State failed to accord due respect to him Matin, popularly known as "Bhasha"

Language movement hero Abdul Matin, who had also fought in the 1971 Liberation War, was not accorded due respect by the state, speakers told a national commemorative meeting on him yesterday.

Speaking at the meeting Abdul Matin Swaran Jatiya Committee organised in the capital's Central Shaheed Minar premises, they also called upon leaders and activists of left-leaning political parties to follow the ethics and ideals maintained by Matin throughout his life as many deviate from the spirit of communism.

(language) Matin, died of old age complexities at Bangabandhu Sheikh Mujib Medical University on October 8.

He was among the first few students to protest the announcement of Mohammad Ali Jinnah, the then governor general of Pakistan, during a special convocation at Dhaka University on March 24, 1948 that Urdu, not Bangla, would be the state language.

This spark of protest ultimately turned into a nationwide movement, helping to establish Bangla as a state language.

Medical admission tests held

69,477 candidates take the exams against 10,299 seats countrywide

The admission tests for medical and dental colleges for the 2014-15 academic session were held at 23 centres simultaneously across the country yesterday.

A total of 69,477 candidates sat for the one-hour long tests against 10,299 seats, said ABM Abdul Hannan, director of Medical Education and Health Manpower Development at the Directorate General of Health

Services. "The tests were held in a fair and peaceful manner. No untoward incident took place during the examination," he told The Daily Star.

This year, 29 government medical colleges are offering 3,162 seats while 56 private ones will accommodate 5,325

students. Nine public dental colleges will accept 532 students and another 23 private dental colleges are offering 1,280

seats. All electronic devices including cellphones, calculators, and even wrist watches, were banned in the centres to pre-

Visiting an examination centre at Dhaka University, Health Minister Mohammad Nasim told reporters that the examinations were being held in a fair and well-organised environment at all the centres thanks to the precautionary measures.

He said they ordered a closure of the medical admission coaching centres as a syndicate deceive the candidates with the help of such centres. "Measures will be taken to close the coaching centres permanently."

Earlier on Tuesday, the health ministry had asked the home ministry to take steps to close all such coaching centres until the admission tests were over.

The steps were taken to stop frauds and unscrupulous groups from duping admission seekers and their guardians with offers of suggestions and assurance of admission.
