Udinese stun Lazio

Udinese striker Cyril Thereau hit a first-half winner as the northerners stunned Lazio 1-0 at home to plunge the club into further crisis.

Thereau's 26th minute strike at the Olympic Stadium moved Udinese up to third place, only three points adrift of Juventus and Roma.

Lazio's third reverse of the campaign left Stefano Pioli's side sixth from bottom ahead of a tough trip away to promoted Palermo on Monday.

Udinese have enjoyed a solid start under new coach Andrea Stramaccioni, but the former Inter Milan handler called for humility.

"We've moved up to third place but we have to remain humble," Stramaccioni told Sky Sport Italia.

FIFA to ban 3rd-party ownership

Soccer's governing body FIFA agreed to ban the third-party ownership of players on Friday, its president Sepp Blatter said.

Blatter said a working group would be set up to implement the ban which would come into effect following "a transitional period".

"We took a firm decision that TPO should be banned but it cannot be banned immediately there will be a transitional period," Blatter told a news conference.

His announcement followed pressure from European soccer's governing body UEFA, which had said it would ban it unilaterally if FIFA did not act.

Third-party ownership is when the transfer rights of players are wholly or partially owned by the footballer himself or a company, instead of just the player's club.

Valencia atop

Paco Alcacer and Jose Luis Gaya struck midway through the first half for Valencia to set up a 3-0 victory over Cordoba that put them top of the La Liga table on goal difference on Thursday.

Valencia have rebuilt their team with the pending arrival of Singapore billionaire Peter Lim but it was two youth products who paved the way for victory.

Alcacer, who scored on his competitive international debut for Spain earlier this month against Macedonia, demonstrated his predatory skills with a flicked header into the top corner after 22 minutes from a Sofiane Feghouli cross.

Minutes later left back Gaya drove in a loose ball from inside the penalty area for his first league goal.

Cordoba, who returned to the top flight this season and are bottom with two points, struggled to cope with Valencia's onslaught and Feghouli wrapped up the win in the second half, latching on to an Andre Gomes pass to finishing clinically.

"The team is playing very well at the moment and knows what it wants in each game. We are creating chances and we are where we are for a reason," Alcacer told reporters.

"Our target since the arrival of the coach Nuno (Espirito Santo) has been perfection and while we are following that line we are not dreaming of being at the top but concentrating on each match."

Valencia have won their last four games and are level with Barcelona and Sevilla on 13 points but have scored more goals.

Derbies take centrestage

Age-old derby rivalries will take centre-stage in the Premier League on Saturday, with Liverpool hosting

Merseyside neighbours Everton and Tottenham Hotspur visiting sworn north London enemies Arsenal.

The fixtures are among the most colourful in the English football calendar and they carry extra weight this weekend as all four teams are seeking to kick on after underwhelming starts to the season.

Liverpool narrowly lost out to Manchester City in last season's title race and Everton finished fifth with a record points tally, but they are currently 11th and 14th respectively ahead of their showdown at Anfield.

Liverpool have lost three of their opening five games and needed penalties to see off second-tier Middlesbrough in the League Cup on Tuesday, edging a remarkable shootout 14-13 after a 2-2 draw.

Everton, meanwhile, have won only once in the league and saw their

League Cup hopes ended by a 3-0 defeat at Swansea City.

Liverpool manager Brendan Rodgers has described his team as a "work in progress", but he believes that the visit of Everton can act as a springboard for the season. "We know we need to be better. We

know we need to improve our performance levels," Rodgers said. "The derby gives us an opportunity

to do that. It provides a platform to go on a good, consistent run."

Everton went down 3-2 at home to Crystal Palace last weekend, but although they have not won at Anfield

for 15 years, manager Roberto Martinez says they will approach the game with a positive attitude.

"The defeat against Crystal Palace, there was something spooky about it," he said, in reference to the fact that Palace had also won 3-2 on their previous visit to Goodison Park in April.

