

Shaheed Minar stigmatised

Shafiq Rehman tells Piash Karim's memorial adding it turned into an Awami Minar

Senior journalist Shafiq Rehman yesterday termed Central Shaheed Minar an unholly, dirty, putrid and stigmatised place, and urged all to refrain from going there and using the premises as it has been turned into an "Awami Minar".

The columnist and editor of weekly Mouchake Dhil was addressing a memorial for Prof Piash Karim of Brac University who passed away on October 13, organised by Bangladesh Sammilita Peshajibi Parishad, a platform of pro-BNP-Jamaat professionals, in the capital's Jatiya Press Club.

BNP acting secretary general Mirza Fakhrul Islam Alamgir was the chief guest.

"I think time has come to ban this scandalous and unholly Shaheed Minar. No gentle or innocent person should turn up at this place, not before or after anyone's demise," Rehman said.

He also called upon people to become active to free from stigma the national monument built in memory of those who sacrificed their lives during the Language Movement in 1952.

Fakhrul accused the government of trying to divide the nation and urged people to wage strong resistance against "a deep-rooted conspiracy" against the country.

Professional rivalry turns into violence

50 hurt, 70 vehicles vandalised; bus workers go on divisionwide indefinite strike; both sides express grievances against police, BRTA

At least 50 transport workers were injured in a clash in Sylhet city's Kadamtoli area after some CNG-run auto-rickshaw drivers had vandalised around 50 vehicles including buses, minibuses, and microbuses there yesterday, said police and witnesses.

A group of bus workers also damaged about 20 CNG-run auto-rickshaws in the area, they said.

The auto-rickshaw drivers went on the rampage around 1:00pm while they were

heading towards Registry Maidan in the city with processions to join a rally under the banner of Sylhet Zila Auto-rickshaw Sramik Union there.

Police fired 29 rubber bullets to bring the situation under control.

Around nine people were held on the spot, said Dakhin Surma police Officer-in-charge Md Mursalin.

ZUBAIR'S DEATH IN UTTARA Abuubaida still maintains innocence

Sent to jail after nine days of remand; DB awaits autopsy, microbiology reports

Sent to jail yesterday after being questioned on remand for nine days in three phases, Abuubaida Kadir still sticks to his previous statement that he had not drowned Zubair Ahmed.

The Detective Branch (DB) of police, investigating the murder case Zubair's mother filed with Uttara East Police Station accusing the presumed Algerian national and a teenager named Ismail Hossain, is now awaiting the post-mortem and microbiology test reports.

"Once we have the reports, it will be helpful for the next move into the investigation," DB (north) Senior Assistant Commissioner SM Nazmul

Muggers kill microbus driver, snatch vehicle in Narsingdi

Muggers strangled a microbus driver and snatched the vehicle rented from Gazipur city's Malekerbari area early yesterday.

The body of Parvez, 18, son of Abdur Razzak of the area, was found by the road in Ghorashal area in Narsingdi, said Police.

A group of six men rented the microbus to go to Narsingdi Friday evening and the gang tied up the driver and his helper with ropes when the vehicle reached Ghorashal, said Joydevpur police Officer-in-charge Mahfuzur Rahman.

Before snatching the vehicle, the gang left helper Suruz beside the road in the area and the driver near the spot after strangling him, he said.

FACTIONAL CLASH

Sylhet police sue JCD leaders

Sylhet police filed a case on Friday accusing 70 Jatiyatobadi Chhatra Dal (JCD) men, including the presidents and general secretaries of the city and district units who are among the 30 named, centring a factional clash when 10 activists were injured and several motorcycles torched in the city that day.

Till yesterday, five persons were arrested over the charges of assaulting police, blasting crackers and obstructing traffic in the case filed by Sub-inspector Kamal Hossain, stated law enforcers of Kotwali Model Police Station.

JCD sources said disgruntled activists left out from the new city and district units, declared on September 18, attacked a procession of some 100 activists led by the new leaders under the banner Ilias Mukti Sangram Parishad, leading to clashes and chase and counter chase in Zindabazar and Shaheed Minar areas.

Police charged baton and fired tear gas shells to disperse the factions.
