Sepe into the keeper's near bottom corner.

Milan pressed for a winner in the dying minutes of the match after Mirko Valdifiori was cautioned for a second time following a brutal challenge on Nigel De Jong and sent off in the 87 minute.

It was Empoli's second expulsion of the night, coach Maurizio Sarri being shown a red card for protesting the referee's decision to award no penalty for a Milan handball.

Milan's first draw of the fledgling season leaves them in fourth position, two points behind leaders Roma and Juventus who are in action Wednesday away to Parma and at home to Cesena respectively.

Empoli remain in the drop zone, third from bottom and still looking for their first win of the campaign.

Reds survive shootout marathon

Liverpool reached the English League Cup last 16 after an extraordinary third round tie saw them beat second-tier Middlesbrough 14-13 in a penalty shoot-out on Tuesday, while Southampton knocked Arsenal out of the competition.

Both goalkeepers scored in a shoot-out at Anfield where all 22 players still on the field took spot-kicks before Middlesbrough's Albert Adomah fired wide to ensure eight-times League Cup winners Liverpool's victory.

Earlier, 17-year-old striker Jordan Rossiter marked his Liverpool debut with a 10th-minute goal before Adam Reach equalised for Middlesbrough just after the hour.

The sides remained locked at 1-1 until the end of normal time.

That led to a remarkable 30 more penalties in the shoot-out.

Earlier, Southampton -second in the Premier League -- came from behind to win 2-1 away to top-flight rivals Arsenal at the Emirates Stadium.

Bayern back on top

Bayern Munich restored some normality to the Bundesliga table on Tuesday as the reigning champions eased past surprise early leaders SC Paderborn 4-0 to take over first place.

Munich also leapfrogged Hoffenheim and Mainz 05 - who both played out draws to slip two points behind Bayern while Schalke 04 picked up their first victory of the season.

Munich did not wait long to strike, taking the lead after eight minutes with some fine passing.

Arjen Robben fed Thomas Mueller, who back-heeled to Mario Goetze and the youngster placed his shot perfectly inside the right post to make it 1-0.

Munich doubled their advantage in the 14th minute thanks to a powerful strike by Robert Lewandowski.

The champions took their foot off the gas but Goetze added his second goal in the 78th minute, pouncing on a loose ball in the box, before Mueller got his name on the scoresheet in the 85th minute to see Bayern to 11 points.

Hoffenheim missed their chance to keep pace with Munich but Jannik Vestergaard scored three minutes into injury time to secure a 3-3 draw at home to SC Freiburg and see them move on to nine points.

Mike Frantz scored in the 32nd and 33rd minutes for Freiburg. Tarik Elyounoussi pulled back a goal in the 44th minute and Sebastian Rudy equalised for Hoffenheim from a free kick after 63 minutes.

Freiburg went ahead as Vladimir Darida converted a penalty in the 75th minute. But the Czech international was sent off six minutes later, setting up Vestergaard's heroics.

Haris Seferovic scored in the 82nd minute to secure a 2-2

draw for Eintracht Frankfurt at home against Mainz. Jonas Hofmann gave Mainz the lead after 41 minutes and Shinji Okazaki grabbed his fifth of the season for the visitors in the 44th minute.