"The last time we beat Liverpool at Anfield was September 27 (in 1999) so I hope the spookiness carries on at the weekend." Having won 3-0 at Aston Villa last

weekend following three consecutive draws, Arsenal are starting to move in the right direction and go into the game with Tottenham in fourth place. But they lost 2-0 at Borussia

Dortmund in the Champions League and were dumped out of the League Cup in mid-week by Southampton.

Tottenham have now gone three league games without victory, but manager Mauricio Pochettino remains determined to see his side finish above Arsenal for the first time in 19 years.

"We are ambitious," he said after Spurs beat Nottingham Forest 3-1 in the League Cup.

C'Ron won't slow down

World Player of the Year Cristiano Ronaldo has insisted he has no intentions of slowing down after firing 12 goals in his first eight appearances this season.

Ronaldo followed up his hat-trick in a 8-2 rout of

Deportivo la Coruna last weekend by scoring four times in a match for the third time in his Madrid career as the European champions continued their return to form with a 5-1 thrashing of Elche in midweek. Real also received a boost as Barcelona dropped points for the first time this season against Malaga to cut their lead over Madrid to just four points. And with a tricky trip away to Villarreal

this weekend on the horizon, Ronaldo says he will not be resting as coach Carlo Ancelotti rotates his squad.

"We are at the start of the season and I want to play to gain confidence and rhythm," said Ronaldo.

"When the right games come I will rest and rotate, but now isn't the right moment. I

want to continue to be better." Ronaldo's goalscoring record so far this season is all the more remarkable as he took a

three-week break at the beginning of the campaign to ease knee and hamstring injuries.

Ancelotti said in midweek that break had been key to his sensational return to form, but, worryingly for Real's rivals, Ronaldo believes he can still improve physically after suffering from tendonitis in his left knee towards the end of last season.

"I feel good and without any pain. I am still improving and I have a little way to go so I want to continue like this.

"I can still be better physically. I trained really hard during the break after not having a good pre-season, but now I feel confident and without pain."

Ancelotti also confirmed after the win over Elche that Karim Benzema and Luka Modric would return to the side for the trip to El Madrigal with Isco and Asier Illarramendi set to drop to the bench.

'Qatar will put on one of best World Cup'

The Emir of Qatar, Sheikh Tamim bin Hamad al-Thani, on Thursday said the Gulf state will put on one of the finest World Cups in history when it hosts the tournament in 2022.

Qatar and football's world governing body FIFA are coming under increasing pressure to take the 2022 showpiece away from a country that has little sporting infrastructure or footballing culture, while there have been accusations of bribery in the bidding process.

Europe's top leagues are also firmly against any suggestion that the World Cup be moved to the winter to avoid the sweltering summer months in Qatar, while there have been allegations of horrific working conditions for migrant workers building stadiums and infrastructure.

"People should understand that Qatar had the best bid, and Qatar will provide and will do one of the best World Cups in history," the sheikh told CNN in what it billed as his first-ever interview as emir of Qatar, adding: "And I'm sure about that.

"People don't want to accept, don't want to realize that a small country, Arab, Muslim country, can host a big event like that."

He said that Qatar was ready to host either a winter or summer World Cup in 2022.

"Our bid was for it to be in summer," he said. "At the end,

it's up to FIFA to decide when is the best time." To protect players from the heat of Qatar's fierce summer, the country is developing complex air conditioning systems

"We have this technology for 10 years now and it's working in... one of our stadiums," he told CNN.

"One hundred percent it will be working" for the World Cup, he added.


The International Trade Union Confederation warned in June that as many as 4,000 migrant workers could die in construction site accidents by the time the 2022 tournament kicks off.

"Yes, it's true -- we had problems," the emir said. "We're solving the problems. We're enforcing the laws -- it's not acceptable.

"We changed the laws. They are enforced and there are many laws that have been changed. And I'm telling you because I am personally hurt about the situation."


