Hasina offers Japan help for post-quake rescue work

Bangladesh is ready to assist in rescue operations in Japan that has been continuing from September 27 following a sudden volcanic eruption, said Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina.

In a condolence message to Japanese Prime Minister Shinzo Abe, Hasina also expressed grief at the loss of over 50 lives, and concern for the persons who went missing, said a foreign ministry press release on Tuesday.

BCL leader stabbed in Rajshahi

A Bangladesh Chhatra League leader of Khulna Medical College was stabbed by local thugs at Rajshahi city's Binodpur Tuesday afternoon.

Sakiul Islam, the unit's publicity secretary, went there to celebrate Eid as his father Nurul Islam is a Rajshahi University teacher. The incident occurred after Sakiul had a scuffle with some youths at a shop over buying a soft drink on Eid day, said Motihar police. With injuries in his hand and leg, Sakiul was admitted to Rajshahi Medical College Hospital.

Man beaten to death in Gazipur

A man was beaten to death and his son injured allegedly by the latter's friends over a game of carrom at Dakkhin Khaikur in Gazipur city Tuesday night.

The deceased was Motaleb Miah, 42, while the injured is Humayun Kabir, 19.

Motaleb was attacked by Sajib and Limon after he had asked them why they beat his son during the game, said police.

when the time was right.

"The time looms close. A movement can't be forged by fixing a timeframe. We're in the movement and will be in it. I'll call for a movement when the time is right. The country's people will join us then. This government must go," she said.

Noting that Khaleda had earlier announced to launch a movement after Eid, he said, "As she failed to wage the movement, she is now talking like this only to pacify her activists."

JCD man stabbed by rivals in Sylhet

A Jatiyatabadi Chhatra Dal activist of Sylhet city unit was stabbed allegedly by rivals at the city's Fazilchist yesterday afternoon.

Ujjal Ahmed, a follower of ward no-8 unit's Convener Afsar Ahmed Khan, was admitted to Sylhet MAG Osmani Medical College Hospital.

Ujjal was asked to join the faction of another activist Nabil Ahmed of the unit some days ago, but he denied, JCD sources said.

Following the denial, his rivals attacked him when he was alone in the area around 4:30pm, they said.

Confirming the incident, Kotwali police Officer-in-charge Md Asaduzzaman said they were investigating the matter.

Despite repeated attempts, Nabil could not be contacted as his mobile was found switched-off.

14kg gold seized at Shahjalal airport

sector involvement in the sustainable development goals. Unctad's World Investment Forum fulfils an important gap in global economic governance in the absence of any other international platform to discuss these issues."

A unique gathering of over 2,000 private and public sector representatives from the developing and developed world, the forum will consider policy frameworks and conditions for investment at national and global levels to address sustainable development challenges.

There will be nearly 40 events, including private sector-led sessions, ministerial round tables and the World Leaders Investment Summits.

High-level participants include Kenyan President Uhuru Kenyatta, Jamaican Prime Minister Portia

Simpson-Miller, Prime Minister of Madagascar Roger Kolo, President of Seychelles James Michel, President of Switzerland Didier Burkhalter, interim Prime Minister of Tunisia Mehdi Jomaa and dozens of foreign affairs, investment and trade ministers from around the world.

The forum will be addressed by United Nations Secretary-General Ban Ki-moon and hosted by Dr Kituyi.

Findings from Unctad's World Investment Report 2014 indicated that the total investment need in developing countries to deliver on the sustainable development goals will be \$3.9 trillion per year. Current levels of investment leave an investment gap of some \$2.5 trillion.

Transnational corporations in developed countries alone have more than \$5 trillion lying "idle" on their balance sheets—money that could be invested in

building productive capacity, particularly in sustainable development sectors.

A number of deliverables for investing in sustainable development will be announced at the event.

As the forum is taking place in Geneva for the first time, attendance will also include a large number of leaders from the Swiss private sector.

The topicality of the theme of the forum for the international investment and development communities is reflected in the great number of organisations that have partnered with Unctad for the event such as the Food and Agriculture Organization of the United Nations, the International Labour Organization, Joint United Nations Programme on HIV/AIDS, the United Nations Environment Programme, the World Trade Organization and the World Bank.

murder case with Tongi Police Station on May 8 against 17 people, identifying as the mastermind BNP's youth wing Jatiyatabadi Jubo Dal leader Nurul Islam Sarker, who is a brother of Tongi BNP leader Hasan Sarker. On April 16, 2005, Speedy Trial Tribunal-1 handed down death sentences to 22 people, including Sarker, and life term to six others.

As many as 17 of those sentenced to death belong to the BNP, three to AL and two to Jatiya Party.

Four of those sentenced to death and five of those handed down life terms are still on the run while one of the lifers died in jail in June this year.

Anwar Hossain, joint secretary at the Power Division.

He said both sides will discuss the findings of the survey and decide the next course of action based on it to build the connectivity to facilitate Bangladesh's import of 100MW power from the Palatana plant in Tripura.

According to the sources, power import from the Palatana Power Plant will take more than a year as it needs new high voltage transmission lines.

India has set up the 726.6MW gas-fired power plant project with its state-owned ONGC Tripura Power Company (OTPC) limited. Bangladesh facilitated its development by allowing transportation of heavy equipment through its territory without imposing any tax.

Power Division officials said

Bangladesh's import of 100MW power from Palatana will require installation of about 32 to 35km long transmission lines with a 132kV transmission capacity. Of the line, 12km will be in Bangladesh side and the remaining in India.

At present, Bangladesh has a power substation at the border point under Comilla-North power supply system. But the existing substation needs to be upgraded to take Palatana's power from the Indian grid system.

Officials said a lot of technical work needs to be done to synchronise Indian power system with Bangladesh's grid.

They said India's 100MW of electricity may not be connected with the main power system in Comilla as the area is considered to be very sensitive from security point of view as one of the largest cantonment of Bangladesh is located there.

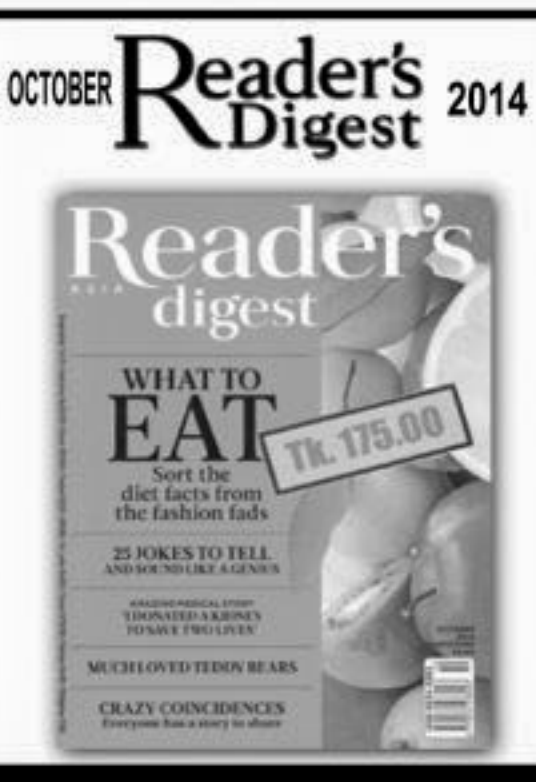
