

Thom Yorke releases new album on BitTorrent

Radiohead's Thom Yorke has released his latest solo album via BitTorrent, in an attempt to bypass "the selfelected gatekeepers" of the music industry.

The singer said he turned to the online filesharing system as "an experiment".

"Tomorrow's Modern Boxes", which includes eight tracks and a video, is available for \$6. It comes seven years after Radiohead famously shook up the music business by giving their album In Rainbows a pay what you want' online release.

"If it works well it could



be an effective way of handing some control of internet commerce back to people who are creating the work,", Yorke and producer Nigel Godrich said in a statement.

BitTorrent has long been the curse of the music industry, as it has allowed fans to share songs for free.

"Tomorrow's Modern Boxes" is Yorke's second solo album, following up 2006's "The Eraser".
