DU lowers qualification marks for admission in English dept, finds hardly anyone eligible

Poor performance of applicants aspiring to enrol in Dhaka University's English department has compelled the authorities to relax the eligibility criteria to fill the 150 seats of the department.

At a meeting yesterday, the DU General Admission Committee lowered the pass mark to 8 from 15 in elective English section and 18 from 20 in general English section to allow applicants from kha unit to get admitted.

But despite that, the authorities found only 15 candidates qualified to enrol in the department from kha unit, apart from the two students who already got through the admission test.

Making an exception to the usual practice of enrolling 25 candidates from gha unit,

the committee then decided to get more students from the unit to fill the vacant seats for this academic session.

With all these efforts, the authorities could find 134 candidates -- 17 from kha and 117 from gha unit -- who are eligible to get admitted to the department.

However, it's not certain that all 134 applicants will enrol in the department, as the admission process is still on, said DU sources.

In the admission test under kha unit last month, only two of 1,364 applicants qualified for enrolling in English department by obtaining at least 15 marks out of 30 in elective English and 20 out of 30 in general English.

"The meeting discussed the reasons behind the applicants' poor performance in English. Students don't achieve the desired

12 denied visa

PMO officials say embassy not at fault

The Italian embassy in Dhaka has denied visas to a nine-member media team and three businessmen, all scheduled to fly with Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina to Milan today.

The PM is due to attend the Asia-Europe Meeting (ASEM) summit on October 16-17.

For the four-day trip, 125 persons, including diplomatic and official passport holders and 74 businessmen, were selected as Hasina's entourage. All but the 12 have been granted visas.

The Italian embassy refused to accept visa applications of the media persons -- four of whom are attached to the PMO -- as they failed to submit applications within 10 working days before departure, diplomatic sources say.

PM and Awami League President Hasina's Information Adviser Iqbal Sobhan Chowdhury and four other leading journalists were also in the media team.

The nine went to the embassy to submit their applications on October 8. They should have done it by October 2, the sources added. It could not be known why the three businessmen were denied visas.

This is quite unusual, said an influential PMO staff. The media team failed to get visas due to negligence of a high official of the PM's press wing, he alleged.

The prime minister is leaving at 10:00am today to attend the 10th ASEM summit in Milan at the invitation of European Council President Herman Van Rompuy, Italian Prime Minister Matteo Renzi and European Commission President José Manuel Barroso.
