MYANMAR REFUGEES IN BANGLADESH
Voluntary repatriation only durable solution

Dhaka tells UNHCR meeting in Geneva

Dhaka has told the UN refugee agency that Bangladesh considers the voluntary repatriation of Myanmar refugees back to their homes in Rakhine state as the only durable solution to the protracted refugee situation.

Newly appointed Ambassador and Permanent Representative of Bangladesh to the UN Offices in Geneva and Vienna, M Shameem Ahsan, reiterated this while addressing the annual meeting of UNHCR's governing Executive Committee in Geneva Wednesday.

He alluded to the positive momentum generated by the recently concluded Foreign Office Consultations between Bangladesh and Myanmar in Dhaka and stressed the need for resumption of voluntary repatriation of the refugees from Bangladesh.

On the occasion of the 40th anniversary of Bangladesh's admission to the United Nations, the envoy expressed the government's deep appreciation to the UNHCR for their support to refugees from Bangladesh during the liberation war in 1971.

UN High Commissioner for Refugees António Guterres thanked the ambassador for the statement and assured that UNHCR remains at the disposal of the Bangladesh government.

He greatly appreciated Dhaka's decision to formulate the National Strategy Paper on Myanmar refugees and

Fake currency racket busted in capital

The Detective Branch of police has arrested eight men with fake notes worth around Tk 50 lakh in the capital's Bashabo.

Of the arrested, Shah Alam and Md Shohag were held on Wednesday in a motorbike garage with 194 fake notes of Tk 1,000 denomination and Abul Khair, Azizul Haque, Sohel Rana, Shahidul Islam, Yasin Arif and Shohag Masud were also arrested the same day in a flat while they were counterfeiting notes, said DB officials at a press briefing at the media centre of Dhaka Metropolitan Police yesterday.

Police also seized fake currency making papers, 12 frames, cotton used in notes, five laptops and three printers.

During primary interrogation, Khair, confessed that he has been running the business for last seven years.

ICT helps boost rice yield in Philippines

The Cyber Village Project has created revolution by increasing rice output using information and communications technology (ICT)-based web tools and technologies in the Philippines.

The information was disclosed at the "Farmers' technology forum for farmer-cooperators" organised by the International Rice Research Institute (IRRI) at its headquarters in the Philippines yesterday.

Forty member farmers of different ICT-based e-Centres from several municipalities in different provinces all over the Philippines, two renowned Indian farmers, and a farmer and a journalist from Bangladesh participated.

The project Coordinator and Head of IRRI's Partnerships Office Jojo Lapitan and Senior Manager at IRRI Training Centre Engineer Engene Castro also spoke.

National Scientist of the Philippines and IRRI Consultant Dr Gelia Castillo delivered keynote message citing the project as stimulus for acquiring connectivity in reaching ICT-based agricultural technologies to farmers.

Member of a Cyber Village e-Centre Genevieve Madelo, Ester Solamo, Fredric Panigar and William Gitakay narrated their successes and shared experiences.

They elaborated as how they have increased rice production using ICT-based technologies and information for better crop management to change their socio-economic status and improve livelihoods and living standard.

The Cyber Village Project beneficiary farmers discussed benefits of using ICT-based technologies, Nutrient Manager for Rice (NMR), Rice Crop manger (RCM), Pilipino Rice Knowledge Bank (PRNB) and other facilities.

They dwelt on how they have been changing rice farming practices, selecting certified high quality seed, spraying pesticides, fungicides and insecticides, controlling bacterial diseases, applying optimum fertilisers and irrigation management having easy access to ICT-based information.
