Bus passengers suffer on Dhaka-Tangail highway

People in large numbers thronged the railway station, bus and launch terminals in the capital yesterday in a frenzy to reach home and celebrate Eid and puja holidays with their families outside Dhaka.

All trains and launches leaving Dhaka were packed like sardines but buses were less crowded. Even the roofs of trains and launches were crowded.

However, those who opted for road transport had to face hurdles on the way as the Dhaka-Tangail highway saw congestion throughout yesterday and vehicles moved slowly on the Dhaka-Mymensingh and Dhaka-Chittagong highways.

Cattle-carrying trucks heading for Dhaka from northern districts aggravated the situation on the 65km highway stretch between Chandra of Gazipur and Bangabandhu Bridge, reported our Tangail correspondent. Vehicles heading for 26 districts -- 16 northern, five

south-western and five of greater Mymensingh districts -use the highway.

"I started from Mohakhali Bus Terminal at 7:00am and reached Tangail at 2:00pm due to traffic jams, especially at Chandra intersection," said bus driver Shyamol Saha. Usually, it's a two-hour trip.

"We face untold sufferings going home every Eid due to the traffic jam. Things remained unchanged this year too," SEE PAGE 2 COL 5

SIM buyers to face stricter verification

In a bid to check extortion by issuing threats over the phone, the government will verify the national identity cards of new mobile phone subscribers before activating their SIM cards.

Industries Minister Amir Hossain Amu told this to journalists yesterday after a meeting of the cabinet committee on law and order at the home ministry.

Once the NID is verified by the authorities concerned, Bangladesh Telecommunication Regulatory Commission will give clearance to cell phone operators for

Doping gangs in city on the prowl

More than 200 fell victim in one month

College student Sufian Kazi was returning to the capital from Narayanganj by a bus on Tuesday.

When the bus reached the Shanir Akhra area, a hawker got in and offered sweet pickles for free to some 10 passengers to taste those before buying. As Sufian, aged about 20 years, tasted the

pickles, he felt sick. Alighting from the bus at Jatrabari, he phoned his elder brother to inform him about his sickness.

He then hired a CNG-run three-wheeler to his brother's office at Motijheel. Minutes after reaching there, he fell unconscious.

Sufian's brother took him to Dhaka Medical College Hospital (DMCH) where

he was nursed back to health 12 hours later.

"As I felt sick, I realised that what I ate was not safe," the victim told this correspondent at the hospital. Physicians said the patient became

unconscious from the poison in pickles. They suspected the hawker might have been a member of a drugging gang.

Sufian was lucky enough not to have lost his wallet and mobile phone to the gang. But many others even lost their Eid bonus along with other valuables to these gangs. Several such gangs have been active in the

capital in recent weeks, said officials of Dhaka Metropolitan Police.

Passengers on buses, trains and launches as well as cattle traders are the targets of the thugs. SEE PAGE 2 COL 5

PROTESTS FOR DEMOCRACY I won't quit

Hong Kong leader rejects calls to stand down as protesters remain defiant

Hong Kong's embattled leader defiantly rejected demands to resign and sent his deputy to talk to pro-democracy demonstrators, as huge crowds rallied outside his government's besieged headquarters early today for a fifth consecutive night.

Huge throngs who have shut down central areas of the city with mass sit-ins all week had set a midnight deadline for Chief Executive Leung Chun-ying to step down and for Beijing guarantee the former British colony full democracy.

But moments before the deadline was set to expire, Leung appeared before reporters and flatly rejected those demands.

"I will not resign because I have to continue with the work for elections," he said, referring to upcoming polls in SEE PAGE 2 COL 2
