### Starbucks to buy up Japan unit for \$900m

Starbucks is to take full ownership of its Japanese operations at a cost of more than \$900 million, a move which the company said was aimed at further tapping its secondlargest market.

The Seattle-based coffee giant said it would buy the 60.5 percent stake that it does not already own as part of a two-step tender process expected to be completed by the first half of 2015.

Japan was the first overseas destination for Starbucks when it expanded from the United States in 1996.

The news, announced on Tuesday, sent shares of Starbucks Coffee Japan up 4.43 percent to 1,461 yen (\$13) on the Jasdaq startup market Wednesday.

The Japan business, which was launched in 1996 and now has more than 1,000 locations, is a joint venture between Starbucks and Sazaby League.

## IMF expects 2015 growth in China to be over 7pc

China's economy will likely grow faster than previously thought in 2015, the International Monetary Fund said on Wednesday, downplaying the risks of the cooling property market in the world's second-largest economy.

Economic growth in China will likely be "well above" 7 percent next year, Changyong Rhee, director of the Asia and Pacific department at the IMF, told a briefing in Manila. His remarks suggested the global lender's

will upgrade its growth forecast for the country due next month from the current 7.1 percent estimate it made in July. The IMF has a 7.4 percent growth fore-

cast for China for 2014, slightly below the government's official target of around 7.5 percent.

"We expect they have many tools to maintain the growth rate well above 7 percent next year," Rhee said.

Many economists see the rapidly slowing

property market as the biggest risk facing China's economy. Home prices, sales and new construction are all falling, and increasingly dragging on related sectors from home appliances to glass, steel and cement.

Analysts believe Beijing will roll out further stimulus measures in coming months to avert a deeper economic slowdown, including more help for would-be home buyers. However, Rhee said the IMF does not

expect China's cooling property market to become a serious problem, saying it sees "a gradual adjustment" rather than a hard landing. "Evidence shows there will be a gradual

adjustment in real estate market but we have to watch if that baseline scenario will hold," Rhee said. A slowing Chinese economy should

not be looked at as a "pure risk" as it gives other countries in Asia a better chance at competiting with Beijing and attracting foreign direct investments, Rhee added.

### 7pc growth possible

Garment still accounts for 80 percent of the export basket, despite domestic optimism about the pharmaceutical sector, which makes up only 0.5 percent.

In light of this, it called for a comprehensive industrial strategy for diversification. Business environment and infrastructure must also be improved to provide impetus for other areas of manufacturing.

SCB also called for higher private

participation in infrastructure projects, as public finances are already stretched and the country is struggling to raise the tax-GDP ratio.

To encourage private participation in infrastructure projects, which remains low at 1.1 percent of GDP, the country needs to improve the transparency and timeliness of government decision-making and ensure stricter enforcement of government commitments, it said.

### Emirates SkyCargo launches temperature sensitive container

Emirates SkyCargo, the freight division of Emirates, has launched an internally developed and cost effective container that keeps temperature sensitive cargo cool when transported on the ground and in the air.

White Container is the latest addition to SkyCargo's

cool chain portfolio and has been designed specifically as an intermediate temperature control solution which is ideal for generic healthcare products and food perishables, the airline said in a statement yesterday. The inside of the container is coated with thermal insulators, which prevents the transfer of outside heat into the container and uses coolant trays allowing han-

dlers to add or replenish dry ice or coolants without disturbing the packaging. "It can be used for shipments requiring temperatures between 2°C - 8°C and 5°C - 25°C reliably,"

Emirates said. The new facility has an advanced storage system and a perishable area designed to handle about 140,000 tonnes of cargo per annum, according to the statement.

### One million Filipinos join booming Philippine outsourcing sector

The Philippines' booming outsourcing industry now employs a million people after growing almost tenfold in just over a decade, the industry association said Wednesday. Widely considered as second only to India, Philippine

outsourcing is expected to earn \$18 billion this year, said the IT and Business Process Association Philippines. "We just (hit) one million. Still targeting 1.3 million in

2016," its president Jose Mari Mercado said in a statement. He expressed confidence that the sector, which started from scratch in the early 1990s, would increase its revenues to \$25 billion by 2016.

The business process outsourcing or BPO sector has emerged as a shining star of the Philippine economy after posting just \$1.5 billion in revenues with 103,500 employees in 2004, figures released by the industry group showed. This has helped provide better-paying jobs to a coun-

try where 10 million people, about a tenth of the population, have travelled overseas to seek employment. For each person hired directly by the industry, about

2.5 additional support jobs are also generated, the asso-

ciation said. The Philippines has already overtaken India as the global leader in call centres and is also expanding into more sophisticated outsourced operations as Western firms farm out back office and other tasks to lower-cost areas.

### Banks reschedule Tk 18,552cr under relaxed rules

Among the state banks, Rupali rescheduled the highest amount of loans worth Tk 3,137 crore, followed by Agrani Bank's Tk 2,062 crore, according to the BB. Of the other state and specialised banks, Sonali

rescheduled loans worth Tk 756 crore, while Bangladesh Development Bank regularised Tk 305 crore, Bangladesh Krishi Bank Tk 545 crore, Rajshahi Krishi Unnayan Bank Tk 253 crore and BASIC Bank Tk 59 crore. However, banks' classified loans increased by 1.82

percentage points to 10.75 percent of their outstanding loans on June 30. On December 31, the amount of their total default loans was 8.93 percent of the outstanding loans. The state banks' default loans were 23.23 percent on

June 30, up from 19.76 percent on December 31. The central bank had offered the relaxed rescheduling

facility in the first week of December last year and banks made the best use of the scope in that month. As a result, the classified loan situation of the banks improved much in December last year compared to

Non-performing loans in banks fell 28.45 percent during the period last year, according to a central bank study.

Banks' provision against bad loans also came down by 21 percent during the period, while provision shortfall slid around 92 percent.

September the same year.

Jennifer said Formia won the contract for supplying 51,000 hajj kits at \$4.52 per unit through an international bidding. "Biman issued the purchase order on August 25 and

Formia delivered the first consignment the next day. But Biman cancelled the purchase order on August 27," she said. Jennifer said Formia may take legal action against Biman if the carrier does not settle the matter out of court.

When contacted, Shafiqur Rahman, a director of Biman, said their inspection found a huge mismatch between the specifications and the hajj kits supplied by Formia.

"So, the management decided to cancel the purchase order," he said.
