Witnesses said SUV driver Mohammad Kalam, who was heading towards Shahjahanpur from Khilgaon, was trying to cross the rail track, ignoring the red signal.

Kalam was wounded critically, while a rickshaw-puller suffered minor injuries in the accident that happened around 10:30am.

This is just one of many such accidents in recent times. Impatience and recklessness of drivers, commuters and pedestrians have turned level crossings in the capital and elsewhere virtual

Barely two weeks back, four people were killed in a makeshift fish market set up illegally on rail lines at Karwan Bazar, as they jumped on to the path of an express train to avoid being run over by another train. Five others were seriously injured.

After the incident, the railway authorities demolished around 2,500 illegal structures there and tried to create awareness among people. But it failed to yield much result.

In a span of less than three hours on

The alliance is composed of 10 political parties and eight of them are not registered with the Election Commission, meaning those political parties will not be able to participate in the election. Only two parties, Nilu-led NPP and Zubeida Quader Chowdhury-led Bangladesh Muslim League (BML), have registration with the EC.

On August 24, Nilu announced quitting the BNP-led 20-party alliance, saying the alliance chief Khaleda Zia

was running the combine unilaterally and that she had taken the wrong decision of boycotting the January 5 elections.

Bringing the same allegations against Khaleda, Mazumder, on September 21, made it clear that he was going to quit the alliance.

The new political coalition was initiated mainly by Nilu, and Mazumder.

Cops capture 2 'ISIS recruitees'

For their travel to Syria, they were supposed to pose as members of Tabligh Jamaat, a peaceful movement for spreading Islamic values, investiga-

tors learned during interrogation. The UK citizen, who recruited the two youths, came to Bangladesh in April. He held meetings with a group of militants at Azad Mosque in the capital's Gulshan and at the shrine of Hazrat Shahjalal in Sylhet, offi-

cials said. "A foreign recruiter, who fought learnt after quizzing them. against Syrian President Bashar al-Assad, is in Dhaka to recruit such fighters," Joint Commissioner Monirul Islam of Dhaka journalists yesterday.

Detectives believe several other foreigners might be active in Bangladesh looking for potential ISIS jihadists.

"We can learn about others if we can arrest the UK citizen," Additional Deputy Commissioner Saiful Islam, who led the drives to arrest the duo, told The Daily Star.

Detectives went after Asif and Tanzil following information gleaned from seven Jama'atul Mujahideen Bangladesh (JMB) men arrested in Ashulia on September 19.
